PRICE HIKE
Govt to carry
out study to
find reasons

The government would assign research organisations for conducting studies to look into the causes behind soaring prices of essentials and possible steps to rein them in.

"The policies to keep the prices within commoners' capacity will be decided on the findings of the studies," Finance Adviser Mirza Azizul Islam told a meeting with the members of the Economic Reporters' Forum (ERF) on the coming budget at the Secretariat.

It was assumed that extortion was one of the main reasons for spiralling prices, but since there is no such situation at present, the government wants to know the reason as to why the prices of essentials are still on the rise, he said.

The finance adviser, however,

Govt won't pursue hoarding cases

Decides to go soft on accused businessmen to rein back spiraling prices of essentials

The caretaker government has decided not to pursue the cases against hoarders in a desperate attempt to rein back the spiralling prices of essentials.

It will now give 'final report' on all the cases filed against businessmen accused of hoarding huge quantities of rotten wheat and rice, sources said. Final report terminates a case.

Law Adviser Mainul Hosein however said yesterday the government will provide the accused businessmen all facilities within the legal framework for their bail in

the cases against them.

Talking to newsmen after a meeting on law and order chaired by him, Manul said, "There is no denying the fact that the government is going through a crisis -- prices of essentials has increased. It is a matter of concern."

The adviser also said the price hike is a sabotage by certain quarters intended to trouble the government.

He mentioned that the government is trying in many ways to assist those businessmen who will import goods. Instructions will be given to the commerce ministry to ensure required facilities for them.

CA formally invited to 14th Saarc Summit

Chief Adviser (CA) Fakhruddin Ahmed yesterday received a letter of invitation from Indian Prime Minister Manmohan Singh to join the 14th Saarc Summit to be held in New Delhi early next month.

Indian High Commissioner to Bangladesh Pinak Ranjan Chakravarty called on the chief adviser at his office and handed over the letter.

The CA informed the envoy about his decision to join the summit and said he was looking forward to meeting Manmohan Singh and other Saarc leaders there.

Besides, the CA said he will inaugurate the Saarc car rally at Cox's Bazar on Thursday and is expected to join other leaders of the forum on April 3 in New Delhi where the rally will conclude.

Referring to the recently held director general-level BDR-BSF meeting in New Delhi, the CA said both countries should move

Tarique Rahman sent to jail

Denied division in jail; investigators not satisfied with disclosures on stashed money in his foreign bank accounts

Senior Joint Secretary General of BNP Tarique Rahman will have to sleep on cold hard concrete in Dhaka Central Jail just like other general inmates as he was denied division facilities after a Dhaka court had sent him there last night.

"We did not provide division facilities to Tarique as he does not qualify under any category to get the facilities," Deputy Inspector General (Prisons) Major Shamsul Haider Siddique told The Daily Star last night.

Tarique was kept in a cell with other general inmates until mid-night, jail sources said.

Jail doctors were supposed to take a look at him later in the night to treat his headache and pain in the waist.

If the doctors would suggest admitting him to the jail hospital he would be admitted there, the DIG said.

According to the jail code, government officials who fall under

Ex-MP Lobi shown held in land grabbing case

Detained former BNP lawmaker Ali Asgar Lobi was shown arrested yesterday in the case filed with Gulshan Police Station on Sunday for illegally taking possession of a land in August 2003.

Metropolitan Magistrate Jagannath Das Khokan passed the order following a petition from an investigation officer (IO) to show him arrested in the case.

Zakaria Khan Julu of Gulshan filed the case against Lobi, his wife Khoshnud Asgar Lobi and their two accomplices.

Biman shuts Dubai airport for 8 hours

14 hurt as wheel failure occurs during takeoff

A Dhaka-bound Bangladesh Biman airliner suffered a wheel failure during takeoff, forcing Dubai International Airport, the busiest in the Middle East, to suspend its operations for about eight hours yesterday.

Biman officials said primary information suggests that mechanical glitches were responsible for the takeoff mishap that occurred at about 8:30am (Bangladesh time).

"The aeroplane was taxying down the runway but just before lifting off, the pilot found the nose wheel malfunctioning," a Biman official told The Daily Star last night.

The airport resumed its normal flight operations at 4:30pm (Bangladesh time).

A Biman Bangladesh official told The Daily Star that they were working to arrange for an alternative flight to bring the stranded passengers back home last night.

The expensive Airbus of the national flag carrier was bought in 1996.

Two committees have been formed to investigate the cause of the accident and to assess losses. A team led by Chief of Flight Safety Captain Ismail was already off to Dubai last night.

Biman officials said primary information suggests that mechanical glitches were responsible for the takeoff mishap that occurred at about 8:30am (Bangladesh time).

"The aeroplane was taxying down the runway but just before lifting off, the pilot found the nose wheel malfunctioning," a Biman official told The Daily Star last night.

The passengers and crew were quickly evacuated and those with minor injuries were taken to a hospital, the officials said.

With 218 passengers aboard, the flight was to reach Dhaka at 12:45pm.

WC gets rolling with WI-Pak opener today

After a colourful but low-key ceremony officially opened the ninth ICC Cricket World Cup, the tournament proper gets underway with hosts West Indies and Pakistan, two of the most inconsistent sides in international cricket, facing in the first match at the Sabina Park today.

Bangladesh Television will telecast the match live from 8:30pm Bangladesh time.

Over 2,000 singers, dancers and performers, including several of

ACC set to sue 9 political bigwigs

The Anti-Corruption Commission is all set to file cases against nine more top corruption suspects including Awami League (AL) leader Mohammad Nasim and AL leader Salman F Rahman. It is yet to complete the files to be used for filing cases against them.

These suspects, who have already been arrested, also include BNP leaders former state minister for power Iqbal Hasan Mahmud, Ali Asgar Lobi, Abdul Wadud Bhuiyan, AL leaders AHM Mostafa Kamal alias Lotus Kamal and Pankaj Debanath and T&T CBA leader Firoze Mia, according to a highly placed source.

"We are ready with files of seven-eight persons. Cases will be filed against them as soon as we approve those. This can happen within a couple of days," ACC Commissioner Abul Hassan Manzoor Mannan told newsmen

Finds Japanese firm


