

# Party in power made once VDP man a millionaire

Wadud's aide Abdus Salam on the run in Khagrachhari

The party in power came as a magic lamp for once VDP (Village Defense Party) member and Jubo Dal leader Mohammad Abdus Salam. He became a millionaire by virtue of being a closed aide to the then BNP lawmaker from Khagrachhari Abdul Wadud Bhuiyan.

Salam is on the run after Wadud Bhuiyan's arrest last month. Sources in security forces said Salam is on their arrest list and they raided his house several times but failed to nab him.

Abdus Salam owns at least three luxuriously houses worth about Tk 4 crore at Molla Para (besides hospital gate), Shanti Nagar and Bangalkathi in Sadar upazila, over 180-acre orchards at Vuyachhari, Alutila, Panchnari in the district and some seven plots for shops in markets in Khagrachhari town, according to sources in police and intelligence. Salam was president of Khagrachhari district Jubo Dal.

The sources said Salam's Molla Para house encroaches government land, the Shabdmania Para house was built by grabbing his paternal uncles land and the Santinagar house partly occupies land of a local journalist.

Tozammel Hossen Zoorder,

resident medical officer of Khagrachhari Adhunik Sadar Hospital, said yesterday he demanded a judicial inquiry to recover the government land encroached by Salam's Molla Para house.

The journalist whose land was grabbed in Santinagar told this correspondent that he was preparing to file a case against the land grabber. He also demanded probe into Salam's assets.

An engineer of LGED seeking anonymity said, "He (Salam) spent more than Tk 4 crore for building the three houses, where imported materials were also used".

The sources said the Jubo Dal leader, using party cadre, occupied at least seven plots for shops in different markets, now valued at around Tk one crore.

Salam earned money illegally by extracting percentages from development works under the district council, Chittagong Hill Tracts

Development Board, LGED and Roads & Highways department. He was the main mediator for tender negotiations, the sources said.

Allegations also have it that he realised handsome amounts of money in the name of giving jobs in schools and government departments.

Salam's illegal wealth is now a part of the town with many political leaders demanding probe into his alleged corruption.

Talking to this correspondent, district Awami League Secretary Zahedul Alam claimed that Salam amassed property worth at least Tk 7 crore in last five years and demanded probe into his assets.

LDP (Liberal Democratic Party) leader Rafiqul Islam and Jatiya Party central leader Sahaz Uddin also demanded probe on how Salam earned the resources.

## 5 JCD, BNP leaders arrested in Sylhet

Rab men arrested seven persons including Sylhet city JCD chief Ziaul Gani Arefin Zillur and general secretary of Roads & Highways Contractors Association and BNP leader Milad Ahmed.

The law enforcers also recovered some liquor and others things from their possession while picking up the group from Roads & Highways building in the city's Chouhatta area in the early hours of yesterday.

Others arrested during the raid include vice-president of Sylhet JCD (Jatiyatatabadi Chhatra Dal) Omar Ashraf Imon, Hisham Ahmed Chowdhury, BNP leader Mollik Ahmed Chowdhury alias Lollik repeat Lollik, contractor Mozammel Hossain Nantu and Nazat Kabir.

They were caught on charge of forcibly entering the R&H office, gambling and taking liquor there. There had been allegations of grabbing contracts in the name of BNP and JCD from R&H office against a group of BNP men including Milad Ahmed during the past 4-party alliance rule.

In another raid, the law enforcers picked up JCD activist Iftekhar Ahmed Dinar from in front of his house sat Shahjalal Uposahar in the early hours yesterday.

Dinar, former assistant general secretary of district JCD, was allegedly involved in mugging, extortion and other crimes in the city.

After arrest, police said he was wanted in a number of cases including murder.

He was expelled from JCD two years ago but the suspension was withdrawn in January last year.

## 10 kg urea for each farmer as hundreds queue

104 tonnes supplied against 659 this month in Kishoreganj Sadar

A sack of 50 kg Urea is being distributed among five farmers at Binnati Bazar of Kishoreganj Sadar. This correspondent saw this at the market at noon yesterday.

Several hundreds of farmers were standing in long queues on both sides of the fertiliser dealer's shop at the market. A group of five farmers got a slip given by local Union Parishad members. On their behalf, one farmer got chance to stand in the line keeping four others waiting to share a sack of Urea.

Sub Assistant Agriculture Officer of Kamaliarchar block in Kishoreganj Sadar, Abu Bakkar Siddique, said, each farmer was given 10 kilograms of urea due to its short supply. Despite this arrangement, many farmers will have to return home disappointed as they are not on the day's list, he said.

Asked would this quantity be enough for farmers, Abu Bakkar said, "This small quantity of urea will virtually be of no use for their Iri-Boro crops because the fertiliser has to be applied in the field once at a time". This is only to keep farmers' agitation under control, he said.

Farmer Md. Ali of Kuttagore village in Binnati union in Sadar upazila said, he had one acre of Iri and one acre of maize field but he got only 10 kg urea against a demand for at least 100 kg.

Another farmer, Abu Taher Sabuj of Charmaria village in Maria union in the upazila said, he has about 10

acres under Iri-Boro and maize cultivation and needs 500 kg of urea. But he also got 10 kilogram.

Nuruzzaman, 60, of Kuttagore village in Binnati union said the local Union Parishad member enlisted his name but reaching Binnati Bazar, he found that his name was dropped from the list. He said, the UP member

enlisted names of people who are close to him.

When contacted Upazila Agriculture Officer Mohsin Uddin Khan said, 104 tonnes of urea were received by dealers in Kishoreganj Sadar upazila against a demand for 659 metric tons for the current month.

## Bhasani university VC resigns

Teachers, students hold rally for action against his accomplices

Vice-chancellor of Maolana Bhasani University of Science and Technology (MBUST) at Santosh Dr Mohammad Khalilur Rahman has resigned from his post.

The VC submitted his resignation letter to secretary of education ministry on Monday, university sources said.

Hearing the news of VC's resignation, teachers and students of the

university brought out victory processions on the campus and distributed sweets yesterday and the night before, campus sources said.

Teachers and students also held a rally in front of the administrative building yesterday demanding steps against accomplices of the VC in his alleged irregularities and corruption.

All teachers and students had been agitating since February 22 for the VC's resignation for his alleged irregularities and corrupt

tion. The VC was in Dhaka since then, when the students held demonstrations on the campus.

To press the demand, 16 out of total 28 teachers including the proctor, assistant proctor, provosts, assistant provosts and chairmen of departments resigned from their administrative posts on March 8 and desisted from all academic activities.
