

Eid-e-Miladunnabi on April 1

The government has chalked out elaborate programmes to observe holy Eid-e-Miladunnabi on April 1.

The programmes were finalised at a meeting of the Ministry of Religious Affairs with Religious Adviser Maj Gen (retd) ASM Matiur Rahman in the chair yesterday.

The programmes included hoisting of national flag atop government, non-government buildings, publishing supplements in the newspapers, displaying banners inscribed with Kalima Taiyebe at important government buildings, establishments and roads, illumination of government and military establishments, arranging miliad mahfil and prayers at the Secretariat and Bangabhaban mosques.

Besides, the Ministry of Women and Children Affairs would arrange cultural programmes in cultural and educational institutions.

Islamic Foundation will arrange meetings, seminars and competitions under its two-week programme, and provide improved diets to hospitals, prisons, orphanages and child homes.

Religious Affairs Secretary Mohammad Ataur Rahman, DG of Bangladesh Betar Mahbubul Alam and Joint Secretary of Religious Affairs Ministry Chowdhury M Ziaul Haq were present at the meeting.

ACC should appoint experienced officials

Says Shujan

Shushashone Janney Nagorik (Shujan) wants the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) to appoint officials with experiences of dealing with financial corruption in different sectors.

"We are not happy about the ACC officials who have been deputed from the Ministry of Establishment," Shujan President Prof Muzaffer Ahmad told reporters after a meeting with ACC Chairman Hasan Mashhud Chowdhury yesterday.

Honest police officials should be appointed as investigation officers at the ACC, he said.

It is not enough to only prepare the lists of corruptionists, Prof Muzaffer said, adding that the culprits should also be punished. "The ACC should also be careful so that innocent

people are not harassed."

"We want to cooperate in the war against corruption across the country," he said.

Shujan leaders M Hafizuddin Khan, ASM Shahjahan, Badiul Alam Majumder and Sharmin Murshid were present at the meeting.

Meanwhile, Asian Development Bank (ADB) Deputy Director General for South Asia Department Sultan Hafeez Rahman also had a meeting with the ACC chairman.

The ADB official, who arrived in Bangladesh yesterday on a weeklong visit, told reporters after the meeting that they had talks on reforms of governance.

He also said that they are very much engaged in governance reforms in Bangladesh.

ADB Country Director Hua Du was also present at the meeting.

'Form S Asian Peace Commission'

Speakers at a press conference yesterday urged the heads of the governments of South Asian Association for Regional Cooperation (Saarc) countries to form a 'South Asia Peace Commission'.

Bangladesh Development Partnership Centre (BDPC) and South Asia Alliance for Poverty Eradication (BDPC) jointly organised the press conference at the National Press Club in the city ahead of the 14th Saarc summit scheduled to be held in New Delhi from April 3 to 4.

While reading out a written statement, BDPC Executive Director Sharif A Kafi said a 'South Asia Peace Commission' should be founded in the interest of peace and security in South Asian countries in eradicating poverty, and ending arms conflict and smuggling of illegal weapons.

Sharif also asked for immediate steps to stop the competition and expansion of nuclear weapons in South Asia and to make it a nuclear war-free region.

The speakers also suggested that the South Asian countries should sign UN

Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT) and Comprehensive Test Ban Treaty (CTBT).

Speaking on the occasion, Nari Pragoti Sangha Executive Director Rokeya Kabir said if the money spent in arms industry is utilised in education, health, technology and economy, progress will take place gradually accelerating peace process.

SAAPE Communication Officer Sayeda Monira, Bangladesh Unnayan Parishad Executive Director Jadav Chandra Saha and SAAPE Project Director Nadira Mallik were also present at the press conference.
