



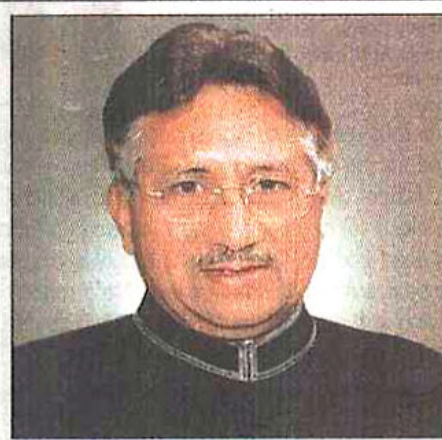

## MESSAGE

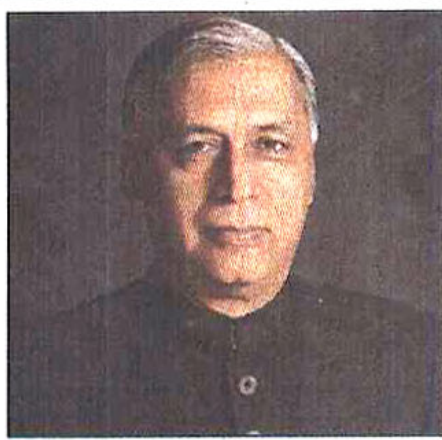

## MESSAGE

On 23rd March the people of Pakistan celebrate their National Day with great fervour and pride. On this day in 1940 the historic Lahore Resolution was adopted which spelt out the demand of the Muslims of the Sub-continent for a separate and independent homeland. It served as the starting point for the freedom movement which successfully culminated in the independence of Pakistan on 14th August 1947.

Since then, the South Asian region has witnessed significant developments. Today, our nations are striving to achieve economic progress and prosperity in a world transformed by the information technology revolution and globalization. Together they have created new opportunities and challenges for us.

On 23rd March the people of Pakistan rejoice their freedom. At the same time, it is an occasion for reflection on where we are today and where we want to be in the future. Like all nations, we seek socio-economic development at home and friendly and cooperative relations with other countries.

As part of this endeavour, Bangladesh-Pakistan relations are now on a new trajectory based on the shared aspirations of our people of peace and stability in the region and economic progress and well-being at home. Our special relationship continues to expand and deepen encompassing a wide range of areas of mutually beneficial and cooperative inter-action.

People-to-people contacts continue to grow. In addition to the regular travelers and visitors, last year we saw the exchange of delegations comprising academics, intellectuals, think-tanks and media representatives. Cultural interaction has increased. A number of Bangladeshi artists have held highly successful painting exhibitions in various cities of Pakistan. At the same time, Pakistani artists and musicians have held exhibitions and concerts in Bangladesh.

Cooperation in the fields of education and health has further grown. For academic year 2006-7, 18 Bangladeshi students successfully secured scholarships in various universities in Pakistan. 12 scholarships are in the field of medicine and remaining 6 in engineering. Three computer lab centers have been established in schools in different parts of Bangladesh. Two fully equipped ambulances were made available to the Chittagong District Health Authority and one each to Dhaka and Bogra. In addition, equipment was provided to several charitable hospitals in the country.

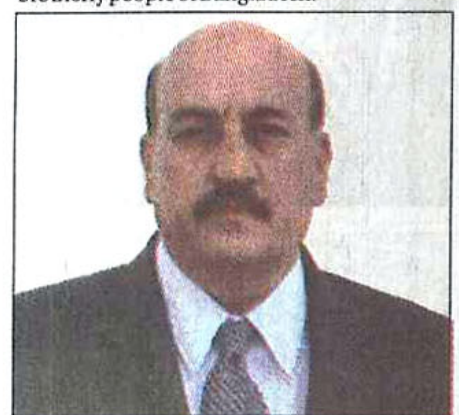
Our economic relations have entered a new phase. Bilateral trade has shown a 20 per cent

growth from US\$267 million in 2004-5 to approximately US\$340 million in 2005-6. Seventy per cent of Pakistan's exports to Bangladesh are in the form of raw materials for its export oriented garments industry creating benefits of value addition for the country. Foreign Direct Investment from Pakistan to Bangladesh now amounts to approximately US\$90 million. Economic complementarities exist between our two countries which need to be further harnessed through establishment of more forward and backward linkages, particularly in the textile and services sectors.

As members of SAFTA, bilateral economic and trade relations between Pakistan and Bangladesh would receive fresh impetus. Pakistan and Bangladesh are members of D-8 which provides an additional mechanism to further enhance the ongoing cooperation for the mutual benefit of both countries.

The private sector has also joined this growing trend. The two Chambers of Commerce and Industry met last year and established a Joint Business Council. Over 60 Pakistani business firms participated in the Dhaka International Trade Fair 2007. Pakistan also participated in the Chittagong International Trade Fair 2007 for the first time as Partner Country. Bangladeshi and Pakistani women entrepreneurs have also come together and successfully held trade fairs in Dhaka and Chittagong.

I invite the people of Bangladesh to jointly build upon these new trends in our relationship for the mutual benefit of our two countries. Through cooperative ventures, we can help each other chart a better future. I take this opportunity to convey my best wishes to the brotherly people of Bangladesh.

## 2007-visit Pakistan year

YEAR 2007 has been designated as 'Visit Pakistan Year' by the government to exploit true tourism potential of the country. A glance at the global tourism industry reveals that tourism tops the world trade in terms of export earnings, employment, infrastructure development, benefits to the environment as well as local cultures. Its importance can be gauged from the fact that during last year over 715 million arrivals and \$ 480 billion expenditure entailing tourism related activities were reported from different regions of the world. However, Pakistan has negligible share in the global tourism market, despite home to peculiar flora, fauna and precious cultural heritage dating back even to pre-historic age. The government is not oblivious to the importance as well as enormous

potential of the country's tourism. Designating 2007 as 'Visit Pakistan Year' is an extension of state policy to promote both domestic and foreign tourism. During the last few years, substantial inbound business travels due to extraordinary growth of economy, have given positive exposure to our tourist products and services.

Pakistan has numerous attractions for the tourists from all over the world. Pakistan cradles half a dozen ancient civilizations which include Indus valley civilization (2500 BC), Arian civilisation (1500 BC), Persian civilisation (600 BC), Greek civilisation (327 BC) Muslim civilisation (712 AD). Ancient civilization sites of Mehrgarh (Balochistan), Moenjodaro (Sindh), Harapa and Taxila (Punjab) provide invaluable opportunity of study particularly to the curious minds interested in ancient history. Likewise over 900km long coastline of the country's crystal clear water and

clean sandy beaches, lagoons, mangroves, swamps and soothing sunshine offer plenty of attractions to the marine life lovers. Manchar Lake in Sindh province with its highly pulsating expanse of about 200 sq miles is famous for its foliage of towering grasses, its meadows of floating lotus, and its inhabitants in their boat houses. Away from Arabian sea shores, in the interior of Sindh, 'Haliji Lake' is the largest fowl reserve of Asian continent serving as a temporary abode for the hundreds of thousands of migratory birds. For the bird watchers, the lake is next to paradise.

Majestic landscape of the Northern Pakistan is unique as it is adorned by three of the mightiest mountain systems -- the Hindukush, the Karakorum and the Himalayas. For the benefit of those interested in statistics, it is pointed that 40 out of 50 of the world's highest mountain peaks are in Pakistan. In Baltistan, a northern district of

the North West Frontier Province, over 45 peaks touch or surpass 20,000 feet mark. In Gilgit the capital city of Northern Pakistan, there are over twenty four peaks ranging in height between 18,000 and 26,000 feet. The number of glaciers in the laps of these lofty mountains in an area of 13,600 square kilometers is more than any other country outside the north and south pole. About 37 per cent of Karakorum mountain range of the Northern Pakistan is under glaciers against the Himalayas' 17 per cent and European Alps' 22 per cent. Some of the important glaciers of Northern Pakistan include Siachin (75 km), Hispar (53 km), Batura (58 km) and Baltoro (62 km). The awe inspiring lofty mountains, lush green valleys with hospitable and peace loving inhabitants, the northern part of Pakistan is an ideal place for tourists to plan vacations.

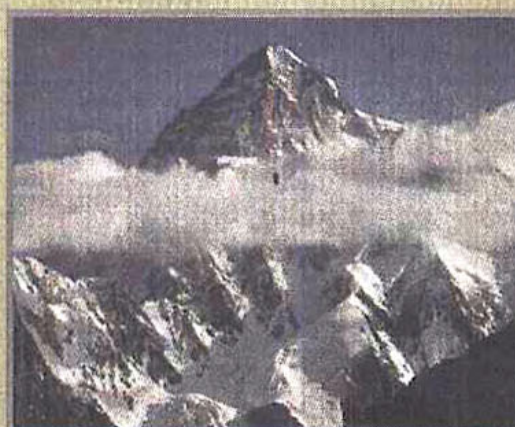
