### Artists depict hopes and dreams

Noted artists of the country joined an art workshop on the Liberation War Museum premises in the city yesterday to depict their hopes and dreams behind the War of Liberation, the struggle during the war and its impacts.

The museum organised the workshop to celebrate the Independence and National Day in a different way with the participation of more than 25 artists, including Hashem Khan, Rafiqun Nabi, Quayyum Chowdhury and Shishir Bhattacharya.

"We asked them to express their feelings about independence after 36 years of the Liberation War," said Trustee and Member Secretary of the museum Sarwar Ali.

The cultural activists, particularly the artists, played a significant role in mobilising opinion in favour of the Liberation War and also in the war, he added.

Expressing gratitude to the artists for joining the workshop, Sarwar said an exhibition of these paintings would be held in the museum later and the sale proceeds will be donated to the museum.

The museum organised the art workshop in association with Channel i and Gallery Chitrak. Channel i telecast the workshop live. Among others, singer Rezwana Chowdhury Bannya rendered songs at the programme.

Poet Asad Chowdhury moderated the programme while Syed Shamsul Haque spoke on the occasion.

### Trader arrested for fraud

Police arrested a trader on charge of fraudulence from the traditional commercial area of Khatunganj in the port city yesterday.

The arrestee, identified as Mintu Dey, is the proprietor of Nandita Traders of Laxmi Market.

Sources said Mintu, who has been running business at Khatunganj for around 20 years, purchased DO (delivery order) letters worth Tk 2.30 crore from some 23 pulse traders in recent months.

But the cheques Mintu issued

against the DO letters continued to be dishonoured by the banks from the first week of February causing the pulse traders concerned smell a rat in the dealings they had with Mintu in good faith, alleged Pulin Kumar Biswas, proprietor of RK Traders and one of the victims.

During this time, Mintu's business concern Nandita Traders also remained closed intensifying the traders' suspicion, sources said.

This prompted Pulin to lodge a case with the Kotwali Police Station following which police arrested Mintu at around 2:00pm.

Other scheduled trains also departed Chittagong with delay, sources said.
