420 juveniles still languish in jails

Speakers tell Munshiganj seminar

Around 420 accused juveniles are still languishing in various jails in the country.

Speakers said this at a daylong seminar organised by the Retired Police Welfare Society at the deputy commissioner's office in Munshiganj yesterday.

Former defence secretary Salauddin Ahmed PSP presented the keynote paper at the seminar while Deputy Commissioner Md Monir Uddin was present as the chief guest.

The speakers said there are only 200 delinquents at the three children welfare development centers although they can accommodate around 700 children.

The speakers also noted that the number of children living at the 'safe homes' is far less than those can accommodate.

The seminar was chaired by Police Super Afzal Hossain while former police super Kangsho Dhar Tarafdar, Dr Khaleda Salauddin, Additional Deputy Commissioner Molla Tariqul Islam, Additional Police Super

Mahbub Latif, Social Welfare Officer Qazi Shajahan Miah, Tajul Islam, Convener of Munshiganj Press Club Manjur Morshed and its former president Mir Nasir Uddin also spoke.

Around 40 people from various professional groups participated in the seminar that included magistrates, police, social welfare workers and journalists.

Muggers stab 3 students, snatch valuables at CU shuttle train

A gang of muggers snatched gold ornaments, seven cellular phone sets and cash leaving at least three students stabbed inside a compartment of Chittagong University (CU) shuttle train yesterday.

One of the injured students was identified as Mahabub Alam Sohel, a fourth year student of sociology department, while the identity of other two could not be known.

Sources said six muggers equipped with daggers got on the university-bound shuttle train from Amtala that left Chittagong Railway Station at 10.45am.

When the train reached near Jhautala Station, they snatched the cellular phone sets, gold ornaments and cash from the female students.

At one stage, the snatchers stabbed Sohel and others when they tried to resist them, sources said.

Mugging on the shuttle trains operating specially in the morning and evening, has become regular affairs, alleged the students.

Earlier on Monday, the muggers snatched six mobile phone sets and gold ornaments from a city-bound train at the same spot, they said.

When contacted, Officer in-Charge of GRP station Nihar Ranjan Das told The Daily Star that some miscreants are involved in mugging on the shuttle train and police are trying to trace them out.

"We are not able to deploy cops in all the compartments since we lack sufficient manpower," he defended.
