

Climate change set to damage biodiversity of Sundarbans

Says BEA president

Climate change is set to damage biodiversity of the Sundarbans increasing the inundated areas and salinity in water in coastal areas.

As a result, crops, fisheries, forests and livestock will be at high risk in the country.

This was stated by Prof Qazi Kholiquzzaman Ahmad, lead author of Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)'s Working Group-2, at a press briefing organised by Bangladesh Economic Association (BEA) and Bangladesh Unnayan Parishad (BUP) at Dhaka Reporters Union in the city yesterday.

"Though Bangladesh is committed to conserve the World Heritage Sites in the Sundarbans, those are at great risk due to climate change," he said referring that two of the total 104 islands of Sundarbans in the Indian side have been lost due to rise of sea level.

Prof Kholiquzzaman said due to climate change, around two crore people in flooded areas will lose employment and their socio-economic security and millions will

be forced to become refugees and face various diseases like malaria, diarrhoea and skin diseases.

On the other hand, the climate change caused by global warming, will deepen drought in north-western region leaving agriculture and farmers at great risk, he added.

Citing researches, Prof Kholiquzzaman, also president of BEA, said a huge number of hardcore people will turn into beggars, the poor into ultra-poor and the lower income groups into poor.

"The consequences of ice-melting in the Himalayas caused by global warming will be devastating for Bangladesh," he said, adding, with more floods, there will be more people migrating to cities creating immense pressure on urban areas and compelling them to live an inhumane life in the slums.

In the wake of such research-based apprehensions, Prof Kholiquzzaman said Bangladesh as well as other developing countries should be united against the industrialised nations, which are mainly responsible for global warming, but are passing the

burden on the developing ones.

According to a report of IPCC, on an average global temperature will increase from 1.8 degree Celsius to 4 degree Celsius, while sea level will increase by 18 to 59 centimetres by next century.

Another IPCC report, published early this year, said 120 crore people of Asia and 25 crore people of Africa will suffer from scarcity of water in the case of increasing temperature by 1 degree Celsius.

"And if the temperature increases by 2 degree Celsius, productivity of rice in China will come down by 12 percent, 20 lakh people will face coastal flooding in Asia and 160 crore more people in Africa will suffer from scarcity of water," it added.

Increasing capacity of adaptability and controlling the global warming process are now very urgent, the report suggested.

BEA General Secretary Prof Abul Barakat and Prof Zahurul Karim, chairman of Centre for Agri Research and Sustainable Environment & Entrepreneurship Development, also spoke.

Seven children rescued

They said they all hailed from Bahilapota village of Benapole.

The traffickers brought them to Dhanyakhola alluring them of giving lucrative jobs, they added.

Two suspected traffickers Ali Hossain and Moritz, hailing from Shibchar in Madaripur district were arrested.

The rescued children were being sent to their parents.

Another report said BDR seized 217 containers of AC Gas worth about Tk 17 lakh before they were being smuggled out through the Putkhali border early hours of yesterday.

20 fortune seekers held at ZIA

Immigration police at Zia International Airport (ZIA) held 20 fortune seekers on Saturday as they gave twisted information and failed to satisfy the immigration officials with proper documents of their destinations.

The job seekers approached immigration section at 8:30am. The immigration police challenged them on suspicion and inquired about their destinations and checked necessary papers. Police also inquired about the travel agencies and the process through which they were being sent abroad.

The fortune seekers informed immigration police that they were supposed to go to Delhi at first in a flight of GMG airlines from where they would fly to Kabul. Brokers at Kabul were supposed to receive them and lead them to different countries, including some in European ones.

Immigration police said five travel agencies from outside the capital took money ranging from Tk 1.30 lakh to Tk 1.50 lakh from the fortune seekers, pledging to get them an access to Kabul. Eight brokers negotiated with the fortune seekers for the travel agencies.

"They were prevented as the way they were being sent promising a better future is nothing but risking their life. They were prevented to resist recurrence of any tragic incident that happened in the recent past leading an unknown number of them to death," said an Immigration official preferring anonymity.

The official said they prevented the job seekers, most of whom from greater Sylhet, Comilla, Feni and Munshiganj, as their passports carry tourist visa for Kabul.

Police however released them after questioning and a case was filed with Airport Police Station on Saturday accusing eight brokers.

13 killed in road accidents

At least 13 people were killed in separate road accidents in Munshiganj, Manikganj, Tangail, Netrakona and Sherpur yesterday and on Saturday.

UNB from Munshiganj adds: Four people were killed and five others injured in separate road accidents in the district yesterday.

Police said two people were killed when a bus rammed a rickshaw at Kakoldi in Sirajdikan upazila yesterday morning.

Rickshaw-puller Nuruzzaman alias Nuru Rahman, 50, died on the spot while his passenger Shamsul Haque succumbed to his injuries at a hospital in Dhaka.

Agitated mob caught the driver and handed him over to the police along with the bus.

An unidentified man was killed and five others were injured when an ambulance hit an auto-rickshaw at Tin Dokan in Lauhajang upazila.

Of the injured, Parul Rani, 60, and Masuda Begum were admitted to Lauhajang Upazila Health Complex.

Police arrested driver Aminul Haq Farayez along with the ambulance.

Meanwhile, Chandra Ban Bibi, 70, died on the spot when an auto-rickshaw hit her at Hoglakandi in Sadr upazila.

Our Correspondent from Manikganj reports: Two people were killed in separate road accidents in Manikganj on Saturday.

A jewellery businessman was seriously injured when a Balirte-bound bus from Dhaka hit him while he was talking over cellphone sitting on his standing motorcycle beside the road at Baimail area under Singair upazila on Dhaka-Singair-Manikganj road at around 12:00 noon.

The victim identified as Akter Hossain, 25, of Charigram village under Singair upazila succumbed to his injuries on the way to hospital.

A child was run over by a speeding bus while he was crossing the road at around 6:00pm at Golora area on Dhaka-Aricha highway.

The victim was identified as Russel, 13, an employee of Nahar Food Industries at Golar.

The bodies were taken to Manikganj Sadar Hospital for autopsy.

Our correspondent from Tangail adds: Two women were killed and one was seriously injured in a road accident on Tangail Bypass Road on Saturday evening.

The dead were identified as Shahana Begum, 22, of akar Takur Para in Tangail town and her cousin Bithi, 20, of Sakhipur upazila in the district.

Police and witnesses said the accident took place at around 6:30pm on Saturday when a North Bengal bound speeding passenger bus from Dhaka crushed a rickshaw under its wheels at Bil Gharinda leaving rickshaw passengers Shahana and Bithi dead on the spot and the rickshaw driver seriously injured.

The injured rickshaw driver Zafar, 30, was admitted to Tangail General Hospital.

On information, police rushed to the spot, recovered the bodies and sent them to Tangail General Hospital morgue for autopsy.

The killer bus, however, escaped from the spot.

A case was filed with Tangail Police Station in this regard.

Our correspondent from Netrakona adds: A cycle rider was killed in a road accident on

vehicles skidded off the road.

Motorcyclist Shahidul Islam, 31, and the trolley driver, 30, whose identity could not be known immediately, died on the spot.


Police sent the bodies to hospital for autopsy.

Another report from Patuakhali adds: Mother and son were killed and 20 others injured in a road accident at Kalikapur in the district town on Saturday.

A case was filed with Netrakona Police Station in this connection.

BSS from Sherpur says: Two people were killed in a road accident at Kalinagar in Nalitahari upazila of the district on Saturday.

Witnesses said the accident occurred at about 12:45pm when a Nalitahari-bound goods-laden trolley hit a motorcycle. Both the

SCHOOLBOY KILLING

Ten arrested in Narayanganj

An organised gang of ten kidnappers, who abducted and killed a schoolboy for Tk 50 lakh as ransom last month in Narayanganj, was arrested on Saturday night.

The victim was identified as Tuhin, a 16-year-old student of class ten at Siddhiganj Laksmi Narayan Cotton Mills High School.

Police said all arrestees are professional killers and kidnappers.

They abducted the victim on March 24 and killed him on March 31, as they did not get Tk 50 lakh as ransom, police added.

Police at first arrested Kalimuddin alias Bala, 45, from Nurulhaqpur at Madhabpur upazila in Narsingdi district using mobile network.

Getting information from Bala, police arrested chief of the gang Mojibur alias Maija, 38, from Patuakhali. Following the same way, police also arrested other members of the gang from Uttara and Shyampur of Dhaka, Madhabdi of Narsingdi, Futullah, Kutubali and Lampara of Narayanganj and Arambagh of Siddhiganj.

Other arrestees are professional kidnappers. Iqbal, 22, Maham, 37, Rustam, 30, Siraj alias Kutti, 45, Ramjan, 21, Zahirul Islam Rana
