## ACC to begin submitting charge sheets from next week

UNB, Dhaka

The Ant-Corruption Commission (ACC) will begin submitting charge sheets from next week against the listed corrupt suspects for whom first information reports (FIRs) were filed earlier by the anti-graft watchdog.

"Charge sheets are on the way. Submission of charge sheets will begin from the next week," said ACC Chairman Lt Gen (retd) Hasan Mashhud Chowdhury while talking to newsmen on return to his office after meeting Law Adviser Barrister Mainul Hosein at the Secretariat yesterday.

A competent source told UNB that charge sheets against Awami League leader and former state minister Dr Mohiuddin Khan Alamgir, BNP leader and former state minister Mir Nasir Uddin and

his son Barrister Mir Helal, and BNP leader and former state minister Aman Ullah Aman would be submitted next week.

FIRs were filed against them for concealment of information in early March.

Mashhud, who took charge of the reconstituted ACC about two months back, said, "Time has come to do something so that people can understand that the ACC is doing something."

Replying to a query about filing new cases, he said the cases filed so far against the suspected corrupts would be processed as soon as possible.

"The most important thing is to complete the cases without any flaw," the ACC chairman said, adding, "If these cases cannot be conducted correctly, question will rise in the minds of ordinary people

about the campaign against corruption."

About appointing lawyers to fight the cases for the Commission, he said the issues relating to appointment of lawyers and the mode of payment of their remuneration have been discussed in the meeting on Wednesday.

"I hope, everyone will accept the lawyers whom the Commission has decided to appoint," he added.

Replying to another question, Mashhud said the Anti-Corruption Act, 2004 has been amended and already approved by the government.

"It awaits gazette notification," he said.

Asked if the ACC secretary could ask for the wealth statements, he said there were doubts in people's mind as to whether the

secretary could issue notices to submit wealth statements, but the approval was given by the government.

Responding to another query, the ACC chairman said during the meeting with the law adviser, also in-charge of the information ministry, he asked for the use of government media to inform people of the campaign against corruption.

Mashhud said the law adviser has assured that Bangladesh Television would extend all-out cooperation in reaching the message to common people of the country.

About his visit to districts in future, the chairman said, "I will continue the visit...But first I will complete the tasks that have been prioritised."

## Concern over labour unrest in Khalishpur

Ain O Salish Kendra (ASK) has expressed deep concern over the situation in Khalishpur industrial area in Khulna.

A press release of ASK yesterday said labour unrest is growing across the country and the latest incident occurred in Khalishpur.

Citing newspapers, it said workers at the Peoples Jute Mills, Platinum Jute Mills and Star Jute Mills located in Khalishpur have been agitating over their arrears and wages for last few days.

The situation has further deteriorated as both the police and the workers have resorted to violence in which several people were injured.

ASK appealed to all concerned to sit together in order to find a peaceful solution to the problem as there is no other alternative to save the country's dwindling economy.

## Campaign for signing of disability rights convention

The Action on Disability and Development (ADD) along with its partners has launched a solidarity campaign for the signing of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, says a press release.

The campaign that began on April 16 will cover 25 districts. The programmes include discussion and cultural programmes where people put their signatures on a long banner.

The UN Convention has opened for signing on March 30 for its member states. Meantime, 86 countries have signed the Convention. Bangladesh did not sign the Convention yet.

The ADD along with its partners from disability rights movement urged the government to immediately sign and ratify the Convention and implement it gradually.

ADD has undertaken the countrywide solidarity campaign to create mass awareness and public opinion prior to signing, ratification and gradual implementation of the UN Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities.

The campaign will continue in Dhaka up to today.

The ADD will display the signed banners in front of the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban on April 25 and organise a debate on the signing of the Convention.

## Take stern action against polluters, encroachers

Speakers tell seminar on Buriganga

Environmentalists yesterday urged the caretaker government to take stern action against the encroachers of the Buriganga and those dumping domestic and industrial waste into the river.

They also called on the government to demarcate the riverbank in order to protect the river from illegal encroachment.

A protection wall and an earthen walkway can be constructed to save the river, they suggested at a seminar on 'Buriganga: Present situation and our duties'.

Paribesh Bachao Andolon (Save the environment movement), geography and environment department of Dhaka University and Urban Rural Planning (URP) department of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) jointly organised the seminar at Dhaka Reporters' Unity (DRU)

auditorium.

"The Buriganga receives a large quantity of waste, surface run-off, untreated industrial effluents, treated sewerage directly or indirectly from the capital, which leaves the river virtually dead," Prof AQM Mahbub said.

"From time immemorial the Buriganga is serving the residents of Dhaka. But it is now dying due to the inconsiderate use of the river by people," said M Shakil Akhter, assistant professor of URP department of BUET, in the keynote paper.

Paribesh Bachao Andolon Convener Abu Naser Khan, Bangladesh Inland Water Transport Authority (BIWTA) Secretary Monowar Hossain and former president of the Institution of Diploma Engineers, Bangladesh Safiuddin Sarkar took part in the seminar.


During the War of Liberation in 1971, Dutta, a freedom fighter, served the Bangladesh Government in exile as accountant.

His qulhwani will be held at Khalil Sarder mosque at Hazaribagh after Asr prayers tomorrow.


## Death anniversary
