

Dhaka, London to work together on climate change, counter-terrorism

Bangladesh and Britain have agreed to work at both bilateral and international levels to reduce adverse impacts of climate change and increase cooperation in the fight against terrorism.

At a meeting in London on Thursday, Foreign Affairs Adviser Dr Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury and British Secretary for Foreign and Commonwealth Office Margaret Beckett MP also reaffirmed their commitment to increase bilateral trade and investment.

"Britain and Bangladesh will continue to cooperate closely as friends, bilaterally as well as multilaterally, including at the UN and the Commonwealth," Beckett said.

The meeting was "extremely fruitful" and covered the entire gamut of Bangladesh-UK bilateral

relations, said a release from Bangladesh High Commission in London yesterday.

The British Foreign Secretary conveyed her government's appreciation to Bangladesh for its support to the thematic debate recently held at the UN Security Council on 'Energy, Security and Climate Change'.

She also expressed her firm resolve to work towards mitigation as well as adaptation measures to combat the adverse effects of climate change on Bangladesh.

"Britain also looks forward to working in close concert with Bangladesh on counter-terrorism measures both bilaterally and through global institutions," Beckett said.

The adviser briefed Beckett about the structural reforms undertaken by the caretaker government to create sustainable elec-

toral, political, anti-corruption and public administration institutions in Bangladesh in order to create a level-playing field for a credible election by December 2008.

He said: "Democratic spirit and pluralist ethos are deeply ingrained in Bangladesh's society, which also takes pride in a vibrant civil society, a fiercely free press, intellectual thought, leadership in micro-credit and a disciplined armed force contributing to global peace and stability."

Dr Iftekhar Chowdhury sought technical and other forms of support from the British government to facilitate the work of the Election Commission for the 2008 elections.

Beckett said her government was happy with the announcement of election timeline by Chief Adviser Fakhruddin Ahmed and looked forward to providing all out

support to Bangladesh's electoral process.

She also praised the caretaker government for its stringent anti-corruption drive, which she hoped would contribute to good governance.

Later, Adviser Dr Iftekhar Ahmed made a keynote policy speech at the prestigious British diplomatic think-tank, the Royal Institute for International Affairs (Chatham House), on 'Challenges for Bangladesh in South Asia'.

The lecture was attended by high Commissioners, ambassadors and diplomats resident in London and Commonwealth Deputy Secretary General and senior officials from the FCO, DFID, international human rights and development agencies and other international think-tanks.

CHARGE OF ABDUCTING FRIEND

Four students of Barisal polytech held

Police arrested four students of Barisal Polytechnic Institute yesterday noon in connection with abducting a student of Barisal City College and demanding ransom on Thursday evening and the victim was not rescued ending last evening.

The arrestees were Mizanur Rahman Munna, Shamim, Setu and Alamin, who all were friends of the abducted victim Shafikul Islam Rakib.

Khorshed Alam, officer-in-charge of Barisal Kotwali Police Station, acknowledging the fact that Rakib, an HSC student, was abducted from the Paresh Sagor area near Polytechnic Institute of the city on Thursday evening.

The abductors demanded Tk 50 thousand as ransom from the guardians of the victim over mobile phone and tortured the victim.

Mamun, leader of the abductor gang, collected Tk 10 thousand from Abdul Hye, maternal uncle of the victim on Thursday night to stop physical torture on the victim. Hye assured the gang to pay Tk 40 thousand by Friday.

Later the criminals cut off contact as they became aware about police investigation and arrests of their associates and the victim was not rescued as of last evening.

Drug-peddler arrested after shootout

Members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday arrested a drug-peddler after a shootout with a group of drug-runners at Talaimari areas in the city yesterday.

Shahidul Islam Shahin, 35, of Talaimari Raninagar areas was held with bullet injuries on his two legs.

Rab members seized 50 bottles of smuggled Indian phensidyl and a 25-inch machete from his possession.

A Rab press release said a Rab team of Rajshahi Railway colony camp challenged the group of drug-peddlers behind Ruet campus.

As Shahidul among the fleeing criminals tried to hit Rab members with a machete, Rab members fired six shots.

Later Shahidul was found with bullet injuries on his two legs. He was admitted to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital.

Rab sources said Shahidul was among one of a few drug-peddlers of the city.

One killed in Netrakona road accident

A passenger was killed and 25 others were injured in a road accident in Netrakona yesterday.

The dead was identified as Achhor Ali, 50, of village Deoli under Barhatta upazila.

The serious injured Abdur Rahman, 80, Fazlu Mia, 50, Rakhal Chandra, 30, Jobeda Biswas, 30, and Hajera Khatun, 65, were rushed to Mymensingh Medical College and Hospital.

Other injured were admitted to Netrakona Sadar Hospital and Barhatta Upazila Health Complex.

Police said the accident occurred when a Mohanganj-bound passenger bus from Netrakona reached Deoli at about 6:00pm, the driver lost control over the steering of the vehicle that fell into a roadside ditch killing one on the spot and injuring 25 others.

According to doctors, Rubel needs immediate kidney transplantation, which will involve Tk 10-12 lakh.

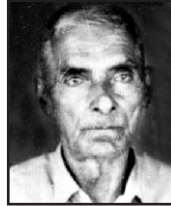
But his father, an employee of Marine Fisheries Survey Unit at Agrabad, cannot meet such huge expense with his poor income.

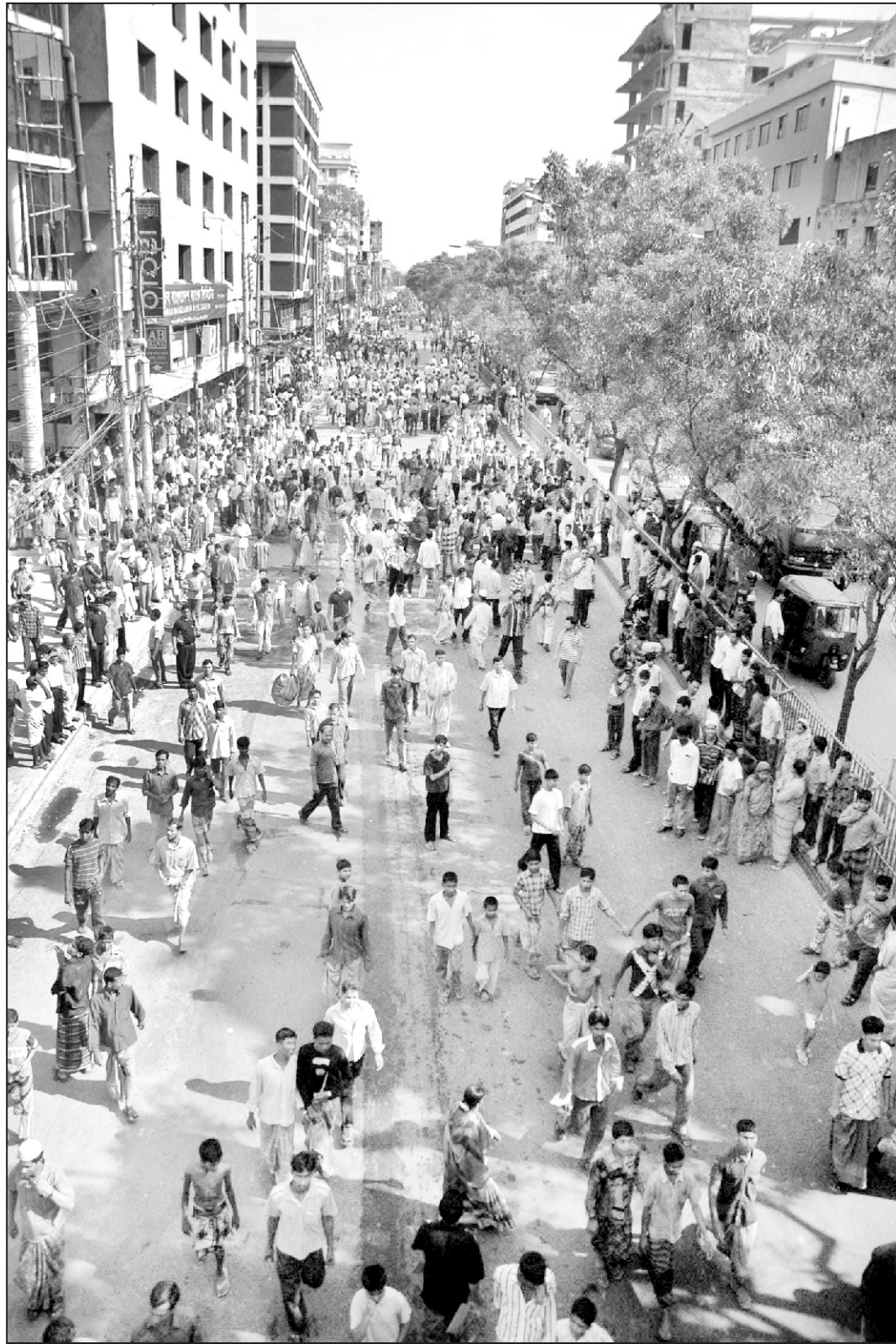
