

## Country's southern zone faces severe power crisis

Twenty-one districts of Khulna and Barisal Divisions including greater Faridpur have been in the grip of severe power crisis since last four months.

The 110-megawatt power plant in Khulna went out of order 13 times during this period due to leakage in boiler tubes.

Besides, another 60-megawatt power plant has been inoperative due to major technical faults since last nine months.

According to reliable source of West Zone Power Distribution Company Limited (WZPDCL), the date-expired 457 boiler tubes of 110-MW power plant are no more capable of generating electricity. All of them need to be replaced by new ones.

The plant first went out of order in January this year. Since then it became inoperative 12 more times due to negligence of WZPDCL authorities, alleged the sources.

### Ctg Govt High School, Ctg Grammar School win quiz competition

He said in the present knowledge-based industrial society, English debate should be encouraged like Bangla debate to increase the power of logic.

"If we can take the culture of debate by heart, it is sure that massive changes will take place in our personality gradually," said Mahfuz Anam.

He said, "We all need to think and speak rationally on the basis of right information and debate can play an

important role in this regard."

Organised by Dhaka University Debating Society (DUDS), all the competitions begin simultaneously from today.

A total of 16 Bangla and English debating clubs of Dhaka University will participate in the debate competition while 20 public and private universities will take part in the Public Speaking Competition.

The competitions will be held at Munir Chowdhury Conference Room of the Teachers Students Centre (TSC) and DUDS Room from 9:30am to 6:30pm.

The prize distribution ceremony of the competitions will be held at TSC auditorium on Monday at 5:30pm.

## Strengthening local govt a must for food security

### Say speakers at discussion

Strengthening local government and increasing people's purchasing power are crucial to ensure food security of the marginalised people, participants at a discussion said yesterday.

They also said political parties, social organisations and local bodies as well as the mass media need to work together to eliminate food insecurity from the society.

CARE Bangladesh organised the interactive discussion with the media personnel at city's Cirdap auditorium yesterday.

Syed Badrul Ahsan, editor, current affairs, The Daily Star, said food security together with social accountability must be taken up for focused and detailed deliberation on the part of a cross section of people.

"In recent time, the media has played a remarkably positive role

in acclimatising people to political and social issues. Mass media has the power and potential that can be utilised to propagate food security issue," he said while presenting a keynote paper titled 'Role of the Media in Ensuring Food Security and Social Accountability'.

Badrul Ahsan also said food insecurity of poor people cannot be eradicated even after producing sufficient food if people's purchasing power is not strengthened and food is not distributed properly.

As the nation approaches the general election, food security issue ought to be included as part of the election campaign of the political parties, he suggested.

Speaking at the discussion, Country Director of CARE Bangladesh Steve Wallace said CARE has been working for addressing the underlying causes of poverty.

"For next five years, CARE has set mission to amplify the voices of the poor and the marginalised in ways that will influence public opinion, development practice and policy at all levels," he said.

KM Harun, chief of programme, RTV, and Pervez Chowdhury, commissioning editor of ETV, also spoke on how the media can play an influential role at grassroots level to ensure poor people's access to khas land and water bodies.

They also appreciated the role of SHOUHARDO (Strengthening Household Ability to Respond to Development Opportunities), one of the major programmes of CARE, which is now working in chars, haors and coastal regions of 18 districts.

National Technical Coordinator of SHOUHARDO HK Das moderated the discussion.
