One killed, 15 hurt in clash over land in Sunamganj

A young man was killed and 15 others injured in a clash between two rival groups over land properties at Chhata Alagpur village of Jagannathpur upazila in Sunamganj district yesterday morning.

The deceased was identified as Chandan Miah, 30, son of late Intaj Ali.

Among the injured, two were rushed to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital in critical condition while others received treatment at a local hospital.

Police said there had been a longstanding rivalry between the men of Bahar Miah and Azad Hossain.

The clash ensued yesterday when both the groups swooped on each other with lethal weapons at about 10:30am.

Police caught three people in this connection.

7000 children fall victim to cancer a year

Experts tell seminar

Lack of proper healthcare services and social awareness are the major reasons behind the death of child cancer patients, experts said at a seminar yesterday.

Around 7000 children fall victim to cancer every year, they said, adding that 90 percent of them die even before the disease is diagnosed.

Ashic Foundation organised the seminar on 'Palliative care in childhood cancer in Bangladesh' at RDEC seminar hall at Agargaon in the city where doctors, nurses and representatives of different social organisations and NGOs took part.

Health and Family Welfare Adviser Maj Gen (retd) Dr ASM Matiur Rahman said the caretaker government will try to provide all kinds of supports for safeguarding the cancer-affected patients.
