

OIC needs reforms to meet challenges

Foreign adviser tells journalists

Foreign Adviser Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury yesterday criticised the Organisation of Islamic Conference (OIC) saying it is limited to 'political platitudes' and is becoming moribund in the absence of effective reforms to make it operational.

Iftekhar made the observations at a press briefing on his return home from the Islamic Conference of Foreign Ministers (ICFM) meeting in Islamabad yesterday, where he said, "the OIC is confined to platitudes in the political arena," adding that the organisation has become "moribund" and unable to respond to changes and present-day requirements.

"The OIC needs to be modernised to make it enable to respond to present-day requirements," he said, adding, "We would be most benefited if it can be made development centric."

Asked why reforms were not made, Iftekhar said, "Some of them are not ready for the change and many are afraid of the change. There are some established centres of power and some are fearful of a shift of that power-base."

He said the OIC member states control 70 percent of global oil resources and 40 percent of other resources and that shows the scale of opportunities that can be explored by the organisation.

Bangladesh, he said, hopes to utilise the OIC to contribute to the

country's development, by improving market access to the wealthier OIC countries.

Iftekhar said he hopes the organisation can become development centric to address the most pressing problems of its member states.

At bilateral meetings on the sidelines of the ICFM, Iftekhar held talks with Pakistan Foreign Minister Khurshid Kasuri and stressed the need for resolving the matter of repatriating stranded Pakistanis and ways to 'confront' matters of the past to move towards the future.

Iftekhar hinted that Bangladesh is looking to set up a diplomatic mission in Khartum as, he said, there is a lot of potential including investment opportunities in Sudan.

He also met with his counterparts from Turkey and Iran for bilateral talks on the sidelines of ICFM meeting.

Implement Poverty Reduction Strategy Paper (PRSP) to eliminate all kinds of violence against women and ensure gender equality, said human rights leaders at a workshop yesterday.

They also called for an action plan to ensure full participation of women in mainstream economic activities for political empowerment.

The workshop on 'Women's rights

and implementation of PRSP' was organised jointly by Oxfam GB-Bangladesh and PRIP Trust at the Institution of Diploma Engineers in the capital.

The speakers said awareness about gender equality has to be raised from the grassroots level and attitudes of the policy makers will have to be changed.

They suggested launching of special training programmes for government officers and bureaucrats to make them conscious about gender equality.

They said poverty cannot be eradicated from the society without ensuring social, political and economic security of women.

Former adviser to caretaker government Advocate Sultana Kamal said PRSP is a tool, which will help reduce poverty.

"Without involving women in all sectors and ensuring gender equality, we will not be able to achieve Millennium Development Goals (MDG) by 2015," she added.

Marine ports still under Signal No 3

The north Bay of Bengal has continued to remain rough as squally weather is still prevailing due to deep convection churning out clouds there, since the Cyclone Akash made the landfall on May 15.

Due to heavy seas and high winds roaring over the Bay, the Met office has continued its advisory for the maritime ports of Chittagong, Cox's Bazar and Mongla to keep flying the local cautionary Signal Number 3.

The warning for fishing boats and trawlers in the north Bay has also remained in force, until further notice, asking the fishermen to keep their boats close to the coast and negotiate the sea cautiously, Met office sources said.

Under the spell of the convective clouds, coastal areas in the south-east have had some heavy showers. Cox's Bazar recorded the highest 100 mm of rains, Kutubdia 75 mm, Sandwip 13 mm, Comilla 11 mm, Majidpur and Bholia each had 6 mm, and Feni 5 mm yesterday between 6:00am till 12:00noon.

Wife's appeal to chief adviser

Wife of Chittagong city mayor yesterday made an appeal to the chief adviser to the caretaker government for withdrawal of detention order and returning the confiscated passport to help send Mayor ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury abroad for treatment, said a press release.

In the appeal Begum Hasina Mohiuddin referred that her husband was admitted to Chittagong Medical College Hospital (CMCH) when he fell seriously ill due to heart and urinary complications at Bandarban district jail in the early hours of May 14.

With further deterioration of condition the mayor was shifted to Dhaka central jail and was admitted to Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) hospital on May 16.

Hasina Mohiuddin said Mohiuddin is suffering from chest pain, uncontrolled diabetes, blood pressure, urinary retention caused by enlarged prostate and kidney problem.

The complications were also detected in different medical tests conducted on him at BSMMU hospital suggesting for taking him abroad for advanced treatment, she said.

In this regard she further referred that Mohiuddin has already got ad-interim bail in two cases that put him behind the bar.

However, he could not be taken abroad for advanced treatment due to the detention order, said Hasina Mohiuddin making a fervent appeal for withdrawing the detention order and returning the seized passport to help take Mohiuddin Chowdhury abroad on humanitarian ground and save his life.

Two alleged Rab sources held while taking bribe

Detective Branch (DB) of police caught two alleged Rab sources red-handed while taking bribe from a Juba Dal leader's wife at Water World Park at Sayedabad in the city yesterday.

The arrestees were identified as Army Azad alias Sagar and Jamal Hossain.

Parvin Dewan, wife of Dewan Mohammad, joint secretary of Rupganj Juba Dal, told the journalists that members of Rab-3 arrested her husband and her brother-in-law from in front of a bazar at Rupganj on Saturday night.

Following their arrest, two people identifying themselves as Rab sources demanded Tk 50,000 over phone as bribe to release them at around 8:00am and threatened to kill them in crossfire or file arms cases against them if they do otherwise, she said.

After negotiations, the sources agreed on Tk 30,000 for their release.

She also informed Narayanganj police just after receiving the call.

Once they received the money, DB police caught the criminals red-handed.

The arrestees claimed they have been working as Rab sources for four years.

Commanding officer of Rab-3, however, said there is no relationship between the arrestees and Rab.
