

## 2 LAID-OFF KHULNA JUTE MILLS

## Workers stay away from duty, place 4 demands

Partial production in sacking sections of state-owned Crescent Jute Mills and Star Jute Mills could not be resumed till yesterday as workers did not turn up for duty.

They placed a four-point demand to managements of the mills as preconditions for resuming work in the two mills.

The four-point demands include withdrawal of lay-off orders, full payment of all arrears including

those for the lay-off period and unconditional release of arrested workers now in jail.

Workers of these two jute mills have already informed local authorities of Bangladesh Jute Mills Corporation (BJMC) that they would start fresh agitation if their four-point demands are not fulfilled immediately.

The decision to resume partial production in sacking sections with 186 workers of the two jute mills is nothing but a 'new trick' to befool

workers and ignore their right, said convenor of Khulna regional committee of Patkal Sangram Parishad (PSP) Sarder Motaharuddin.

The new crisis created out of workers' reluctance to join work without payment of arrears and meeting other demands could not be resolved despite a three-hour discussion held on Tuesday between CBA leaders and the Joint Director of Labour.

Zonal Coordinator of BJMC Shamim Ahmed was also present at

the meeting.

Terming the situation as grave, Shamim Ahmed said he was waiting for the next decision from higher authorities on possible ways to tackle the problem.

"I am almost fed up with this sort of situation", he said while talking to this correspondent yesterday.

"I am smelling an unpleasant situation again in the industrial belt as some CBA leaders are fanning the trouble by instigating workers", he said earlier.

Four state-owned jute mills were laid-off by an order of BJMC chairman on April 19 following agitation by workers for payment of arrears salaries and wages.

Meanwhile posters were seen on walls of the laid-off mills with slogans in support of 'another tough agitation' in Khulna industrial belt in protest against non-payment of arrears wages and non-procurement of 'required funds' to resume full operation of the laid-off jute mills.

CBA leader Abdul Malek at Peoples Jute Mills demanded withdrawal of cases against filed under the Emergency Powers Act with Khulshpur and Daulatpur police stations.

"We have made it clear to BJMC authorities that any move to reopen any of the laid-off mills without payment of arrears will bring no positive development to end the deadlock", Malek said.

BJMC Chairman Ashrafur Islam visited the laid-off mills on May 20 at the head of a six-member high level team and held meetings with top officials of the eight state-owned jute mills on May 21 to find out ways to resolve the crisis.

He submitted a report to the government recommending partial operation of the laid-off jute mills, sources said earlier.

## BNP factions in Khulna hold separate programmes

The programmes included milad mahfil, Quran Khwani and distribution of food among inmates of orphanages. Similar programmes were also observed in all upazilas of the district.

The joint secretary general and former whip Md Ashraf Hossain did not attend any of the programmes organized by the rival factions of BNP.

To mark the occasion, a discussion was held at local Daily Desh Tyatha office. Desh Tyatha Editor Halimuzzaman was in the chair.

Speakers demanded immediate punishment to those involved in attacking the journalists.

## SI sued in Satkhira

## 4 JMB suspects held in Chandpur

Four suspected militants of banned Jama'at-ul-Mujahideen Bangladesh (JMB) were arrested by police from Kochua and Hajiganj upazilas yesterday afternoon, police said.

The arrested are Billal Hossain, 26, Nuruzzaman, 32, and Md Awlad Hossain, 24, all hailing from Narsingdi and another Jakir, 22, hailing from Bhola, police said.

Acting on a tip off, Kochua police arrested Billal Hossain, Nuruzzaman and Md Awlad Hossain as JMB suspects from Jogotpur Bazar under Kochua upazila.

They were working for JMB secretly in guise of 'ferriwala'. They rented a house at Jogotpur. They were new faces which created suspicion among local people.

In another raid, police arrested another JMB suspect Jakir from Hajiganj Sadar. Jakir was staying at a rented house from where he was carrying out JMB activities secretly, police said.

## Former deputy minister Pintu, 12 others sued in Tangail

'Extortion' case against municipal chairman

A case was filed against former deputy minister for information Abdus Salam Pintu, his younger brother JCD vice-president Sultan Shauddin Tuku, Gopulpur municipal chairman Kader Kabir Uzzal and 11 others yesterday. Pintu was elected from Tangail-2 (Gopulpur-Bhuapur).

Ashrafuzzaman Azad, joint convenor of Gopulpur upazila unit of Juba League, filed the case with the court of Magistrate Dewan Mahmudul Haque in Tangail under Section 5/3 of the Explosives Act.

In his complaint Azad alleged that local leaders and activists of Awami League (AL) led by former AL lawmaker Khandakar Asaduzzaman brought out a procession from Gopulpur stadium on March 26 last year on the occasion of Independence Day.

The procession was attacked by the accused BNP and JCD leaders with lethal weapons it was crossing BNP office at Gopulpur Bazar. Three AL activists were seriously injured in the attack, he claimed in the complaint.

Azad also mentioned in his complaint that he could not file any case so far due to 'unfavorable situation' prevailing in the country.

The magistrate ordered the officer-in-charge (OC) of Gopulpur police station to record the case and take legal steps after investigation.

Others accused in the case are Gopulpur town BNP's secretary

Sanwar Hossain Chhana, Gopulpur upazila Juba Dal leaders Proloy Kunda, Bhogen Babu, Chand Miah, Jahangir Hossain, and Gopulpur upazila JCD leaders Jasim Uddin, Jewel Miah, and Maznu Miah.

An extortion case has been filed against Tangail municipal chairman and district joint convenor of Krishak Samik Janata League (KSJL) Jamilur Rahman Miron.

Businessman Ratan Chandra Basak of Ashekpur area in Tangail

town filed the case with Tangail Sadar police station Tuesday night.

Ratan Chandra Basak complained that the municipal chairman demolished his shop at Victoria Road in Tangail town for construction of a market on assurance of a shop at the market.

Later, he went to the municipality office on May 2, 2005 and meet with the chairman. Miron called him to a room at the municipal

building and demanded Tk 6,50,000 for allocation of a shop, Ratan alleged in the case.

The municipal chairman also threatened him not to disclose the matter, rattan mentioned in the complaint.

Investigation officer (IO) of the case SI Lutful Haque visited the spot yesterday.

Miron surrendered to joint forces recently and he is in jail now.

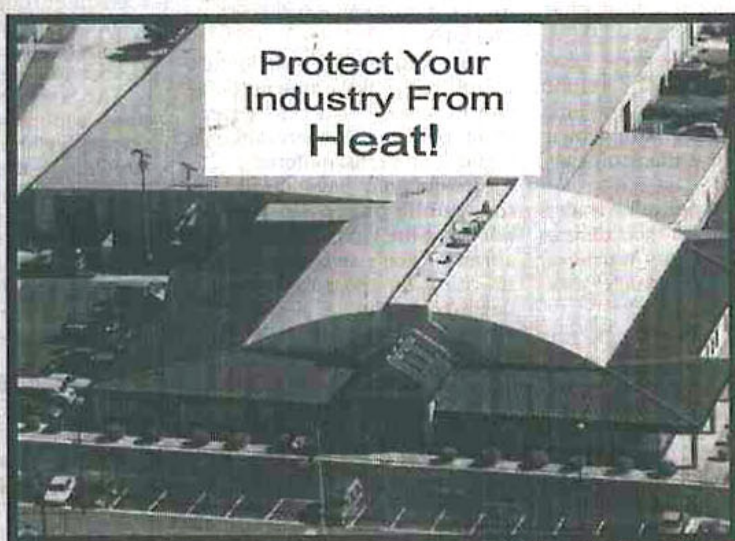

UNDP Bangladesh seeks applications from Bangladeshi nationals for the position of Education Cluster Leader for Chittagong Hill Tracts Development Facility (CHTDF), under the "Support to Primary Education" mission in CHT.

**Duties and Responsibilities:** Under the guidance of the Chief of the Ranganmati field office the principal responsibilities are the following: (1) Provide day to day leadership in management of the Education Cluster and its component resources, developing its strategic planning, setting priorities and direction, and team development activities and supervise all members of the Education cluster; (2) Guide, manage and coordinate all Education component activities ensuring project logic, design, work plan, budgeting, and implementation and targeting are achieved according to scheduling of activities; (3) Provide technical oversight and support to all components of the Education programme, and ensure close working relations, linkages and coordination in the implementation of the various components and all partner institutions; (4) Ensure linkages between different activities of Education initiatives and other relevant UNDP-CHTDF program components; (5) Coordinate partner agencies in the design, management, and implementation of the programme in line with UNDP's strategy and programme approaches of partnership and capacity building; (6) Ensure that all activities are developed and designed to the highest possible standards with rigorous M&E plans integrated from the outset, providing regular impact and process data; (7) Monitor the various Education related activities to ensure qualitative and quantitative standards, identifying problems and taking necessary action to address them, and prepare monthly and quarterly status reports, as and when necessary; and (8) Liaise and maintain excellent relationships with government officials, CHT relevant policy makers, donor officials and all other relevant stakeholder. Facilitate workshops, dialogues and various other forms of institutional interactions.

**Qualifications and Experience:** The candidate should have Masters degree in education, development studies, public administration, management or other relevant field. At least 10 (ten) years of experience and proven background in development management and programming, preferably in the field of educational planning and management. Experience in implementation of UN programs and knowledge on UN regulations are desirable. Demonstrated success in working with regional and/or local governments on the promotion of education. Experience with wide range of donor reporting and donor compliance requirements, notably the European Commission. Strong co-ordination, negotiation, networking, lobbying and advocacy skills. Demonstrated writing skills and ability to produce high quality reports in English. Excellent command of English and Bangla. Some working knowledge in any of the CHT languages or Chittagonian dialect is desirable. Must be able to work in close collaboration with staff of multicultural background. High moral integrity, as well as diplomacy, impartiality and discretion with proven ability to work and act with discretion in a politically sensitive and challenging environment.

Persons selected for the above mentioned position will be recruited under the standard UNDP Service Contract modality with an initial duration of one year which may be extended.
