

Nine killed in road accidents

Nine people were killed and 46 others injured in separate road accidents across the country yesterday and on Thursday night.

Our correspondent in Mymensingh reports: At least four people were killed and 30 others were injured, 10 of them critically in a road accident at Shikari Kanda on Dhaka-Mymensingh highway under sadar upazila yesterday.

Two of the four victims were identified as Azizul, 50, and Khokon, 28, while the identity of the rest could not be confirmed immediately.

Police said the accident took place when a Netrokona-bound passenger bus from Dhaka hit a roadside tree at Shikari Kanda and skidded off the road as the driver lost control over the steering, injuring 35 passengers. The injured were rushed to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH) where four people succumbed to injuries.

The bodies were sent to MMCH morgue for autopsy.

A case was filed in this regard.

Our correspondent from Sathkhira reports: A construction worker was killed and another female worker

was injured seriously in a road accident at about 8:00pm on Thursday night when a truck crushed him on Sathkhira-Jessore road in the town.

The deceased was identified as Shafiqul Islam, 18, son of Abdus Sobhan of village Kukhrali in sadar upazila.

The injured Aklima Khatun, 25, wife of late Zohor Ali in the same village was admitted to sadar hospital in a critical condition, hospital sources said.

Quoting local people, police said a Jessore-bound truck from Bhomra land port slammed Shafiq and Aklima in front of a petrol pump at New Market intersection when they were returning home after construction work by riding a bicycle leaving Shafiq dead and Aklima injured.

On contact, sadar police Officer in Charge (OC) Shafiqur Rahman confirmed the incident.

UNB from Dhaka adds: In Jessore, three people were killed and 15 others injured in separate road accidents in Bagharpura and sadar upazilas in the morning.

In Bagharpura, two people were killed and 15 others injured when a bus plunged into a roadside ditch near Khajura Bazar in the early

hours of yesterday.

Police said a Dhaka-bound passenger bus of Eagle Paribahan fell into the ditch soon after one of its tyre burst at about 5:30am killing two passengers on the spot and injuring 15 others.

The deceased were identified as Taslim, 32, of Chittagong, and Raju, 15, son of Shahdat Hossain of Bagharpura upazila.

Of the injured 13 were admitted to sadar hospital.

In sadar upazila, an octogenarian man was crushed under the wheels of a truck at Balia Dhekutia village in the morning.

Police said Ali Box, 80, met the tragic end of his life at about 11:00am while he was crossing the road.

In Comilla, a bus rammed into a pickup-van at Korpail area in Burichang upazila at noon killing the unidentified van driver on the spot.

Separate cases were filed with the respective police stations following the two incidents.

South Asian University to be set up in India

India will house the prestigious South Asian University and all the eight Saarc countries will have its campuses.

This was decided at a two-day meeting of senior Saarc officials in New Delhi.

The university, intended to be a centre of excellence, will be set up in the vicinity of Delhi and is expected to be functional by July 2009.

India has offered to bear the entire cost of setting up the university which was proposed by Prime Minister Manmohan Singh at the 13th Saarc summit in Dhaka in 2005.

The Indian side informed the meeting that 250 acres of land is being acquired on the outskirts of Delhi for setting up the university which is expected to be a non-profit public-private partnership.

Gohar Rizvi, director of Ash Institution of Democratic Governance and Innovations at Harvard University who was entrusted with the task of preparing a concept note, has recommended a middle path between government-funded and private education to facilitate autonomy from bureaucratic stranglehold while maintaining social commitment towards the have-nots.

The role of the governments of eight member countries will have to be confined to provision of capital for setting up the institution. Once fully operational, the governments will not be expected to provide annual subsidies and grants, Rizvi said, adding the university will have to look for private and corporate donors without allowing them to influence its administrative and academic autonomy.

'Press politicians to bring changes to politics'

Presided over by Sadeque Siddique, general secretary of Manik Mia Parishad, the meeting was also addressed by Dr Mizanur Rahman Shelley, acting editor of Ittefaq, Rahat Khan, Prof Abdul Mannan Chowdhury, MA Rashid and Abu Sayeed Khan.

Paying tributes to Huseyn Shaheed Suhrawardy, Moulana Abdul Hamid Khan Bhashani, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman and Tofazzal Hossain Manik Mia for their outstanding contribution to Bengali nationalism, Dr Shelley said democracy did not fail in the country, rather those who were entrusted to make democracy stronger have failed as they destroyed democ-

racy to serve their personal interest.

He said those who are responsible for destroying everything in the country must not be pardoned as they will not forgive the nation if they return to power again.

Mentioning the contribution of Bangabandhu and Manik Mia for laying the foundation of Bengali nationalism, Rahat Khan said democratic spirit was the inspiration for Manik Mia.

Sadeque Siddique said emergency has been imposed in the country due to intolerant activities of two major political parties.

Now everybody should help the authorities concerned to establish a fair and corruption-free society, he added.

FAKE STUDENTS AT RU Probe body submits report

The probe committee investigating cases of eight alleged fake students of social work department of Rajshahi University yesterday submitted its report to the vice chancellor after two months of investigation.

Earlier, a five-member probe committee, headed by Prof Khalequzzaman of zoology department, was formed for investigating alleged irregularities in the admission of eight students of first year honours in 2006-07 academic sessions at the social work department.

It was alleged that a clerk in the department was behind the admission of the fake students and he realised Tk 2 lakh for this ill-task.

A member of the probe committee told this correspondent that the committee found some irregularities in the admission process. However, he did not elaborate.

Earlier, several hundred students of the social work department staged demonstration on the campus protesting admission of eight alleged fake students.

The students also boycotted their scheduled class and examination demanding punishment to the clerk.

When contacted, RU Vice-Chancellor Prof Altaf Hossain said the university authorities will review the report and take disciplinary action against the responsible people in the next syndicate meeting.

A teacher of the department said admission of the eight fake students will be cancelled and genuine students will be taken in.

The best photos as adjudicated by the judges will be put on display in an exhibition.

20 vessels fined Tk 3.5 lakh at Ctg port

Twenty vessels of different local categories were fined Tk 3.5 lakh by the Magistrate Court of Chittagong Port Authority (CPA) for non-payment of huge outstanding mooring charges.

The court in separate drives on Thursday fined the owners of these vessels and asked them to pay the mooring charges within the next one week. The penalised vessels include 17 ocean-going fishing vessels, one cargo ship and two oil tankers, a CPA press release said.

Meanwhile, the court in another drive demolished office structures of two trade union organisations, which were illegally established on an area of more than 1,100sqft CPA lands close to the restricted areas.

The offices of the Chittagong Port Marine Contractors Workers Union and Chattogram Sangrakta Sramik Karmachari Federation were constructed on the CPA lands, posing a threat to the port security.

As per the provision of International Port and Shipping Security (IPSC) code, construction of such structure within the 25 meters jurisdiction of port restricted areas is prohibited.

CPA retrieved its 1,100sqft lands by removing the illegal structures, the press release said.

Sonadanga made model police station
