

Mayor Sarwar owns Tk 20cr lands in Barisal

Task force finds 18 plots in town

The special task force of Anti Corruption Commission (ACC) has found 15 acres of prime land owned by Barisal City Corporation Mayor and former whip Majibor Rahman Sarwar.

Sirajul Islam, sub-registrar at Barisal Sadar land registration office admitted the task force findings but declined to give details.

Sources at the land registration office said the task force led by Maj. Abdul Hye went to the office on Thursday and asked officials to give information on lands owned by Sarwar and his family members.

After search the task force found documents that Sarwar and his family owned a total of 17 acres of land in 22 commercial, residential, industrial and farming plots. The value of the lands is at least Tk 20 crore, they said.

Eighteen of the plots are in

Barisal city Corporation area and four are on the outskirts of the city, the sources said.

Fourteen of those plots comprise a total of 8.5 acres and a rest eight cover about 8.5 acres, the sources said.

The lands in Barisal city owned by Sarwar and his family are in prime areas including Chambari, Puran Bazar, Kawaria, Kalibari Road and Hospital Road, they said. Details of the lands and their value are being ascertained, sources in the task force said yesterday.

Among these land documents 21 were registered in the name of Sarwar and only one in the name of his wife Nasima Sarwar.

Documents show that most of the plots were purchased during the four-party alliance run when Sarwar was the most powerful man in Barisal. He was ruling party whip in the Jatiya Sangsad, minister-in-

charge of the district and mayor of the city corporation.

Only four of the plots were registered in 1980s.

Search for other land property and other assets owned Sarwar and his family continued, the sources said.

Task force members held a meeting at district ACC office on Friday to review the documents and information collected so far, the sources said.

Details about the findings may be made available to newsmen today, sources in the task force and land registration office said yesterday. After assessing the findings, the task force may submit its primary report to ACC in Dhaka within this week. Cases may be filed against Sarwar after that, sources added.

The ACC task force started probe into alleged corruption and irregularities done by the BCC mayor on Tuesday after his arrest in Dhaka. Since then, the task force found fixed deposits of about Tk 20 crore in two bank accounts and transactions of cores of Taka by him in last five years, the sources said.

JESSORE EDITOR MURDER

Case filed against eight, woman held

Mostafa Awaluddin lodged an FIR with Jessore Kotwali police Friday night naming eight persons as accused in the murder of his elder brother Mostafa Kamal who was editor of Weekly Haq Protibad.

Unidentified miscreants stabbed Mostafa to death Friday early morning at a place five kilometres from Jessore town.

Police took eyewitness Monowara Khatoon into custody for interrogation after the murder.

The slain journalist was also proprietor of Haq Fisheries at Narayanpur village under Jessore Kotwali police station.

Jessore Kotwali thana OC MA Matin said they have launched a vigorous investigation into the murder.

Arms recovered in Khagrachhari

Army yesterday recovered arms and ammunition from a criminal's den at Goapara of Batnatali under Manikchhari upazila.

Acting on a tip-off, army raided Batnatali Goipara, a remote area in Manikchhari upazila, at 4.30 pm and recovered two country made gun, four rounds of ammunition, security sources said.

Sensing presence of army, the criminals fled the den leaving arms and ammunition.

Five of fake NGO held for cheating

Police yesterday arrested five officials and staff including female ones of a fake NGO for allegedly cheating about 300 unemployed youths by collecting over Tk 15 lakh from them in name of employment.

The arrested staff of the NGO at Kamal Nagar, Swaranika International Company Ltd, are assistant manager Rehena Khatun, daughter of Abdul Kader of village Shushilgati in Debhatia upazila, assistant manager Rizia Khatun, daughter of Azizur Rahman of village Haidarabad in Shyamnagar upazila and Hafizur Rahman, son of Yunus Khan of Rasulpur in Sadar upazila in Sakhira district and Ariful Islam, son of Atiar Rahman of village Shukurkhola in Jhikargachha upazila and Sazed Ali, son of Zinnat Ali of village Bhabati in Keshabpur upazila in Jessore district.

However, the so-called executive director along with other directors fled away with the money, said arrested Rehena Khatun.

They pasted advertisement on walls of different government and non-government offices for recruitment of officials and staff.

Being allured, unemployed youths handed over Tk 15 lakh to the cheats and joined the office, police said. When they realised that it was a fake NGO, they informed the matter to police. Later, police arrested five of its officials and staff.

While talking to this correspondent, Habib Ahmed, son of Shafiqur Rahman of village Sarafpur in Assassuni upazila said that he had applied for the post of assistant manager. He had handed over Tk 30,000 to Golap and Farhad of the NGO and joined the office later.

But when they realised that it was a fake NGO, they informed the matter to police. Later, police arrested five of its officials and staff.

On contact, Sadar Police Station officer-in-charge (OC) Sajiqur Rahman confirmed the incident.

BNP leader arrested in Srimongal

Bomb found again at RUET

8 bomb like things recovered from Kulaura station

A bomb was recovered from a bathroom at Shaheed Salim Hall of Rajshahi University Engineering and Technology (RUET) yesterday.

Earlier, two locally made bombs were recovered on May 24 and another on May 22 from near the main gate of RUET. One of the bombs was wrapped in an aluminium sheet which contained some writings in the name of Jamaat-e-Islami.

Campus sources said, the bomb recovered yesterday was wrapped in red tape and plastic paper.

A cleaner first saw and informed hall authorities, who called police from Motihir police station.

Police informed bomb experts who took it away in a bucket full of water.

When contacted, Motihir police

station Officer-in-Charge Ferdous Ahmed said it was a locally made powerful bomb, not similar to those recovered earlier.

Provost Sayed Mafiz Uddin of Shaheed Salim Hall said he urged police to investigate the two bomb recovery incidents in about a week.

Campus sources said Shaheed Salim Hall is dominate by activists of Islamic Chhatra Shibir, student front of Jamaat-e-Islami.

Our Moulvibazar Correspondent reports: Eight bomb like things were recovered from Kulaura railway station area in Moulvibazar Friday night.

Khondaker Golam Shahnewaz, Officer-in-Charge (OC) of Kulaura police station, said a tin container covered with red tape was seen near the entrance of the waiting room at the station at about 9.45 pm

on Friday. The station authorities informed police.

Police rushed there and cordoned the railway station area and started search. They found four tin containers and three plastic containers, all covered with red tape.

Explosives experts team of RAB-9 came, examined and destroyed those at about 12:30 am yesterday. RAB source said, each of the containers contained a device and two pencil batteries but no explosive materials.

During search, they found a knife, a scissor, a candle, some wires and red tapes near the spot.

Police suspected that some people might have been making bombs there but fled away.

Moulvibazar deputy commissioner and police superintendent visited the spot.

One killed, 15 injured in attack by land grabbers

A landless person was shot dead and 15 others were injured, three of them seriously, in an attack on them by land grabbers at village Bairagirchak.

The deceased is Kabir Hossain Sana, 45, son of Kurban Ali Sana of village Bairagirchak in Kaliganj upazila.

Injured Khairul Islam, Ala Uddin, Akram Hossain, Khadiza Khatun, Jeher Ali, Sofia Khatun, Abdur Rahim, Malek, Jabbar and others were admitted to Satkhira Sadar Hospital and local clinics for treatment.

Police said, over 300 landless families took 300 acres of government khas land lease and were staying there since 2002.

But the land grabbers who earlier possessed the land illegally

launched at least eight attacks on them. A landless old man named Abul Hossain, 67, of Bairagirchak was also beaten to death in an attack in 2005.

However, on Thursday night, land grabbers fired 25 bullets at the landless at village Bairagirchak.

According to the eastern side of the village, he said. Armed culprits opened fire at them about 5 am leaving Kabir dead and others injured, he said.



Nazrul University starts academic activities today

Jatiya Kabi Nazrul Islam Biswabidhalya (JKKNIB) at Darirampur in Trishal begins its academic activities today.

A simple function at the conference room of the university will mark the launching of the Nazrul university, a long cherished desire of people of the area where the rebel poet spent his boyhood.

Noted folklore specialist President of Greater Mymensingh Cultural Forum Dr. Ashraf Sidique will attend the inaugural programme as chief guest. Vice Chancellor of JKKNIB Prof. Dr. M. Shamsur Rahman will be in the chair. Among others, treasurer of the university Dr. Shafayet Hossain will be present as special guest.

Some eminent teachers from Dhaka and Mymensingh will attend the function to be rounded off with a cultural function.

Dr. Atarur Rahman, Assistant Controller of the university said that all preparations for launching academic session have been com-

pleted.

A preparatory meeting for today's inaugural function was held at the university yesterday morning.

Construction of all academic buildings has been completed to begin classes. Work on other infrastructures including construction of dormitories for students, boundary wall of female hostels and a cafeteria would be completed soon, he said.

A project to establish an university after the national poet at Trishal was taken up at a meeting of the Executive Committee of National Economic Commission (ECNEC) on February, 2004.

Nazrul stayed at Darirampur and studied at Darirampur High School in Trishal for two years.

Kazi Rafiuddin, a police sub-inspector, who was posted at Bardwan in West Bengal brought Nazrul to his village home at Darirampur.

The university is three kilometers away from the Trishal upazila headquarters and 22 kilometers from Mymensingh district town. It is about 100 kilometers from Dhaka.


