

# Form Food, Drug, Cosmetics Authority to protect consumers' rights

Experts urge govt

Experts at a workshop yesterday proposed that the government form an autonomous 'Food, Drug and Cosmetics Authority' (FDCA) to protect consumers' right.

They also said the FDCA would help the government control the quality of food, drug, medical equipment, cosmetics and agricultural and chemical products.

It would also boost export, increase tax, create employment opportunity of the educated people, control price of those products and most importantly the import items would not be able to capture the local market badly, experts viewed.

University of Development Alternative (UODA) organised the workshop where research findings

of market survey also stressed the need for an FDCA like USA, which shall regulate, inspect and test all food materials, chemicals, cosmetics, drugs and medical devices.

Mujib Khan of UODA presented the keynote paper where he elaborated the structure and function of FDCA and said this body would be able to play an important role as part of good governance.

Six directorates, including food, drug, cosmetics and chemicals would be involved in FDCA and would work in a coordinated way under continuous monitoring system, he said adding that around Tk 120 crore might be spent to run the organisation but if it is made a Public Limited Company (PLC), it could earn eight times higher than its expenditure.

Prof of the department of Pharmacy of Dhaka University ABM Faroque said lack of coordination prevails in the ministries that lead the fraudulent businessmen to adulterate food, drugs and cosmetics, which is hazardous for health.

"It requires alternative, visionary and effective steps to protect people's health," he added.

We are living in a state of failure and a market of failure where it is urgent to form an autonomous body consisting of government officials, academicians and businessmen, said Prof Muzaffer Ahmed, chairman of Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB).

Consumers Association of Bangladesh (Cab) General Secretary Kazi Farook said Consumers' Protection Act should

be promulgated as an ordinance as there is no example of protecting the rights of consumers by the law of penal code.

Vice Chancellor of UODA Prof Eamuddin Ahmed delivered the concluding speech while among others former president of Bangladesh Medical Association Prof Rashid E Mahbub, Prof Mohammad Rahmatullah of UODA, Shahabuddin Kabir Chowdhury of Jahangirnagar University, General Secretary of Pharmacy Graduate Association Ishtiaq Ahmed and Magistrate Rokon Ud-Doula also spoke on the occasion.

## 339 RECEIVE TERMINATION LETTERS Situation tense in industrial belt

Situation in Khulna-Jessore industrial belt is likely to turn violent as 94 workers of state-owned Aleem Jute mills and 245 of Eastern Jute mills received their termination notices on Saturday night.

Rumours are also there that state-owned Jessor Jute Industries and Carpeting Jute mills may also be laid off on the pretext of power outage and dull market of jute products both at home and abroad.

Leaders of Khulna regional unit of Patkai Sangram Parishad (PSP) held a closed-door meeting at a local hotel on Saturday midnight where they hit upon a plan to go for a severe agitation in consultation with CBA leaders of all jute mills in Dhaka and Chittagong.

The meeting was attended by CBA leaders of eight jute mills in Khulna-Jessore industrial belt.

Earlier on June 4, some 1080 workers of five state-owned jute mills in Khulna industrial belt were served with termination notices.

Authorities of laid-off Crescent, Star and Platinum Jubilee Jute mills held a meeting with the CBA leaders yesterday in the zonal office of BJMC in a bid to end the impasse.

The CBA leaders made it very clear to the authorities that workers would not join works until mills are reopened fully withdrawing lay-off orders and making full payment of all arrears.

They also refused to ask workers to join works in the sacking section of Star, Crescent and Platinum Jubilee Jute mills.

PSP Convenor Sarder Motaharuddin said all jute mills in Khulna-Jessore industrial belt have become losing concerns due to wrong policy of past government, unbridled corruption, financial crisis and power outages.

He said the mills are now virtually on the verge of collapse as the caretaker government has not allocated any fund in the recently-announced national budget for running them properly.

A source at Zonal BJMC office told this correspondent that the government is reluctant to allocate any more fund to reopen the jute mills.

"We are trying to devise ways and means to run the mills on 'No work no wages basis' lessening production cost," said the source.

Zonal Coordinator of BJMC Shamim Ahmed said time is running out fast to resolve the crisis.

## ADP achievable Says former BB chief

Prof M Ziaulhaq Mamun, director of the IBA, presided over the seminar.

## Charges to be framed against Wadud Bhuiyan on June 13

A court here yesterday took cognizance a charge sheet against Abdul Wadud Bhuiyan, a former BNP lawmaker from Khagrachari, and fixed June 13 for framing charges in presence of the accused.

Sources said Chittagong Divisional Special Judge Md Habibur Rahman accepted the charge sheet that accused the lawmaker of possessing illegal wealth worth around Tk 6.36 crore.

Assistant Commissioner-2 of Chittagong District Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) Md Jahangir Alam on Wednesday submitted the charge sheet against Wadud Bhuiyan at a Khagrachari court that sent it to the court of Habibur Rahman in Chittagong on Thursday, they added.

Raihan's name appeared in the first list of 50 corrupt people declared by the ACC and he had submitted statement on his wealth.

But after investigation, Dhaka Zone ACC Assistant Commissioner Nurul Alam found huge quantity of additional and undeclared wealth possessed by Bhuiyan and his family, and filed a case against him with Khagrachari Sadar Police Station on March 21.

After probing the case, Jahangir submitted the charge sheet on Wednesday.

A total of 84 people were shown as witnesses and 31 items as evidences in the charge sheet.

Sources further said the lawmaker also hid an amount of Tk 1.37 crore in his wealth statement and preparations are on to file another case for this offence.

## Hotelier shot dead

A hotelier was killed while another person suffered critical injuries as unidentified criminals sprayed bullets on them in Maghbazar in the rainy evening of yesterday.

The dead is Raihan Chowdhury, 22, owner of two restaurants and a residential hotel in Maghbazar. The injured Awlad Hossain Milton, 25, an employee of a television showroom in Mirpur, was taken to Dhaka Medical College and Hospital.

The unidentified criminals took Raihan and Awlad to a lane in Bara Maghbazar at 5:30am. They locked the entrance to the lane and shot Raihan and Awlad point blank, killing Raihan, who received about seven bullets, on the spot.

Though received two bullets—one in the chest and in the hand—Awlad somehow survived.

"I woke up by the sounds of continuous firing from the lane beside my house. I could count them from 10 to 15," Shahinur Rahman, a resident of a house on the lane, they added.

"Half-an-hour after Raihan left home we heard sounds of firing. As soon as we were informed by neighbours, we found him dead on the lane," said Yesmin Rana, elder brother of the deceased.




Today is the first death anniversary of litterateur and educationist Prof Dr M A n j u s r i Choudhury, says a press release.
