## Govt committed to holding credible polls

Chief adviser says

UNB, Dhaka

Chief Adviser (CA) Fakhruddin Ahmed yesterday said the present caretaker government is committed to holding a free, fair and acceptable election to give the country's democratic order a firm footing.

The CA made the remarks when outgoing Vietnamese Ambassador Ngo Van Hoa made a farewell call on him at his office.

The envoy said the caretaker government's achievements in its reform measures and contributions to the electoral process will not only help hold the next election

# Parties can talk with EC despite politics ban

Political parties can sit for dialogue with the Election Commission (EC) on its proposed electoral reforms despite the ban on political activities, an election commissioner said yesterday.

"Political parties will have to send their nominated representatives to hold discussion with us. We will not invite any parties to sit with the commission to discuss the proposed electoral reforms until the embargo on indoor politics is

lifted," Election Commissioner Brig Gen (retd) Sakawat Hossain told journalists at his office.

The EC will sit with the Jatiya Party (Nilo) today as the party had earlier sought a schedule for discussion on election matters, Sakawat said.

"I cannot say that," he replied when asked whether sending 'nominated' representatives would not be considered as political activities, and who would ensure their security.

The election commissioner's

comments came just a day after two advisers of the caretaker government said it may allow political parties to hold their council meetings, if they seek permission, to complete intra-party reforms despite the ban on politics.

Asked whether the views expressed by the advisers have prompted the EC to make a move for talks with political parties, Sakawat said he cannot say anything right now. "Wait and see," he added.

## Huda, Sigma, Alena sued for extortion

A construction contractor of the Roads and Highways (R&H) Department filed two extortion cases against detained BNP leader and former communications minister Nazmul Huda, his wife Sigma Huda, Alena Khan and three top executives of a human rights organisation on Tuesday night.

According to the case filed with Tejgaon Police Station, Nazmul Huda called Wahidur Rahman Azad, the complainant, to BSEHR (Bangladesh Society for Enforcement of Human Rights) office in February 2003 and demanded Tk 10 lakh in cash.

# BNP for quick council, AL for lifting politics ban first

Reformist leaders of BNP are thinking of holding a party council as soon as possible to adopt their 15-point reform proposal while Awami League (AL) reformists think that it is not possible to hold their party council under the state of emergency with a ban on political activities.

"We are thinking of holding the council. We have been discussing among ourselves and might hold the council just after completion of our preliminary preparations," ZA

Khan, an adviser to the BNP chairperson told The Daily Star last night.

AL Presidium Member Tofail Ahmed however said, "Even if the government gives permission to hold the council we won't be able to hold it with the ban on political activities."

Tofail, one of the top echelon leaders of AL reformists, demanded that the ban on indoor politics be lifted to facilitate holding of political parties' councils. But at the same time he expressed his doubts about the possibility of

that happening.

Sources in BNP said the reformist leaders of that party started communicating with prospective councillors across the country. They have also been trying to convince the prospective councillors to support their 15-point reform proposal aiming to remove Khaleda Zia from the post of the party chairperson, so that it is adopted by the council.

AL Acting General Secretary Mukul Bose however told The Daily Star that they have not yet started

## Tk 500cr duty evaded at 2 land ports

Taskforce probe finds

More than Tk 500 crore customs duty on importing fruits was evaded at Hili and Burimari land ports in the last six years.

A team of anti-corruption taskforce probed six years' records with the two ports and detected the

irregularities carried out by the clearing and forwarding (C&F) agents and importers in collaboration with some customs and bank officials.

The taskforce team comprising officials from the army, National Board of Revenue (NBR), police and the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) also found

irregularities in importing other goods, but it gave fruits import the highest priority.

According to the team's findings, the Hili port customs realised about Tk 605 crore as fruits import duty in the last six years while actual duty was Tk 925 crore. At the Burimari land port the realised

## LDP finally splits

The Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) officially split yesterday--only eight months after its formation--as its president and executive president both claimed their supremacy having majority support from party leaders.

Declaring a new party presidium, LDP President Prof AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury claimed that they are the real LDP and Col (retd) Oli Ahmed, former Speaker Sheikh Razzak Ali and 11 others are no more in the party.

On the other hand, LDP Executive President Oli Ahmed also claimed that they are the majority in the party as 12 of the 15 presidium members are with him.

"We formed the LDP...They (Badruddoza Chowdhury and others) joined the LDP leaving Bikalpa Dhara Bangladesh," Oli told The Daily Star.

Abolishing the LDP's 15-member presidium, Badruddoza

declared an 11-member presidium from a press briefing at the KC Memorial Clinic at Baridhara in the city.

The new presidium members are ex officio Prof Badruddoza and Major (retd) MA Mannan, Maj Gen (retd) MA Halim, Brig Gen (retd) Giasuddin Ahmed, Arshaduzzaman, Mohammad Abdullah, Dr Abdul Mannan, Prof Nurul Amin Bepari, Arif Mainuddin, Joykul Abedin and MA Mukit Khan.

Mahi B Chowdhury refused to accept the post of presidium member saying he is engaged with a non-party reform initiative.

Acknowledging the division in the party, Badruddoza said at the press briefing, "We are not responsible for the split...77 of the 100 national executive committee members [of the party] are with us. We are the real LDP."

Brushing aside Oli's claim that Badruddoza and his followers are not in the party any more, he said,

## Brown replaces Blair

Finance minister Gordon Brown took over yesterday as British prime minister from Tony Blair, vowing after a decade in Blair's shadow to lead an era of "change".

While Blair, his reputation as a reformer tainted by the Iraq war, was expected to become a Middle East peace envoy, Brown highlighted his determination to stamp his own authority after being asked by Queen Elizabeth II

to form a new government. Brown pledged in his first public comments to lead a "new government with new priorities."

He said he wanted to "build trust" in the government and reject "old politics" as he showed his determination to make a break with the Blair years. "Now let the work of change begin," he declared outside his Downing Street office.

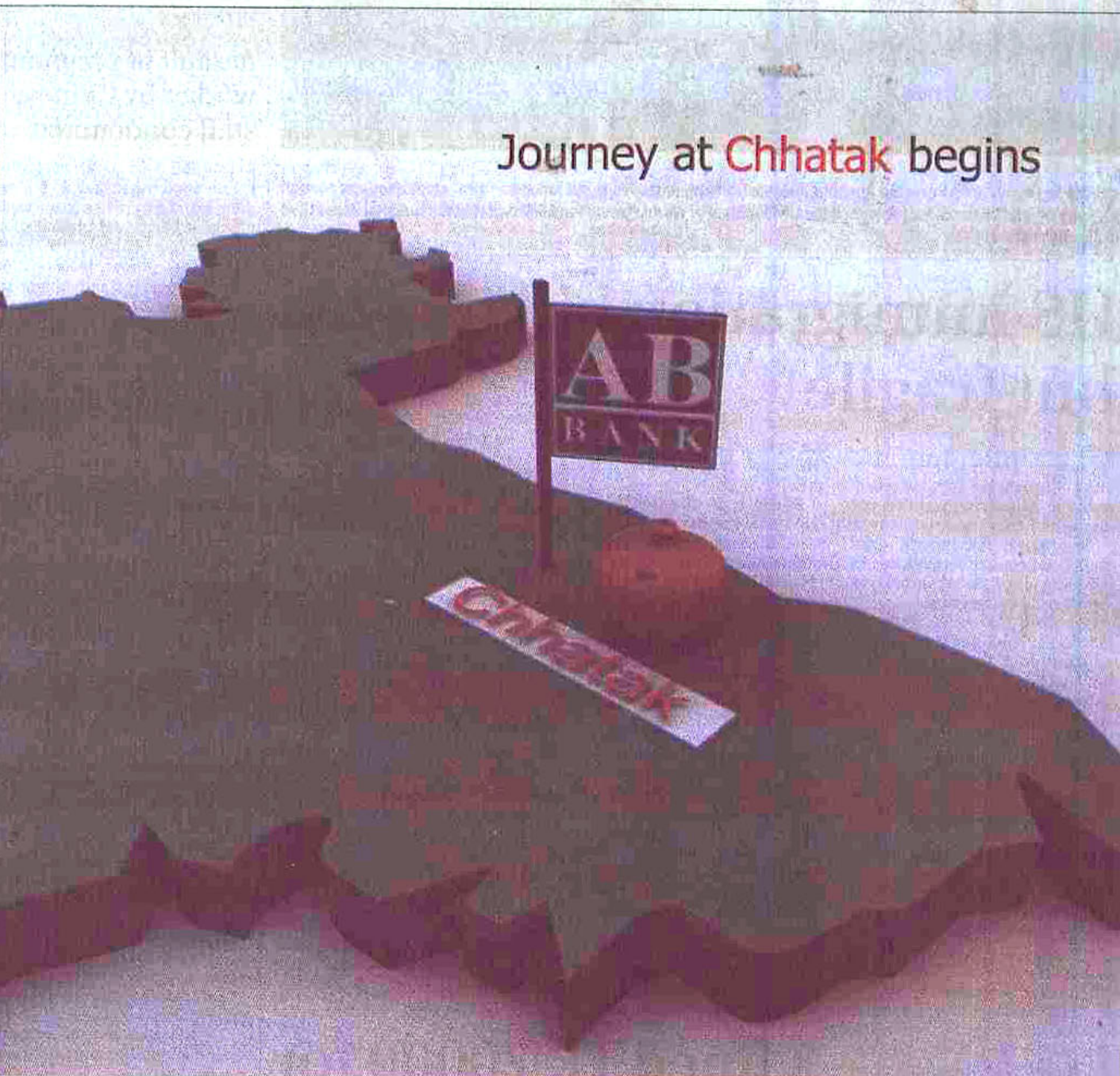
