

Criminal killed in 'shootout'

An alleged criminal was killed in an encounter with Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) in the city's Mirpur area early yesterday.

According to a Rab press release, the dead, Mansur Ahmed alias "cadre Mansur" alias "killer Mansur", 32, was an accused in five cases, including four for murder, pending with different police stations in the city.

A team of Rab-4 raided the Beribandh (circular dam) area adjacent to Botanical Garden in Mirpur at about 2:30am following a tip-off that a gang of criminals gathered there to commit an offence.

Sensing the presence of the Rab men, the gang members opened fire, forcing the law enforcers to retaliate. Mansur received bullets during the gunfight that continued for 15 minutes, while his accomplices managed to flee.

Rab personnel with the help of police, who reached the spot hearing gunshots, rushed the bullet-hit Mansur to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) where the doctors declared him dead.

A revolver and two bullets were recovered from the scene.

No headway in Sayma murder case

The law enforcers investigating the murder of Supreme Court lawyer Advocate Sayma Khanam could not arrest anybody as of yesterday.

A youth believed to have acquaintance with Sayma slit her throat in her drawing room on Tuesday.

The investigators talked to her husband on Wednesday night, but he could not give them any leads. He told the interrogators that he does not suspect anyone.

One of the investigators, preferring anonymity, told The Daily Star that they are not getting full cooperation from Sayma's husband Jahurul Islam, a retired engineer of the PWD.

The police said they have quizzed two domestic helps of Sayma – Mina and Aleya – who were in the house at the time when Sayma was slaughtered. But the two, now on remand, are yet to provide any new information, which could lead the police to arrest the killer.

"We are yet to obtain any useful information," said the investigation officer, Sub-Inspector Shahjahan Ali of New Market Police Station.

Apart from the police, Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) and Criminal Investigation Department are also investigating the murder.

Meanwhile, the police and other

investigators talked to a number of people at the workplace of Sayma to know whether she had enmity with anybody.

Downpour paralyses life in Ctg

Torrential rain in Chittagong yesterday brought city life to a standstill as it left low-lying areas underwater.

The daylong downpour also caused three rivers – Haldia, Sangu and Matamuhuri – in the district to flow over the danger mark, Water Development Board sources said.

Vehicular traffic was severely disrupted on Chittagong-Rangamati

road as it was submerged with waist-deep water at three points under Raozan upazila, added the sources.

Chittagong Deputy Commission-er M Ashraf Shamim told The Daily Star that high water flowing over Chittagong-Cox's Bazar road at Lohagara point since morning has been disrupting traffic.

Patenga Met office recorded 141.6 mm rain in and around the city in 24 hours till 3:00pm yesterday.

The incessant heavy shower that

started on Wednesday at around midnight has inundated almost half of the city, mainly the low-lying areas, with knee to waist-deep water.

The affected areas are Chawk Bazar, Kapashgola, Badurtala, Muradpur, Bahaddarhat, Chandgaon Residential Area, Sholoshahar, Nasirabad, Katalganj, Sholokbahar, Bakalia, Dampara, Prabartak intersection near Chittagong Medical College, Agrabad CDA Area and Halishahar.
