

'159 killed in social violence in August'

A total of 159 people were killed in social violence across the country during the month of August, said a report of The Bangladesh Society For The Enforcement Of Human Rights (BSEHR) yesterday.

The social violence includes

previous enmity, family dispute, land dispute, robbery, snatching and extortion.

Besides, 20 people suffered mysterious death, 15 people were killed by Indian Border Security Force, 13 died due to negligence of the physicians, and six were killed in police and jail custody.

Some 31 women and 26 men committed suicide while four were killed after being raped and 11 killed for dowry.

A total of 11 people were beaten to death by mob while the law enforcers killed nine.

Some 1905 people were mass arrested, 65 journalists were

repressed, 8 received acid burns while bomb blast caused injuries to 15 people.

The report was prepared by the BSEHR on the basis of the stories published in national dailies and its own documentation and research.

Train crash kills 1

Another Lalbagh fire victim dies

One more factory worker who sustained severe burn injuries in a fire at Lalbagh on Sunday succumbed to his injuries at Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) yesterday, raising the death toll to two.

The victim, Md Khokon Mia, 17, was a worker of Lily Chemicals, a glue-making factory.

Four injured workers of the factory were admitted to the DMCH and two of them died.

The other victim, Dulal Hossain, 19, succumbed to his

injuries on Tuesday.

Lily Chemicals, Rupchanda Melamine and a three-storied tin-roofed house burned down in the fire that broke out at Kamalbagh in Lalbagh at around 2:00pm on Sunday.
