

## Govt working on BTV autonomy

The caretaker government is working on how to make the state-run Bangladesh Television (BTV) an effective autonomous body by bringing necessary amendments and adding new provisions to the existing law instead of making a new law.

The council of advisers at a meeting yesterday directed the information ministry to re-examine the existing law -- Bangladesh Television Authority Act (BTA) 2001 -- to reduce government control over BTV as much as possible, meeting sources said.

In the name of giving autonomy to BTV, the law paved the way for more government control over it. But it was not put into effect in the last over six years as the immediate law.

past BNP-led government ignored it. The party's electoral pledge contained autonomy to BTV.

Now, the caretaker government has initiated steps to enforce this law with necessary amendments in line with the recommendations of the commission formed by the Awami League (AL) government in 1996, the sources said.

Earlier, the information adviser had said credibility of BTV and BTV lies in their freedom and autonomy similar to that of BBC.

The council of advisers is yet to decide about autonomy for BTV.

Since the restoration of democratic rule through the mass upsurge in 1990, the three successive governments of BNP and AL in their election manifestos pledged to give autonomy to BTV but did not materialise it. Even during the movement against autocratic Ershad regime, all political alliances and parties had promised autonomy to the state-run electronic media.

### Office timing for Ramadan announced


The Council of Advisers in its weekly meeting yesterday fixed office timing from 9:00am to 3:30pm, with a 15-minute break for Zohr prayers from 1:15pm to 1:30pm, for all government, semi-government, autonomous and semi-autonomous bodies during the month of Ramadan.

The council also decided that emergency service providers like banks, post offices, hospitals, railway, telephone and state-owned mills and factories would fix their working hours during the month in accordance with their own rules considering public interest.

Ramadan office timing for the Supreme Court and all other courts under it will be fixed by the Supreme Court.

Besides rescheduling the office timing, the council thoroughly reviewed a proposal for enforcement of Bangladesh Television

Khaleda couldn't attend party anniversary programme

The BNP observed its 29th founding anniversary yesterday on a limited scale but its Chairperson Khaleda Zia could not visit the grave of party founder late president Ziaur Rahman due to government restrictions on security grounds.

Amid tight security, senior party leaders visited Ziaur Rahman's grave at Chandrima Udayan at Sher-e-Bangla Nagar in the capital to place floral wreaths and offer fateha at about 11:30am. They prayed for salvation of the departed soul of the slain president.

Party Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan, who is working for reforms in the party and Brig Gen (retd) ASM Hannan Shah, loyal to the party chairperson, shook hands before placing floral wreaths.

C'wealth secy gen calls for lifting emergency

Shows concern over violence against students, academics, journos

Commonwealth Secretary General Don McKinnon yesterday reiterated his call to lift the state of emergency and the ban on political activities, and urged the caretaker government to release those detained without charges.

McKinnon also expressed concern over violence against students, academics and journalists saying in a statement, "Freedom of expression is a fundamental political value to which all Commonwealth governments are committed."

He welcomed the announcement by the Election Commission to start a dialogue with political

## Probe body finds no instigative elements in day 1 incidents

The one-member judicial probe committee of Justice Habibur Rahman Khan, formed to investigate the recent violence at Dhaka University, as of yesterday found no instigative element in the first day's incident.

"In the incidents of the first day, the commission so far found nothing that can be termed instigative," Justice Rahman said while talking to reporters at his Circuit House office yesterday adding that he would visit the spots today.

Rahman said no steps were

taken so far to take the statements of the two detained DU professors - Harun or Rashid and Anwar Hossain.

"Tomorrow [today] I will talk to the vice-chancellor and decide on the steps that can be taken," he added.

Rahman said the commission would also talk to the army men, who were in the camp that was garrisoned at the university's gymnasium. "But this will take time as the procedure to produce them before the court is different," he added.
