

2 traders die in road crash

UNB, Savar

Two traders were killed and six others injured in a road accident at Baish Mile on Dhaka-Aricha highway in Savar upazila early yesterday.

One of the victims was identified as Abbas, 45, of Jessore district.

Ashulia police said a goods-laden truck from Jessore turned turtle in the area at about 1:00 am on its way to Dhaka, leaving two traders dead on the spot and six others injured critically.

The bodies were sent to hospital morgue.

It also seized huge quantity of contraband ghee of Taza brand from different shops at the market.

Pregnant woman dies after being kicked

A nine-month pregnant woman was killed after she was kicked by one of her neighbours at Arahazar in the district yesterday morning.

Police recovered the body of Hena Begum, 26, a housewife, and sent to Narayanganj General Hospital for autopsy.

Police said Anwar Hossain and his neighbour Ahmad of Khagkanda area locked horns over felling of a tree. Hena Begum, wife of Anwar, and Johra Begum, wife of Ahmad, also got involved in the quarrel.

At one point, Johra kicked Hena in the belly and the latter fainted at this. Hena died on her way to the hospital.

Disburse salary, DA before Eid

Non-govt teachers urge govt

Teachers of non-government high schools, colleges and madrasas yesterday urged the caretaker government (CG) to take effective measures so that they can receive their salary and dearness allowance before the Eid-ul-Fitr.

Leaders of National Front of Teachers and Employees (NFTE), a platform of eleven organisations of non-government teachers and employees, yesterday said that teachers always face trouble in getting monthly salary and dearness allowance before Eid due to the indifference of the authorities concerned.

They hoped that present CG will take effective steps so that the teachers get salary and dearness allowance in time.

They also said the dearness allowance the gets is only 25 percent of the basic salary, which is not enough, and the government should increase the dearness allowance and other allowances for improving social status of the teachers.

Bangladesh Shikkha-Karmachari Okya Parishad, another platform of non-government teachers and employees, also urged the CG to disburse the salary of the month of October and dearness allowance before Eid.
