CG urged to form constitution reform commission

Samajik Rajnoitik Andolon, a platform for socio-political movement, yesterday urged the caretaker government to form 'constitution reform commission' to bring massive amendments to the constitution in the light of people's desire.

"We believe that the existing constitution is not helpful to meet the desire of people," said Abdul Baten Chowdhury, central coordinator of Samajik Rajnoitik Andolon, at an iftar party at a city hotel.

In a written statement, Baten said continuing the colonial laws is one kind of dependency on the past and therefore massive amendments to the constitution are needed to meet the demands of the present.

He urged the caretaker government to start dialogue with different political parties in this regard.

Baten also urged the Election Commission to invite prominent social organisations to talk about electoral reforms.

Humayun Kabir Hiru and Abdul Malek Ratan were present on the occasion.

## 'Teachings of Gandhi still relevant today'

The teachings of Mahatma Gandhi are still relevant to this era of globalisation when conflicts of various forms have become commonplace, speakers at a discussion said yesterday.

This great man does not belong to only India or Indian sub-continent; he belongs to the entire humanity, they said.

The Liberation War Museum organised the discussion at its auditorium in the city to mark the first International Day of Non-violence, the birthday of Mahatma Gandhi.

Citing examples of Iraq, Afghanistan and other strife-torn countries, Syed Abul Maksud, a researcher on Gandhi's life and works, said that as violence is increasing day by day, people across the world started realising the importance of Gandhi's message of non-violence.

They are now learning from Gandhi's philosophy of non-violence, he added.

Addressing the programme, Indian High Commissioner Pinak Ranjan Chakravarty said Gandhi's teachings are still relevant to the

conflict-ridden world.

"Mahatma Gandhi taught us pluralism and secularism. He was the epitome of truth," he added.

Dr Sarwar Ali, a trustee of the Liberation War Museum, also spoke at the programme.

Polybag materials seized at Gazipur

Gazipur police yesterday seized a truck with raw materials for polythene bags from Rajendrapur area on Monday night.

Being tipped-off, police intercepted the truck loaded with 2024 kilograms of polybag raw materials (polypropylene).

As the driver and helper could not show any legal documents for the materials, police seized the truck and took it to Hotapara Police Station.

Sub-Inspector Mobarak Hossain said the raw materials were discharged from Layson Agroflour Factory at Bhabanipur area.

As these materials are used in producing banned polythene bags, police seized the truck with the materials.

Mizanur Rahman Bhuiyan, in-charge of the factory, said the seized materials were not banned items.

## Myanmar nationals protest killing

Dozens of Myanmar nationals residing in Bangladesh staged a demonstration in front of the Myanmar Embassy in the city yesterday, protesting the "brutal killing" and arrest of monks, nuns and democracy-loving people in Myanmar.

Carrying placards and banners, the protesters shouted slogans against the military junta amidst tight security.

Scores of police were posted at the Embassy to maintain order during the hour-long protest that started at about 11:00am.

The demonstration was organised under the banner of Democratic Forces from Rakhaing State, Burma, representing United Front of Sangha, Rakhaing Women's Union, Independent Force of Arakan, All Arakan Students' and Youths' Congress, Rakhaing Environment and Human Rights Watch, Arakan Community Council and Shwe Gas Movement, Opposition.

Force of Burma, Narinjara News Agency, Shwe Pray Rakhaing News Agency, Gispa News Agency and individuals.

The demonstrators urged Myanmar soldiers not to point their arms at the innocent people and stand beside the peaceful protesters, upholding the responsibility to protect people and the nation.

Their demands include resignation of all Myanmar ambassadors to Bangladesh, Japan, the USA, China, Thailand, Malaysia, India, Singapore, Korea and other countries, sending troops back to barracks, releasing political prisoners, formation of an interim government, compensation by the Myanmar military junta for the killing of monks and general people.


## Prof Selim new chairman of JU government and politics dept
