

## Japan Post, Express in parcel delivery tie-up

Japan Post agreed Friday to merge its parcel delivery operations with those of shipping firm Japan Express in its first business tie-up since the start of postal privatisation.

Japan Post and Japan Express, Japan's largest transportation service company, said in a statement that they plan to set up a joint venture in October next year to combine the operations.

The two companies have yet to decide on their investment ratio for the venture, which will control a combined 19 percent or the third largest of Japan's parcel-delivery market.

They also plan to consider expanding their business tie-up in the future in order to "build a comprehensive and strategic business relationship."

On Monday, Japan Post began its long privatisation process, splitting into four units to handle deliveries, savings, insurance and counter services under a holding company that remains fully government-owned for now.

Together they have some three trillion dollars in savings and life insurance policies, making the group the world's biggest financial institution.

The split is the initial step in a decade-long process that counts as the first major privatisation in Japan since the 1987 breakup of the national railway.

## Vietnam car sales rocket 83 percent

Vietnamese car sales have rocketed 83 percent in the first nine months of the year, manufacturers said on Saturday.

Sales have shot up to 49,240 vehicles against 26,934 in the same period last year, the Vietnamese Automobile Manufacturers' Association (VAMA) said.

Passenger car sales between January and September were reported at 10,882 vehicles, a rise of 145 percent.

The figures were compiled from 16 of VAMA's 18 members. Data were not available for the other two members.

The biggest rise belonged to Japan's Honda which sold 2,729 locally assembled vehicles, up 858 percent from last year's 285.

Next in the list was Vidaemco, a joint venture between South Korean GM Daewoo and a Vietnamese company with a 305 percent rise in sales.

In September alone, VAMA members sold 7,683 units, up by 99 percent against the same month of 2006.

## US unemployment edges up despite new jobs

Fears that the country could slide into a recession eased in September as employers created the most jobs in four months and workers' wages grew solidly. The unemployment rate crept up to 4.7 percent, the highest in over a year but still low by historical standards.

Wall Street breathed a sign of relief and pushed the Dow Jones industrial average up more than 125 points in afternoon trading.

The tally of 110,000 net new jobs generated in September clearly heartened investors and analysts. Yet what they really took comfort in was the revelation that the job market, a main pillar for the economy, didn't crack under the pressure of a painful credit crunch and housing slump in August after all.

The Labor Department's fresh snapshot of employment conditions around the country released

Friday showed that the economy actually created 89,000 jobs in August.

That was a huge and crucial turnaround from the loss of 4,000 jobs the first decline in four years reported a month before. At the time, that news had sent Wall Street into a nosedive, stoked fears the economy was heading toward recession and was seen as cementing the Federal Reserve's decision to lower interest rates.

To be sure, the ill effects of the housing and credit problems have hurt some employers, slowing national job growth this year. But the situation is nowhere near as dire as many were led to believe from the initial August employment report.

"We are on much sounder footing," said Carl Tannenbaum, chief economist at LaSalle Bank. "To be fair, it is clear the pace of monthly job creation has slowed and the

unemployment rate is creeping higher but neither measure is indicative of an imminent recession, which was the scenario on everyone's lips just a month ago."

The main reason behind the turnaround in the August payroll figure? A big gain in government employment, especially in hiring teachers at local schools.

The bump up in the unemployment rate from 4.6 percent in August came as hundreds of thousands of people, perhaps feeling better about their prospects, resumed job searches.

The new rate of 4.7 percent, the highest since the summer of 2006, is still considered low by historical standards.

After the country's last recession, in 2001, the unemployment rate peaked at 6.3 percent. More than two decades ago, for example, civilian unemployment went over 10 percent as the economy suffered through deep downturns.

## China to open 'super' coal mines

Energy-starved China will boost coal output by 400 million tonnes a year by 2010 by streamlining the industry and opening a string of new "super" pits, state media reported Friday.

Widespread closures and mergers will leave fewer than 20 firms, including six to eight new "super coal production enterprises" with a yield of 100 million tonnes each, accounting for more than 50 percent of the country's entire output by 2010, Xinhua news agency said.

China reported a total coal output of more than 2.3 billion tonnes of coal last year.

Small mines that are illegal or inefficient and have given the industry its appalling safety record are already being weeded out, Wang Xianzheng, deputy director of the State Administration of Work Safety, was quoted as saying.

Over the last two years, more than 9,000 small mines have been shut and another 1,000 will close by the end of 2007, Xinhua said.

As part of the streamlining process the country plans to build 10 large strip-mines with a production capacity of 10 million tonnes each and another 10 pits with a yield of 10 million tonnes each, Wang said.

China's coal mines are among the most dangerous in the world, and many of the accidents occur in small, unlicensed mines where safety regulations are widely ignored.

More than 4,700 coal miners died in China last year, according to official figures, but independent labour groups put the real toll at closer to 20,000 annually. They say many accidents never come to light.

## Euro hits 2-week low against dollar

The euro fell on Friday to its lowest level for two weeks against the dollar, after news that the US economy generated 110,000 jobs in September.

The US Labor Department report on nonfarm payrolls, seen as one of the best gauges of economic momentum, also hiked its estimate for August to show a gain of 89,000 jobs, instead of a loss of 4,000 that had stunned analysts.

Following the news, the European single currency sank to 1.4033 dollars -- last seen September 20 -- compared with 1.4140 dollars before hand.

The euro has now shed 1.8 percent in value since striking a historic high point of 1.4283 dollars

on Monday.

The dollar had plunged to the historic trough amid expectations that the US Federal Reserve would continue cutting American interest rates to help shore up a struggling US economy.

"We still believe that a weaker (US) economy will lead to a more severe deterioration in labour market conditions in the coming months, persuading the Fed to cut rates further," said Capital Economics analyst Paul Ashworth.

"But on the basis of today's data the Fed may now opt to wait and see at October's meeting."

Last month, the US central bank had slashed its key rate by half a point to 4.75 percent amid turmoil on world financial markets.
