# Ensure right to food for all

Speakers tell seminar

The World Food Day was observed in the country yesterday with a call for ensuring the right to food for all and eradicating hunger and poverty in the world.

This year the theme was 'The right to food'.

To mark the day, the Bangladesh Agriculture Research Council (BARC) in cooperation with the Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) of the United Nations organised a seminar and a rally in the city.

Adviser for the Ministry of Food and Disaster Management Tapan Chowdhury attended the seminar as the chief guest while Adviser for Agriculture Dr CS Karim was present as special guest.

Agriculture Secretary M Abdul Aziz presided over the seminar.

The seminar called for inventing new technologies for production of high-yielding crops to ensure food security for the growing population of the country.

President Iajuddin Ahmed and Chief Adviser Fakhruddin Ahmed in separate messages urged the government and the non-government organisations to join their hands to enhance the food production in the country to ensure the right to food for the growing population.

President Iajuddin in his message said Bangladesh still could not build food security for its people despite its progress in food production.

Laying importance to strong

'commitment' and 'actions' at the national level to ensure the right to food, Iajuddin called for concerted efforts to achieve the goal.

Fakhruddin in his message referred to the constitutional right of the citizens to get adequate food and said the government is committed to protecting the right.

He said the government has been implementing various programmes to increase food production, reduce inflation, create employment, expand social security nets and ensure food supply up to the marginal level.

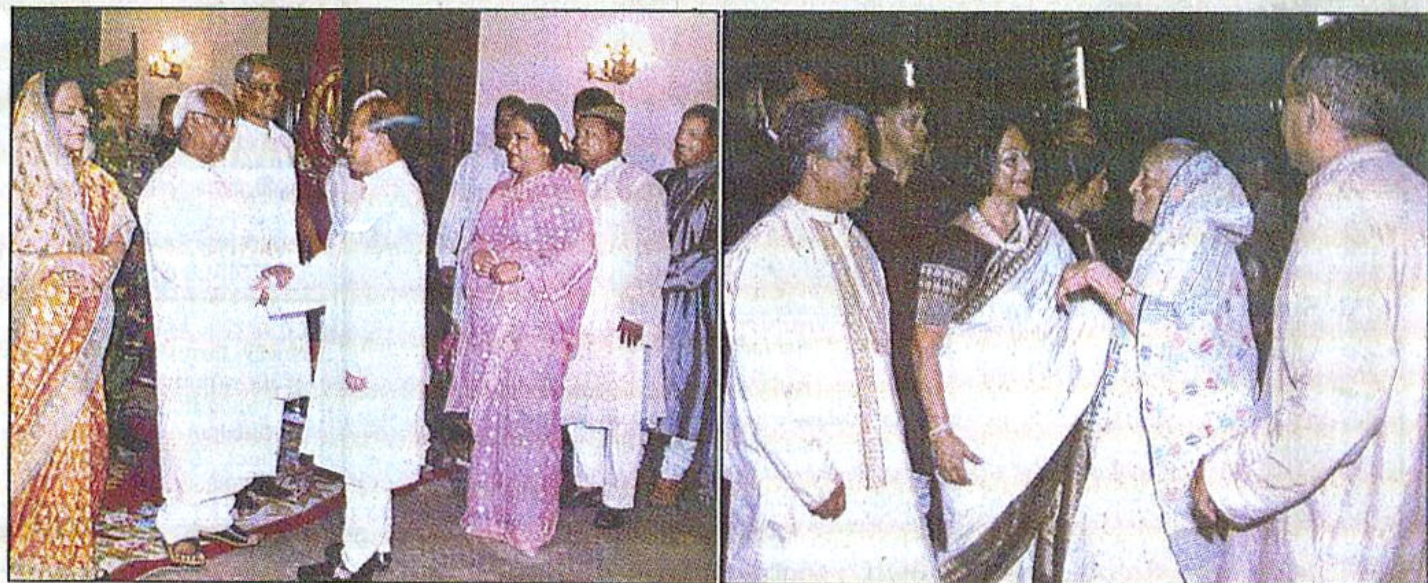
Fakhruddin urged all concerned to ensure agricultural inputs, application of modern technologies and increased investment in the agriculture sector.

The day was also observed in the other member states of the United Nations simultaneously.

UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon in a message said the Day was observed at a time when around 854 million people across the world are suffering from chronic hunger and the figure has been increasing day-by-day.

He expressed deep concern over increase in the number of starving people in the world since beginning of the new millennium. In a world of plenty, this situation is unacceptable, he said.

Ban Ki-moon urged all to put together their efforts in making the 'Right to Food' a reality saying the world has the resources, the knowledge and the tools to make it happen.

## BNP factions blame each other for emergency

Pro-Khaleda faction of BNP blamed the immediate past caretaker government for its failure to run the country according to the constitution and as such the state of emergency was imposed in January.

On the other hand, pro-Bhuiyan faction said only the political leaders are responsible for the situation as the dialogue between BNP and Awami League (AL) to resolve the crises failed due to non-cooperation of two top leaders (Khaleda Zia and Sheikh Hasina).

Blaming the Iajuddin-led caretaker government, BNP Secretary General Khandaker Delwar Hossain yesterday said the then caretaker government failed to act according to the constitution before 1/11.

"Emergency followed not only the violent clashes between the political parties but also the failure of the then caretaker government," he said while talking to the reporters at his NAM flat in the capital, adding that there were many other reasons also behind the imposition of emergency.

When the reporters drew his attention to the fact that the then caretaker chief was the BNP-nominated president, he said a person should be considered

neutral when he is elected as president.

Rejecting the allegation raised by Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan and chairperson's adviser Mofazzal Karim, Delwar said he (Bhuiyan) is trying to blame others for his failure which is not acceptable.

with the AL general secretary for the welfare of the country, but he failed," Delwar said, adding that he should have made the things clear at that time.

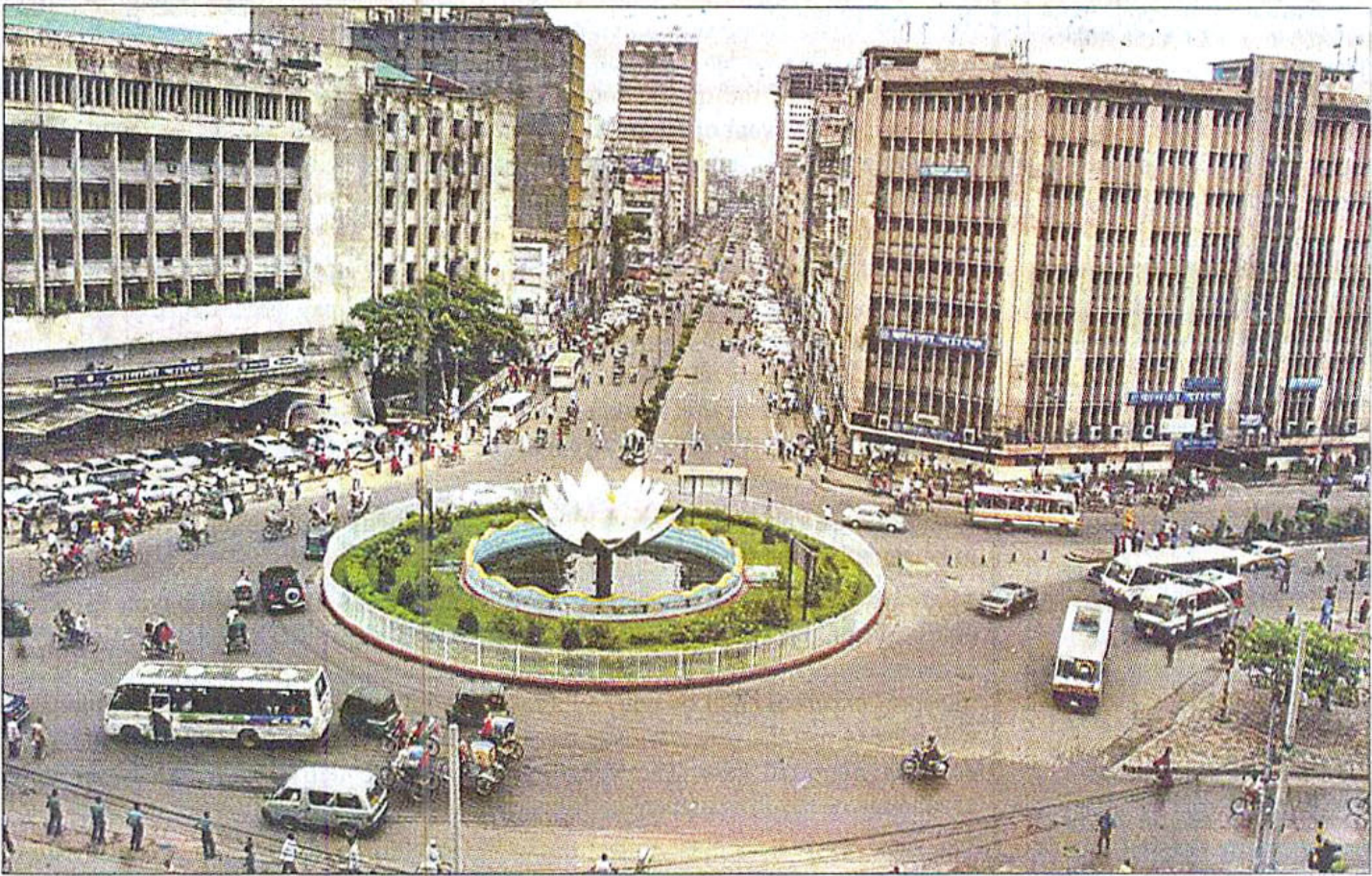
Demanding withdrawal of the state of emergency, he said everyone now wants it, even the foreign diplomats have urged the government for it because it is doubtful whether proper environment for an acceptable election is possible if the emergency continues.

The expelled secretary general of the party Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan had recently alleged that the dialogue between him and AL General Secretary Abdul Jalil did not succeed due to non-cooperation of Khaleda Zia and Sheikh Hasina.

Echoing the same, Mofazzal Karim, an adviser to the party chairperson, yesterday said dialogue had failed, as the two top leaders did not cooperate.

"State of emergency was imposed only due to the failure of the political leaders," he said after meeting Bhuiyan at his Gulshan residence.

"Dialogue might not have failed if the two leaders (Bhuiyan and Jalil) were empowered for taking the decision," he said, adding that Mannan Bhuiyan could not clear the matter to the nation due to lack of proper environment.

## Indian navy ship arrives in Chittagong

The Indian Navy Ship Karmuk commanded by Commander Suraj Berry VSM arrived in Chittagong yesterday on a goodwill visit to Bangladesh.

The visiting ship has 13 officers, 4 under training officers and 143 sailors.

During its stay in Bangladesh, the Commanding Officer of the ship will call on Commodore Commanding Chittagong, Commodore Commanding BN Flotilla and Commodore Superintendent of Dockyard.

The Area Commanders will also pay return call on the Commanding Officer of INS KARMUK on board the ship.

Other activities of the visiting ship include a visit to BNS Shaheed Moazzam, a training complex of Bangladesh Navy at Kaptai.

The ship will also be kept open for visitors from the members of Bangladesh Army, Navy, Air Force, BNCC and Sea Scout.

Earlier, the ship was welcomed by a Bangladesh Naval Ship upon its arrival outside the territorial limit at sea following naval tradition.

Commanding Officer of BNS Isha Khan and official of the Indian High Commission greeted the visiting ship on its arrival at Chittagong harbour.

The ship is expected to leave Chittagong tomorrow for Yangon.

## INT'L DAY FOR ERADICATION OF POVERTY TODAY Call to stand up against poverty, inequality
