Say 3 advisers

The government is yet to take any decision on appointment of consultants with the status of ministers to speed up its activities, three advisers said yesterday.

The issue surfaced once again as army chief Gen Moeen U Ahmed recently said appointment of consultants is being considered to make the caretaker government more dynamic.

Meanwhile, there were speculations that the government might appoint deputy advisers or consultants as only 11 advisers are burdened with the tasks of so many ministries.

According to the EPB data, earnings from the RMG sector have declined by 24 percent on average while frozen foods, the second largest earner of the country, also witnessed a downturn with a decline of 11.55 percent.
