

Int'l tender for 8 rental power plants by Oct 25

The Power Cell under the Ministry of Power will receive international tender by October 25 for setting up eight rental power plants on a first track basis to tackle power crisis in the next summer.

The projects are 50 MW Shahjibazar plant, 50 MW Kumarganj plant and 50 MW Fenchuganj plant in Sylhet, 50 MW Ashuganj plant, 20 MW Bogra plant, 30 MW Bhola plant, 40 MW Khulna plant and 20 MW Bheramara plant.

Of the plants, the 40 MW Khulna and 20 MW Bheramara projects will be liquid fuel-based while the rest will be gas-based. The total capacity of the plants will be about 310 MW.

As per terms and conditions of the projects, the bidders will have to install the plants within four months of signing of the contracts.

The government will purchase

electricity from the plants for the next three years.

The Power Cell, a reform implementation wing of the Power Ministry, will receive the tender as responsible body. Earlier, the Power Cell invited interested international bidders to submit Express of Interest (EoIs).

A total of 17 international firms submitted EoIs to vie for the eight projects.

Three firms from the USA, two from the UK, and one each from Singapore, Ukraine, the UAE, India and Malaysia have submitted EoIs directly. Five local firms submitted their EoIs on behalf of their principals in India, Russia and Ukraine.

Later, the Power Cell issued Request for Proposal (RFP) letter to the 17 firms asking them to submit their respective technical and financial offers.

The industry insiders are, how-

ever, critical of the rental power plant project as they raised questions about the move.

They said these rental power plants might be suicidal for the power sector and hamper the caretaker government's efforts to buy electricity from the captive power plants set up by local entrepreneurs.

They said the tariff of the proposed plants would be relatively higher than that of the land-based power plants.

In 1997, the then government installed three barge-mounted power plants to tackle the power crisis and their tariff was very high, even above Tk 5.30 per unit in some cases.

The Power Development Board (PDB) has to incur a loss of about Tk 1,300 crore a year for purchasing electricity at higher rates from those power plants. This loss will increase if more barge-mounted power plants are installed, they observed.

When the caretaker government has been trying to purchase electricity from the captive power plants installed by local entrepreneurs to serve their industries, the move to install rental power plants may discourage the captive power producers to sell their electricity to the national grid.

The power sector experts said the government could easily get more than 500 MW from the captive plants before the next summer if they allow them to extend their existing capacity by installing some new generation machines.

Earlier, the government had invited tender to install seven rental power plants. But the state-owned Petrobangla refused to supply gas to three of them because of shortage in gas production, forcing three of the plants to roll back.

However, the issue of gas supply to new plants still remains a big question.

Voter listing in Ctg begins today

The field level data collection work for voter listing with photograph and national identity card in 41 wards under Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) will begin today.

A total of 4897 field level data collectors under over 800 supervisors would go door-to-door to conduct the data collection, said the sources in the District Election Office (DEO).

District Election Officer Md Dulal Talukder said they have completed all the preparatory works to start the voter listing.

On this occasion, a colourful rally will be brought out from Zila Parishad premises at around 10:30am. Acting CCC Mayor M Manjur Alam and Deputy Commissioner (DC) Ashraf Shamim are scheduled to lead the rally.

Four non-government organisations under Election Working Group in cooperation with the DEO have already started different awareness programmes, including miking, distributing leaflets and organising view exchange meetings in different wards, sources said.

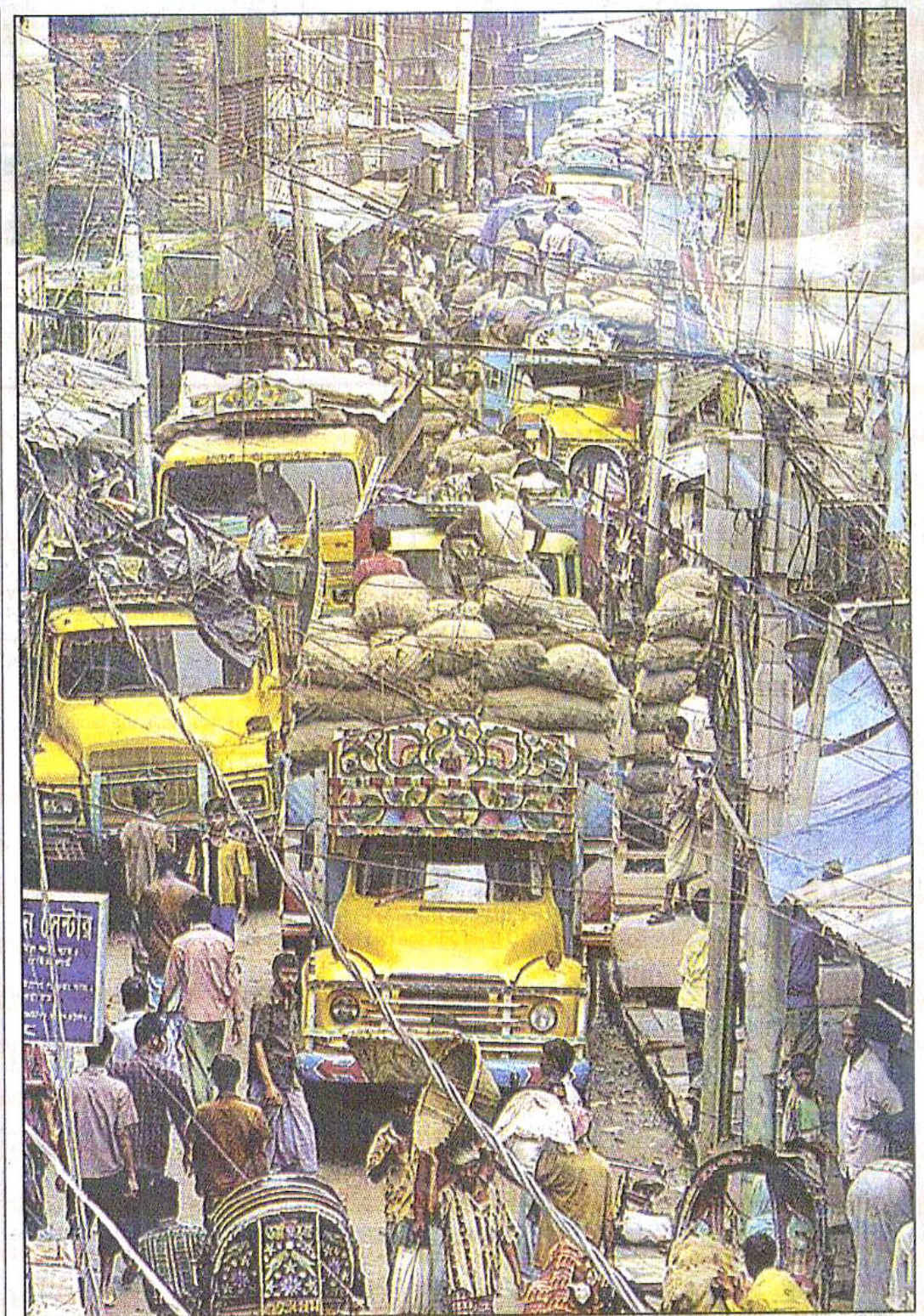
The organisations are Institute for Environment and Development (IED), Fair Election Monitoring Alliance (FEMA), Bangladesh Centre for Development Journalism and Communication (BCDJC) and Khan Foundation.

IED will conduct voter listing at 24 wards in Kotwali, Double Mooring, Bakalia, Pahartali, Panchlaish, Khulshi and Halishahar.

Khan Foundation will run the activities at nine wards under Bandar and Bayezid Police Station, FEMA at five wards located in Kotwali and Double Mooring while BCDJC at two wards in Chandaon and another ward in Panchlaish Police Station.

Special view exchange meetings will be held in each of the wards in participation of Imams, priests and monks while rallies would also be held for creating awareness among the locals, he said.

The data entry and the registration work with digitised photograph are scheduled to begin from November 5, sources said.

SI arrested for taking bribe

Detective police arrested a sub-inspector (SI) with bribe money in the city on Saturday night.

SI Abu Nayeem Mohammad Sabur Khan, 35, was arrested in front of the Shyampur Police Station with Tk 5000 that he allegedly took from one AK Azad alias MA Kalam as bribe to investigate his land-related dispute case.

Azad said the hearing of his petition case was going on at Metropolitan Magistrate's Court that asked the Shyampur Police Station to investigate the matter.

"As Sabur was the investigation officer, he demanded Tk 10000 as bribe after calling me at the police station at around 9:00pm. I gave him Tk 5000 but as he demanded more, I informed the high officials of DB of the matter over telephone," Azad told the reporters, adding, "At the same time I filed an extortion case against the SI with Shyampur Police Station."

DB police came to the police station and picked up Sabur with Tk 5000. Later he was sent to jail through the court.

ASP held for claiming himself as Rab member

Police arrested an assistant superintendent of police (ASP) on Saturday from Kapasia on charges of claiming himself as a Rab (Rapid Action Battalion) member.

Arrested Mujibur Rahman was on leave prior to retirement (LPR) as an ASP a month ago, police said.

Sources said there had been a longstanding conflict over a piece of land between Hasen Ali, a retired army sergeant, and his nephew Anwar Hossain Titu at Chhatrabar village in Tok Union.

Mujibur Rahman, claiming himself as a Rab member, allegedly threatened Hasen.

Later, Hasen informed about

the incident to the Rajendrapur Cantonment and Mujibur was arrested from the local MP check post in Kapasia.

Meanwhile, police arrested two persons on charges of their alleged involvement in Moniruddin killing at Ghorshab village under Ghagria Union on Saturday.

The arrestees are identified as Mohammad Ali, 45, and Kazi Mohammad Monjur Rahman, 24.

Police said a group of 15 to 16 robbers looted valuables from the residence of Moniruddin, 35, at gunpoint on Friday night.

Moniruddin got severely injured while resisting the looters. He succumbed to his injuries at Dhaka Medical College Hospital on Saturday.

Convict arrested in Noakhali

Extremists kill farmer in Pabna

Extremists chopped a farmer to death at Jagannathpur village under Chhatrabar upazila in the district on Saturday night, police said.

The victim was identified as Afzal Hossain, son of Yasin of Jagannathpur village.

A gang of extremists numbering 10 to 12 entered the house of Afzal at 11:00pm and chopped him after failing to find his brother Shahab.

He died on the way to hospital. The body was sent to Pabna General Hospital for autopsy yesterday morning.

Road accidents kill six, injure 55

At least six people were killed and 55 others injured in separate road accidents in Dhaka, Comilla, Sirajganj, Netrakona and Gaibandha yesterday and on Saturday.

UNB reports: A former air force officer was killed in a road accident at Khilkhet near Joar Sahara police box in the city yesterday.

The deceased was identified as Mahbubur Rahman, 40, retired warrant officer of air force and son of Tarafder Ali Zoarder at Manikdi under Cantonment Police Station.

Police said the accident took place at about 3:00pm when a bus from Tangail hit him from behind while he was riding a motorcycle, leaving him dead on the spot.

Mahbub met the tragic end of life while going to his new workplace at 'United Hospital'.

Later, police arrested the bus driver, Shah Alam, along with the vehicle and sent the body to Dhaka Medical College Hospital morgue for autopsy.

A correspondent from Comilla adds: At least two people were killed in a road accident on Dhaka-Chittagong highway in Gintola area in Daudkandi upazila yesterday morning.

The dead were identified as truck driver Valoo Chakma, 32 of Narayanhat village in Faikchhari upazila in Chittagong and Saiful Islam, 20 Tajarvargar village in Daudkandi upazila.

Police said the accident occurred

at about 5:30am when a Chittagong-bound road-laden truck turned upside down as its driver lost control over the steering, leaving two people dead on the spot.

Police sent the bodies to Comilla Medical College Hospital for autopsy. A case was filed with Daudkandi Police Station.

Our correspondent from Sirajganj reports: A pedestrian was crushed under the wheels of a speeding truck on the Dhaka-Bogra highway in Nalka area in Sirajganj yesterday morning.

The victim was identified as Rezaul Karim, 35, of Boaliar Char in Ullapara upazila of the district.

Police and witnesses said the accident took place at around 8:00am when a Bogra-bound speeding truck crushed him while he was crossing the road.

Police sent the body to Sirajganj Sadar Hospital morgue for autopsy. A case was filed with Solongla Police Station.

Our correspondent from Netrakona adds: One person was killed and 30 others injured in separate road accident in Mohonganj and Madan upazila in the district yesterday morning.

Police said one person was killed and 22 others were injured in a road accident on Netrakona-Madan road at Maitam at about 10:00am.

The accident occurred when the driver of a Madan-bound passenger bus from Netrakona lost his control over the steering at Maitam and fell into a roadside ditch, leaving one

Our Correspondent from Gaibandha says: At least one woman was killed and 25 others were injured in separate road accidents in Gobindaganj upazila on Saturday.

Police said a speeding bus hit a housewife identified as Amena Begum, 30, of village Chotomariya in Darbasha union while she was crossing Bogra-Rangpur highway at Kalitola, leaving her dead on the spot.

Meanwhile, a Hill-bound passenger bus fell into a roadside ditch after its driver lost his control over the steering on Gobindaganj-Dinajpur highway at Tarafmanu on Saturday night, injuring 25 people.

Police rushed to the spot, rescued the bus passenger and sent the seriously injured to Gobindaganj Health Complex.

The driver and helper of the bus, however, managed to flee.
