



Batting woes for Barisal, Sylhet

RAJSHAHI-BARISAL

Shahriar Nafees-led Barisal, who stunned Chittagong in the first round game, showed a pathetic batting and were forced to follow-on as only two batsmen managed double figures in their first innings.

Left-handed Nafees, who was fined thirty percent of his match fee for criticizing the umpiring, scored 19 runs and Iftekhar Nayeem added 13.

The carnage started with the run out dismissal of out-of-favour Hannan Sarker and then it was right-arm pacer Forhad, who previously hit 52 off 110 balls with the help of eight fours and six to ensure his side's three batting bonus points, who caused the top order collapse by snaring three wickets.

Off-spinner Nayeem Islam also claimed three wickets for 7 runs in five overs while Sohrawardi Shuvro picked up two for 24 runs.

Earlier, Rajshahi were all out for 301 runs after resuming the day on 187-5. Talha Jubair shattered Mashud's hope in the early morning by removing him for 89.

Forhad and Anisur Rahman's

contribution however gave them a respectable total. Anisur made 32 off 62 deliveries.

SYLHET-DHAKA

Sylhet added more woe to their poor batting in the tournament when they were bundled out for 96 runs in reply to Dhaka's 351.

With the first innings deficit of 255, Sylhet finished the day without any loss in their second innings when only two balls being bowled before stumps were drawn for the day.

Mahabubul Alam piled the misery on Sylhet by destroying the top order returning with figures of 4-14 in 11 overs while Rafique ensured that there would be no resistance from the middle order as he took three wickets for 36 runs.

Experienced Mohammad Sharif gave his young new ball partner Mahabubul perfect support by picking up two wickets.

National wicket keeper Mushfiqur Rahim top scored 36 off 97 balls.

Earlier, Mosharraf Hossain scored 35 off 84 balls and Rafique chipped in with 39 off 55 deliveries that featured six boundaries as Dhaka declared their first innings for 351-9 to ensure maximum four

Legends set HK afire

Cricketing greats Shane Warne, Brian Lara and Glenn McGrath Saturday starred on the opening day of the Hong Kong Sixes -- one of the sport's most colourful tournaments.

They led an All-Stars team competing in a weekend of quick-fire matches with innings of only five-overs-a-side -- a format that demands non-stop boundaries from the batsmen.

The six-a-side event pits nine national teams against the All-Stars, who also fielded Indian super spinner Anil Kumble, England's Geraint Jones and big-hitters Craig McMillan of New Zealand and Heath Streak of Zimbabwe.

After Saturday's group matches, all 10 teams remain in the running to lift the trophy, with England, New Zealand and Bangladesh tipped to provide the toughest challenge to the dominant All-Stars.

McMillan -- who hit the most sixes at the recent Twenty20 world championships -- and Streak were the top performers with crunching innings against Australia, Bangladesh and South Africa as the All-Stars cruised to three easy wins.

Against Bangladesh the All-Stars scored a bruising 120 runs, for one wicket in their five overs.

Under the Sixes' unique rules, batsmen retire when they pass 31 and the whole team must bowl an over each, except for the wicketkeeper.

The packed crowd was kept on its toes as balls repeatedly crashed into the stands at the tiny Kowloon Cricket Club, set amid Hong Kong's skyscrapers.

Dravid dropped

The Bangladesh cricket team is likely to play one more three-day game during their tour of New Zealand in December-January.

As per the earlier fixture, the Tigers are scheduled to play a three-day warm-up game and a limited-overs practice match against Northern Districts but Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) asked their New Zealand counterparts to add another three-dayer.

"It is yet to be confirmed but hopefully it will be okay within a couple of days. We have expressed our desire to play one more three-day game to give our players enough opportunities to acclimate with the tough New Zealand conditions," informed Ahmed Sajadul Islam Bobby, chairman of the BCB's media committee.

In that case Bangladesh will leave Dhaka for New Zealand on December 9 instead of 14.

The Tigers will play three one-day internationals and two Tests in their second visit to the country.

"Dravid has been given a break. He is a great player and I am sure he will make a comeback very soon," Vengsarkar told reporters.



Poor showing by Bangladesh

Bangladesh played three games but managed only one win against Australia on the opening day of the Hong Kong Cricket Sixes tournament at the Kowloon Cricket Club yesterday.

The Tigers made a winning start with a three-wicket victory over Australia. Afzal Ahmed smashed 35 as Bangladesh scored 68 for three in 34 overs while chasing 64.

In the second match Zunaid, who added 10 runs in the first game, hit 35 and Afzal added 17 but it was not good enough to chase down South Africa's 115 for one in 5 overs. Bangladesh were restricted to 76-3 to suffer a 39-run defeat.

Bangladesh lost their third game against the All Stars by 45 runs when they managed only 75 runs for two wickets in reply to 120-1 with Dollar Mahmud making 31.

Ashraful managed 0 & 4 in the first two games.

Bangladesh finished third in the Sixes group and now will play against the loser of the match between Pakistan and Hong Kong today and a win will ensure their quarterfinal berth.

Bangladesh team will return tomorrow.

Bangladesh take on Tajikistan today

With the threat of intense cold Bangladesh football team take on Tajikistan in their away match of the 2010 World Cup pre-qualifiers at the Dushanbe Stadium today.

Bangladesh, who played to a 1-1 draw against them in their home match in Dhaka on October 8, need at least a 2-2 draw in the away match to progress to the next round.

Bangladesh so far played four matches against Tajikistan managing only one draw as they suffered identical 0-2 goals defeat in the prior home and away basis Pre World Cup qualifier matches and conceded a humiliating 1-6 goals defeat in the AFC Challenge Cup in Dushanbe last year.

An 18-member Bangladesh team reached Tajik capital Dushanbe on Thursday night.

Shoaib earns Pak recall

Controversial paceman Shoaib Akhtar earned a recall for next month's five-match one-day series against India after ending a lengthy ban, Pakistan's chief selector announced here on Friday.

"We have chosen a 16-man squad which will be led by Shoaib Malak and Akhtar is included in the squad after he proved his fitness and completed his ban," Salahuddin Ahmed told reporters.

The paceman was banned for 13 international matches and fined 3.4 million rupees (56,000 dollars) for breaches of code of conduct, primarily for hitting a teammate with a bat.

He struck fellow fast bowler

Mohammad Asif on the thigh after a team practice in Johannesburg ahead of the inaugural ICC World Twenty20 Championship last month.

Ahmed said a fit and in-form Akhtar is an asset for Pakistan.

"We know that Akhtar, if fit and in form, is an asset for the team and we hope that he does well in the series against India," said Ahmed of the paceman who bowled 17 overs in a side match last week to earn a recall.

Akhtar will complete the ban and is set to play in the last one-dayer against South Africa in Lahore on October 29 -- his first match for Pakistan since playing in the Port Elizabeth Test in January this year.

He played the last of his 133 one-day internationals against England in September last year. He has also

played 43 Tests.

The maverick 32-year-old paceman was also involved in a doping scandal last year. He and fellow paceman Mohammad Asif tested positive for banned steroid nandrolone and were expelled from Pakistan's Champions Trophy team for India.

Akhtar was banned for two years and Asif for one year. However, the two were lifted on appeal.

Akhtar's career has also been plagued by injuries. He missed Pakistan's last tour of India in 2005 due to knee and ankle problems.

Pakistan beat India 4-2 in the one-day series and squared the three-Test series 1-1 two years ago.

"A new vice-captain will be announced before the team leaves for India," said Ahmed. Salman Butt was Malak's deputy since last
