

Launch mass awareness to check high incidence of heart diseases

President urges cardiologists

UNB, Dhaka

President Iajuddin Ahmed yesterday urged the cardiologists and cardiac surgeons to launch mass public awareness programmes to check high incidence of heart diseases in the country.

"Every year, the number of deaths are alarmingly increasing due to cardiovascular diseases," the president said at the inaugural session of the 2nd International Conference on Updates on Management in Cardiology & Cardiac Surgery at Sheraton Hotel.

Organised by Lab Aid Cardiac Hospital, the function was also addressed by Health Adviser Maj Gen (Retd) Dr ASM Matiuir Rahman, Managing Director of Lab Aid Cardiac Hospital Dr AM Shamim and its chairman Prof Dr M Jajuddin.

As the treatment of cardiovascular diseases are very expensive and

most of the people of the country cannot afford the expenses, Iajuddin called for enhancing

research works on this particular issue to bring down the death rate caused by cardiovascular diseases.

He said South Asian countries are likely to be affected badly by increasing trend of cardiovascular diseases.

The president said modern medical sciences have discovered many new tools both for diagnosis and treatment of heart diseases as well as new pharmaceutical agents are being developed for treatment of heart diseases.

"As such drugs and technologies are essential, similarly information about the causes and preventive measures of these dreadful diseases are equally vital in battle against them," he said.

President emphasised on giving recognition to prevention of cardiovascular diseases as part of the strategy of primary health care for the betterment of the people of this region.

He hoped that cardiologists and cardiac surgeon would be able to explore new direction, scientific stimulation and positive reinforcement of newer ideas and information through the conference.

The president said, "You are involved in a noble profession and you have ample opportunities to serve the mankind," he said adding that people seek your service at the time of their critical moment when they stay in between life and death.

He noted that the patient and his family deserve doctors' precious advice and care at the very crucial moment. He hoped that the physicians would respond instantly to serve the patients.

The president urged all to come forward imbued with the sense of obligation and responsibility for the wellbeing of the have-nots section of the society.

Memo to UN secy general for punishment to war criminals

Bangladeshi expatriates in the United States (US) staged a demonstration in front of the United Nations (UN) headquarters on Thursday demanding punishment to war criminals of 1971, says a report of NewsWorld.

The demonstrators also announced a worldwide programme of forming human chain on December 15 to press home their demand.

They submitted a memorandum to UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon urging him to help bring the culprits to justice.

The memorandum mentioned that millions of people were killed and women raped due to collaboration of Jamaat-e-Islami with the Pakistani occupation forces in 1971.

The demonstration was arranged under the banner of Federation of Organisations Against Bangladesh War Criminals, a combined platform of Awami League and Juba League in the US, Ghatak-Dalal Nirmul National Coordination Committee (GNCC), Hindu-Buddha-Christian Oikya Parishad and Udhichi.

Chanting slogans against Jamaat and its student front Islami Chhatra Shibir the demonstrators also demanded a ban on religion-based politics.

The speakers urged the pro-liberation forces to spread out the movement against the war criminals across the world.

15 deer hides, 1296 Zarda containers seized at ZIA

Later, customs officials took the luggage to the Customs hall room and opened them only to find the deer hides and containers of Zarda. Investigation has been going on to find out who brought the suitcases to the airport and what was their destination, the officials told The Daily Star last night.

'Form groups of edn volunteers to reduce drop-out rate'

Engaging education volunteers in teaching students after school hours in each locality, especially in the poverty-stricken rural areas, would help reduce the drop-out rate among schoolchildren to zero, speakers at a seminar said yesterday.

As the teacher to student ratio in public schools is 1:61, the teachers find it difficult to pay attention to each student and help them complete their task in the class, they said.

On the other hand, the parents who are illiterate could not help their children do their homework, resulting in the students being reprimanded by teachers. These students gradually lose interest in going to school and finally drop out of schools, they added.

To discourage students from dropping out of schools, groups of education volunteers should be formed in each locality, the speakers said highlighting the success of such a programme of Centre for Development Innovation and Practices.

The University of Manchester Alumni Association, Bangladesh (UMAAB) in association with the Centre for Development Innovation and Practices organised the seminar titled 'School dropout and its remedies in rural areas' at the National Press Club in the city.

Taslima Nasreen withdraws controversial lines from her book

Bangladeshi writer Taslima Nasreen, who was hounded into hiding by hardline Islamists, said yesterday she will remove a passage from an autobiography which some Indian Muslim groups found offensive.

Nasreen, who had been living in Kolkata since 2004, said she hoped the move would enable her to live in peace in India.

"I am withdrawing the controversial lines from my book Dwikhandito (split into two)," she told NDTV news channel.

"The book was written in 2002 based on my memories of Bangladesh in the 1980s," she said.

She was accused of hurting religious feelings and the book was banned in Bangladesh and India's West Bengal state.

"I didn't write the book to hurt anybody's sentiments," the 45-year-old said without giving details of exactly what the passage mentions.

"Some people claim that sentiments have been hurt. It was not intended. I hope there will be no controversy anymore and I will be able to live peacefully in India."

The federal government has pledged to protect Nasreen and moved her to a safe house outside New Delhi at the weekend after thousands of Muslims took to the streets in her adopted home Kolkata demanding her expulsion.

Youngone provides medical care, relief for cyclone victims

Its medical teams also treated about 250 people and gave them medicines.

Youngone has set up a temporary medical camp and relief camp at Subidkhali Model Government Primary School field at Chorkhali.

In last few days, it distributed Khichuri among around 12,000 people, sari and lungi among 3000 people at Chorkhali, Golkhali, Tokhkhali, Chorka and Monohordi in Patuakhali and at Saint Alfred High School in Bakerganj, Barisal.
