

Orchards replacing shrubs in the hill districts

A good trend is marked in Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT). Orchards are replacing shrubs on hills and slopes.

This will benefit the area doubly by affluence to the people and stop soil erosion that damages the ecology, which brings disaster at times.

In last several years, at least 6,000 gardens of fruits, medicinal plants and timber have been raised by private individuals on hitherto barren and fellow lands.

Besides adding to the beauty of the hills, this has created sanctuaries for wildlife, particularly birds.

At least 170 types of wildlife including birds now get their safe habitat, environmentalists said.

Agriculture Extension Department officials said this has been possible due to initiative and

campaign by AED and forest department and cooperation of hill people both Bangalee and tribesmen.

The CHT peace accord signed in 1997 during Awami League government contributed greatly to it as it helped maintain peace in the hills, AED officials said.

Chittagong Hill Tracts Development Board and three hill district councils also provided assistance in this regard, they said.

According to Khagrachhari AED, about 2550 personal forests, fruit orchards and medicinal gardens were established in the district in last 10 years. Their number is 2009 in Rangamati and 1789 in Bandarban, they said.

Some seven lakh people are benefited directly or indirectly from the gardens.

But one thing is still unresolved. There is no storage or processing

facility in the CHT. A good portion of the produce rot for lack of these facilities, they said.

Fruits produced in the area could earn foreign exchange if these facilities could be created.

Earlier, Jumm farmers used to clear shrubs and forests and till the lands, which cause massive soil erosion. Raising gardens and forests has stopped this.

Tusar Bashu in Betchhari in Dighinala upazila in Khagrachhari said, he has 102 varieties of fruits and medicinal trees on his 17-acre garden raised in 2004.

A National Awarded winner, Tusar said he is getting fruits from his garden, which is worth about Tk one crore now. Many others in the area are now following him, he said.

Col (ret) Nurunnabi, said he has a vast orchard and timber forest in Manikchhari under Khagrachhari district, which is worth at least Tk 50 lakh.

Another national award winner, Humaun Kabir said he is very happy that his Sukhi Nilganj garden now draws visitors.

It is a wonderful feeling when I see birds chirping in the garden.

Deputy Director of Rangamati AED Laich Uddin said besides benefiting the owners, the gardens and orchards have stopped soil erosion in those areas.

Divisional Forest Officer (DFO) in Bandarban Abdul Mabud said the gardens help protect the biodiversity of the hills.

Deputy Director of Khagrachhari AED TM Monjurul Islam said it is high time to set up cold storage or fruits processing plants so that the people can benefit more.

District Council Chairman Monindra Lal Tripura said over phone that steps should be taken right now to set up storage and processing facilities to retain people's interest in raising orchards.

Dhaka-Saidpur direct train service opens

With the inauguration of intercity train 'Nilsagar Express' on Saturday, direct rail communication between Nilphamari district and capital Dhaka has been established, bringing good prospect of development, especially for the munga-affected north districts of the country.

The commander of 222 Brigade, Brig Gen Jamil Ahmed Khan, and the general manager of Western Zone of Bangladesh Railway (BR), AKM Mushfiqur Rahman, jointly inaugurated the journey of the train.

Nilphamari Deputy Commissioner Khondokar Mokhesur Rahman, high officials of BR Western Zone and high civil and military officials attended the ceremony, among others.

Equipped with nine modern and luxurious coaches imported from Indonesia, 'Nilsagar Express' will run on the broad gauge line between Saidpur Railway Station and Dhaka Cantonment station.

There is plan to extend the train route to bordering Chilahati station, Divisional Superintendent of Saidpur railway workshop Ifukhar Hossain said.

BSF kills 47 on southwestern borders in 11 months

150 injured, 80 abducted

Indian Border Security Force (BSF) killed 47 Bangladeshis on southwestern (SW) borders in eleven months since January.

Over 150 others were injured by BSF during the period on Jessore, Kushtia, Meherpur, Chuadanga, Jhenidah and Sathkhira borders.

BSF also abducted at least 80 Bangladeshis during the period. At least 50 of them are in Indian jails and the rest were handed over to Bangladesh Rifles (BDR) after flag meetings. At least 70 incidents of exchange of fire between the two border guards took place on SW borders during the period.

Last year, 74 Bangladeshis were killed and around 60 abducted by BSF in the area.

The latest incident of killing took place in Sathkhira on Saturday in which cattle trader Liton, 30, was shot dead on Kushtia border in Sadar upazila.

On previous Monday, cattle trader Rafiqul Islam was shot dead on Amudhia border in Sathkhira Sadar upazila.

BDR said BSF men opened fire

about 500 yards inside Indian territory about 4:30am when Rafiqul and some other cattle traders were returning to Bangladesh with cattle.

On Friday and Saturday last, Indian border guards gunned down five Bangladeshis cattle traders on Benapole border in Jessore.

According to sources in BDR, police and newspaper reports, seven Bangladeshis were killed in January, one in February, five in March, three in April, four in May, six in June, three each in July and August, four each in September and October and six in last 27 days of the current month.

At least 18 of the victims were cattle traders.

Of the total, 22 were killed on Sathkhira and Benapole borders.

Incidents of killings and abduction continued though BSF at high profile meetings agreed not to fire on Bangladeshis without provocation. BDR and BSF signed several agreements to maintain peace on borders and resolve 'major disputes through discussion', BDR sources said.

"But BSF continued killing

Bangladeshis," a high official of BDR in southwestern region told this correspondent seeking anonymity.

This correspondent visited different border areas in the region recently and talked to local people. They said BSF has created a panic on the border. Even farmers are afraid of going to their lands close to border.

"BSF picked up my son Habib when he was working on our field on October 26. He is now Indian jail," farmer Abu Bakar of Terail border in Chuadanga said.

The last daylong sector commander level meeting between the two border guards was held at Mirpur in Kushtia on July 4 where the two sides discussed issues including killing of Bangladeshis nationals by BSF smuggling of explosives, firearms and drugs from India, sheltering miscreants and other border crimes.

"We always urge them to show tolerance on issues, particularly involving innocent civilians," Lt Col NM Noor Islam, BDR Sector Commander in Kushtia told this correspondent over phone.

Reopen Saidpur-Dhaka air route to boost trade

Businesses in northern districts demand

Business circles in greater Rangpur and Dinajpur have demanded reopening Saidpur-Dhaka air route to boost investment in the area, particularly in the Uttara Export Processing Zone in Nilphamari. There are around Tk 1,400 crore local and foreign investment proposals in the EPZ, but the investors are shy because of lack of regular and quick communication between the industrial area and the capital and gas supply, top officials of the EPZ told this correspondent recently.

At least 30 big business houses are eager to invest in the EPZ but they are not coming forth due to the problems, they said.

The officials said the investors are interested because of lower rent and other charges in the EPZ and availability of cheap labour in the area. Investments in the EPZ could easily create at least 50,000 jobs in the munga prone area, they said.

They said they appealed to the authorities for resumption of the air link as soon as possible.

Similar appeal was also made by Syedpur Traders Association, sources said.

Besides investments in the EPZ,

the air route would boost businesses through Burimari, Banglabandha and Hill land ports.

Situated halfway between Rangpur and Dinajpur, Saidpur airport is within a short distance from Nilphamari EPZ, Boropukuria coalmine and Madhyapara hard rock project in Dinajpur, tea gardens in Panchagarh, Teesta Barrage at Dalia and Saidpur railway workshop.

Tourist spots like Kantoji temple, Dinajpur museum and Tentulia tea garden's magnificent landscape are also in the area airport.

Bangladesh Biman authorities stopped service on the route on February 19 this year on the ground of loss due to shortage of passengers.

President of Nilphamari Chamber of Commerce and Industry Sohail Parvez told this correspondent that chambers of eight northern districts in greater Rangpur and Dinajpur including Nilphamari sent letters to the ministry concerned to reopen the air route.

They also sought intervention of high-ups in the government in this regard. Businessmen doing export-

import through Burimari, Banglabandha and Hill land ports like to use Saidpur-Dhaka air route for a safe, quick and comfortable journey, said Shamsuzzaman Shamu, president of Exporters and Importers Association of Greater Rangpur and Dinajpur.

Saidpur Airport Manager Sadhon Kumar Mohanta told this correspondent that an executive of Hong Kong-based Uttara Sweater Manufacturing Company at Uttara EPZ recently told him that their foreign buyers are unwilling to come to the EPZ due to absence air route.

Druk, national airline of Bhutan, and Air India during their operation on Dhaka-Thimphu and Kolkata-Kunch Bihar routes, used the VOR (very high frequency omnidirectional range) signal system of Saidpur airport, he said. Nineteen officials and employees are idle at the airport now, the manager said.

Earlier, F-28 and ATP planes flew seven days a week on the route with full capacity. After opening of Jamuna bridge, Biman's flight frequency was gradually reduced and finally suspended on February 19.

Scrap CHT peace accord, Samo Adhiker demands

Parbatya Chattagram Samo Adhiker Andolon (PCSAA) yesterday submitted a memorandum to the chief adviser through the Khagrachhari deputy commissioner demanding cancellation of 1997 Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT) peace accord.

The accord was signed between the government and Parbatya Chattagram Jana Sanghaty Samity (PCJSS) President Santu Lama.

Santu Lama has no right to sign papers of peace accord on behalf of CHT people, the PCSAA leaders said in the memorandum signed by Dousta Muhammad Chowdhury.

Terming the treaty 'discriminatory, partial and unequal' for Bangla speaking people, they said it should be cancelled considering the greater interest of CHT people.

Later at a press conference at their office in Khagrachhari town, the PCSAA leaders said indigenous Santals living in different areas in Chittagong Hill Tracts are not getting any benefit from CHT peace accord.

District Samo Adhiker Andolon leaders Mohammad Shahaz Uddin, Nuruzzaman, Joyal Abedin, Nurunnabi Chowdhury, Abul Kashem, Anwar Hossen, Abdul Momem and over 100 representatives from eight upazilas were present at the press conference.

Trial of war criminals is nation's demand

They are FIR-named accused in several criminal cases, the press release said.

Harijan children are the worst victims of social deprivation as they are not allowed in all educational institutions.

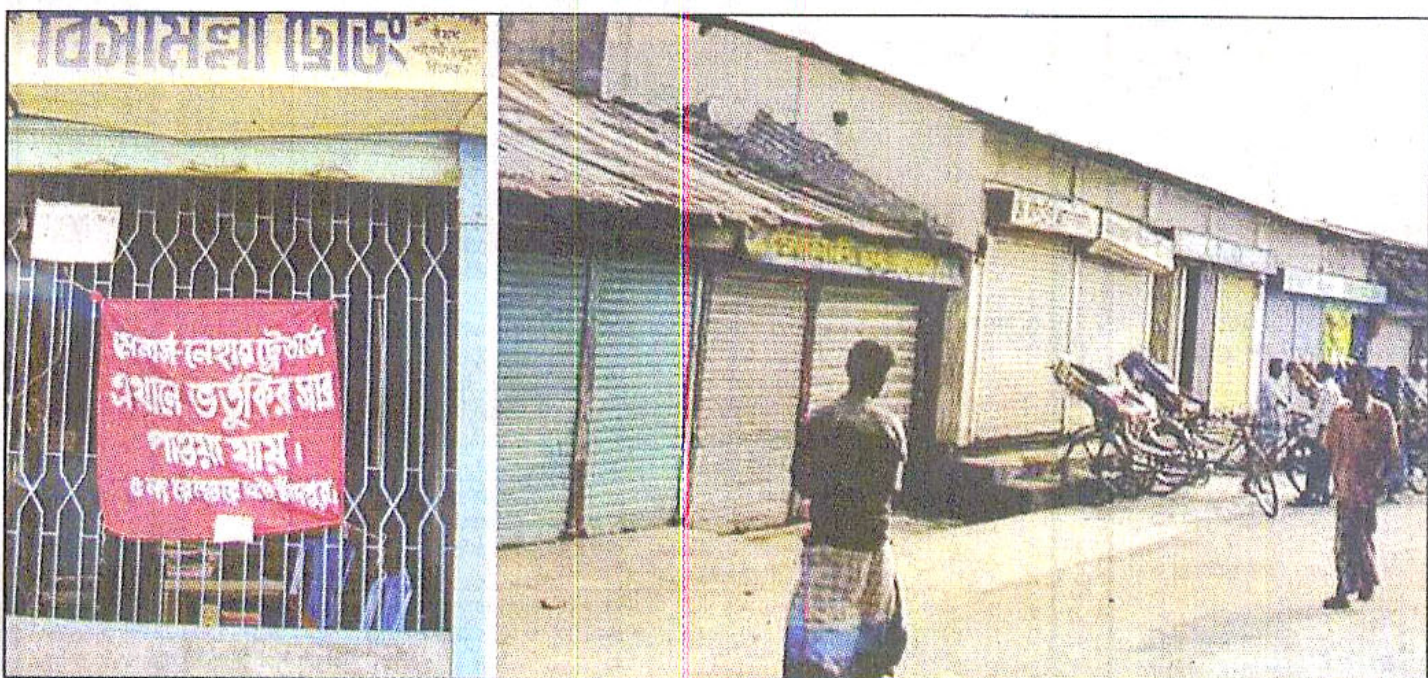
