

# No work at SCC office for second day

## Acting mayor meets LGRD adviser in Dhaka

An uneasy calm prevailed at Sylhet City Corporation (SCC) office yesterday, a day after dismissal of 431 employees by LGRD ministry. There was no work at the office for the second day.

However, SCC authorities asked 257 of the 431 people to continue work until further instruction to maintain essential services like electricity, water supply, conservancy and health and sanitation, sources said.

But employees in other departments at the SCC office did not work yesterday. Officials could not use their official vehicles as drivers except those in conservancy section did not join duty.

A police contingent deployed at the SCC building premises on Monday remained on duty.

SCC secretary Harun Ur Rashid told The Daily Star yesterday afternoon, "We asked employees and officials in essential service departments to continue work so that

civic life is not hampered. "However, employees in other departments did not work for the second day", he said.

Meanwhile, a 3-member team led by acting mayor Azam Khan met the LGRD advisor at his office in the capital yesterday and discussed the situation following dismissal of the employees. The two others were ward commissioners Azizul Haque Manik and Mohammad Shahjahan.

They informed the advisor that approval of the SCC organogram remained pending for years though Sylhet Pourashava was upgraded to a city corporation in 2002.

Details of the meeting could not be known immediately.

An investigation in November this year done by a committee led by the Additional Divisional Commissioner of Sylhet termed appointment of 431 staff 'unapproved and illegal'.

Though Sylhet division was formed in 1994, the divisional headquarters--the then Sylhet

Pourashava--was upgraded to city corporation in 2002. With formation of city corporation and expansion of its area, it needed more manpower.

To meet the demand, SCC made some temporary appointments in posts of 4th class employees like cleaner, electrician, helper and peon on master roll (no work no payment) basis. However, one class-I and some class-II and class-III employees were also recruited.

Taking the advantage, a section of SCC officials recruited as many as 431 people on master roll during 2003-2005, many of them allegedly in exchange of money, sources said.

After promulgation of emergency, law enforcers caught the chief engineer, an executive engineer and some ward commissioners for their alleged complicity in the illegal appointments.

During quizzing, they confessed many 'unfair deals' including alleged realisation of money in appointments. They told the interrogators that a group had earned huge amounts of money from many master roll employees, promising regularisation of their services.

But nothing could be done as the local government ministry did not approve the appointments.

As the matter went to the knowledge of LGRD ministry, it moved to cancel the appointments in June. Acting mayor Azam Khan then appealed to the ministry saying all services by the city corporation will collapse if 431 employees out of 581 are sacked.

The ministry took a lenient view and kept things suspended till formation of a probe team.

## Dinajpur FFs demand trial of war criminals

About 500 freedom fighters and their families attended the meeting, presided over by Md. Monsur Ali Sarker. Dinajpur Puroshova chairman Md. Shafiqul Haque Chhutu attended the meeting as chief guest while District Commander of Freedom Fighters Md. Mokhsed Ali Mongolia was the special guest.

Speakers at the meeting also demanded enhancement of FF's monthly allowance from Tk 500 now.

Later the freedom fighters, carrying banners and flags, took out a procession in the town.

## Two bombs recovered in Jhenidah

## Give top priority to farm loans in time BB governor asks bankers

Bangladesh Bank governor Dr Salehuddin Ahmed yesterday asked officials of nationalised and private commercial banks to complete disbursement of loans to farmers in Sider-hit areas on priority basis by January next year.

Any irregularity and malpractice in loan disbursement will be severely dealt with, he said.

"We are committed to provide necessary financial support to restore economic activities crippled by the November 15 cyclonic, he told bankers at a view-exchange meeting held at the conference room of the central bank's Khulna office. It was presided over by BB's general manager in Khulna Sarder Mohammad Shahjahan.

Executive Director of the central bank Khandaker Mazharul Huq also accompanied the governor and was present in the meeting.

Dr Salehuddin Ahmed said agriculture being the vital part of country's economy must be geared up by providing loans to farmers, particularly in Sider-hit areas.

The loans must be provided at

the right time. Otherwise, the entire economy of the country would face a challenge, he said.

The central bank governor said he has asked bankers to give loans to farmers, fishermen, and small and medium level businessmen.

Price spiral of essential commodities can not be checked if we fail to rejuvenate the agriculture sector once again, the governor said.

"It is not the proper time to judge who is loan defaulter in cyclone-hit areas. It is the time to provide easy-term loans to farmers and fishermen", he said.

The government has set the loan disbursement target at Tk 1300 crore in cyclone-hit areas and Tk 300 crore of it has so far been disbursed, he told the meeting. Untimely loan disbursement will be of no use, he added.

Dr Salehuddin Ahmed expressed his displeasure at failure of private banks to give loans to farmers in affected areas though they were supposed to do so.

"I will call a meeting of private bankers soon to discuss the matter", he said.

## Time to rebuild democracy, establish good governance CEC says in Rangamati

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) Dr. Md. Shamsul Huda yesterday said it is time to 'rebuild democracy' and establish good governance in the country through holding a free, fair and credible national election.

He urged people to elect honest candidates keeping national and local interests in mind.

A correct voter list and issuance of national ID cards is the first prerequisite to hold a free and fair election. Though it is Election Commission's responsibility, accomplishment of the great job needs all out cooperation of all sections of people, he said.

Every citizen has to come forward with sincerity and integrity to complete the great job, Shamsul Huda said at view-exchange meet-

ing at Rangamati Tribal Culture Institute auditorium.

Referring to politics in the recent past, he said Bangladesh's image was tainted due to corruption by a section of political leaders.

"Black money holders by using muscle power dominated politics in the past. A correct voter list and judicious franchise will allow honest people to come to politics in future", the CEC said.

He said the number of voters may decrease in many areas as registration of fake voters will be strictly dealt with.

"At least we have to start a good culture, even if we can not complete the whole task".

Even electoral laws could be amended to prevent dishonest people from joining the polls race, he said.

Terming the CHT a 'special region', Shamsul Huda urged all to give suggestions and inform EC in case of any problem. "The EC will consider things as much as possible".

Polling centres in inaccessible areas in CHT will be increased and they may be even relocated at suitable places, the CEC said.

Election Commissioner Brig (rtd) M Shakhawat Hossain was special guest at the meeting, addressed by, among others, CHT Regional Council Chairman Santu Larma, Rangamati Brigade Commander Col. Mostafa Ahmed Sakib psc, Rangamati Hill District Council Chairman Jagat Jyoti Chakma, Police Superintendent Abdul Baten and Poursabha chairman Habibur Rahman. Deputy Commissioner Md. Nurul Amin presided.

## 1,000 Sider orphans sheltered in Sharonkhola

Jagata Jubo Sangha (JJS), an NGO has opened three shelter homes for the ill-fated children who lost their parents after the devastating Sider that swept over Swarankhola upazila in Bagerhat on November 15.

The NGO has so far accommodated over 1,000 children in their shelter homes named Shishu Surakkha Kendra situated at Swarankhola and Rayenda.

Nazmul Huda, an official of the NGO and superintendent of Shishu Surakkha Kendra project said that only Sider affected children would be given shelter in the homes. Besides providing with food and medicine, the children will be given books, toys, ludo and chessboards for their recreation, he said. "We have opened the shelters to protect the orphan children from kidnapping, torture or harassment", Huda said. Three more shelter homes will be opened in the upazila as number of orphan children is increasing day by day, the NGO official added.

## Cancel voter list monitoring body in CHT

Somo Adhikar memo to CEC

Parbattya Chitragram Bangali Somo Adhikar Andolon yesterday demanded cancellation of the Committee for Voter List Monitoring and Management in Chittagong Hill Tracts (CHT).

Bandarban district unit of Somo Adhikar Andolon submitted a memorandum to the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) during his visit here.

The Election Commission (EC) formed three separate committees for Bandarban, Rangamati and Khagrachari hill districts for monitoring and management of the ongoing voter list preparation process.

The committee was formed under leadership of the chairman of the District Council while the immediate past chairman of the Council, representative of the concerned circle chief, headman, members of civil society and tribal leaders are in the committee.

Somo Adhikar Andolon claimed that although 50 percent Bangla speaking people live in the area, but no member from them was accommodated in the committee according to ratio in the monitoring committee.
