Meaningful polls not possible keeping AL, BNP leaders in jail

Govt to buy cereals at high price

The cabinet purchase committee yesterday approved purchase of 74,000 tonnes of rice and 33,000 tonnes of wheat at higher prices, reflecting the upward trend of their prices in the international market.

The government's purchase price of rice per kg will be Tk 26.77 to Tk 27.95 and wheat Tk 31.68 to Tk 31.88. The procurement will cost the government Tk 203 crore for

rice and Tk 101 crore for wheat.

The purchase committee also reviewed proposals for seven rental power projects with a total production capacity of 250 megawatt, and a rehabilitation project for two existing hydropower units of 100 MW capacity. All the project proposals were sent back to the power ministry for further work on those.

As per a proposal of the food ministry, the purchase committee at a meeting chaired by Finance

Adviser Mirza Azizul Islam approved the procurement. Rice and wheat will be procured through local tenders to be participated by importers.
