## RELIEF OPERATIONS IN SIDR-HIT AREAS

## TIB finds irregularities, mismanagement

Transparency International Bangladesh (TIB) in its observation report on the relief operations in the Sidr-affected areas brought allegations of irregularities, corruption, mismanagement and lack of coordination.

The TIB said it found that local body members embezzled relief materials, there were lack of proper assessment before disbursing relief, low if not zero distribution of

relief in remote or inaccessible areas, preference of a number of NGOs in operating among its own members, beneficiaries or coverage areas only.

It observed, "Relief being manipulated as vote banks by the local government representatives."

The TIB gave its observation through the report titled "Integrity in Humanitarian Assistance: Issues and Benchmarks" at a roundtable discussion at the BIAM auditorium in the city yesterday. It urged the

government to bring integrity in humanitarian assistance, saying that without transparency and accountability relief work would not be fully successful.

"Some affected families were over-supplied due to nepotism and lack of coordination and monitoring, while others received none," the TIB said.

It said a number of NGOs were disbursing loan in the name of relief while a few NGOs were




## HC bail to Sigma, Mir Helal stayed

UNB, Dhaka

The Supreme Court yesterday stayed bail granted by the High Court to Sigma Huda, wife of jailed former communications minister Nazmul Huda, and Barrister Mir Helal Uddin, son of jailed former state minister for civil aviation and tourism Mir Nasir.

Vacation Chamber Judge M Joynul Abedin, following separate government applications, passed the orders.

Sigma and Helal were tried and punished by special courts under the Emergency Power Rules (EPR). Responding to their petitions, a High Court bench granted them bail on December 13.

The government moved the applications, as it preferred leave to appeal against the High Court orders.

On August 27, the special court, trying the corruption suspects, sentenced Nazmul Huda to seven years rigorous imprisonment in a corruption case, while his wife to three years imprisonment for



PARIS EXHIBITION  
SC clears way  
for govt to send  
rest of artefacts

UNB, Dhaka

The Supreme Court yesterday stayed Thursday's High Court order of status quo and thereby cleared all the way for the government to send the rest of Bangladeshi artefacts to Paris exhibition.

Vacation-chamber Judge M Joynul Abedin, following an application moved by the government, passed the order lifting the legal roadblocks to display of the Bangladeshi archaeological masterpieces at the first major international exhibition at Guimet Museum in the French capital.

The artefacts from five Bangladeshi museums were scheduled to be on display at the exhibition under an agreement signed between the French ambassador in Bangladesh and the secretary of the cultural affairs ministry.

Some 188 items were selected from Dhaka National Museum and the museums of Paharpur, Mahasthangarh, Mainamati and Barendra for the show.

## Sharif out of elections

Pak EC rejects his appeal against rejection of nomination

Former prime minister Nawaz Sharif lost his appeal against the rejection of his nomination for next month's parliamentary elections, an official said yesterday, eliminating a key opposition leader from the crucial vote.

The Election Commission rejected Sharif's appeal Monday, commission spokesman Kanwar Dilshad said. Dilshad declined to give details, confirming only a report in the Urdu-language Jang daily Tuesday that Sharif was out of the elections.

Sharif, who has been campaigning for his Pakistan Muslim League-N party, has been demanding that President Pervez Musharraf restore Supreme Court judges he sacked during a 42-day state of emergency that he lifted

over the weekend.

Sharif's party initially called for a boycott of the vote but decided against it after failing to muster support from other opposition groups for a united action.

The party described the appeal's rejection as a politically motivated decision.

"This also shows that they are still afraid of his popularity and cannot face him," said party spokesman Ahsan Iqbal. "This is also shows that there is no level playing field in these elections."

Other candidates objected to Sharif's nomination, citing charges against him relating to the 1999 coup by Musharraf that ousted Sharif's government and his alleged involvement in a corruption case.

The chief election commis-

sioner also rejected a separate appeal by Sharif's brother, Shahbaz Sharif, against rejection of his nomination for the Jan. 8 balloting.

Since his ouster, Nawaz Sharif has lived in exile in Saudi Arabia and Britain. Like Benazir Bhutto, another two-time former prime minister, he has returned home to be involved in the elections.

Addressing thousands of supporters during an election campaign stop in Hyderabad on Monday, Benazir Bhutto sharply criticised Musharraf's rule as a "dark era of dictatorship." She warned that a rigged vote could push the country into "anarchy."

"If the militancy spreads and if, God forbid, the country disintegrates, it would become another Afghanistan," Benazir said.

Musharraf said curbing militancy was the chief reason he


