## Road accidents kill 10

Ten people were killed and 30 others injured in separate road accidents in Gazipur, Sathkhira, Bogra and Benapole yesterday.

A Correspondent from Gazipur reports: Four people were killed and 30 others injured in separate road accidents in the district yesterday.

A bus that was carrying the employees of Renaissance Garments, skidded off the Dhaka-Tangail highway while crossing the Koddha Bridge on the river Turag at around 8:00am, killing 3 people and injuring 30 others.

Two of the deceased were identified as Aminul Islam, 50, and Ripan Miah, 22. The identity of the other, a worker of the garment factory, could not be known immediately.

Among the injured, 26 were rushed to Gazipur Sadar Hospital. They are Rahima, 19, Nasim, 20; Poly, 18, Akther, 25, Zohra, 20; Sultana, 19, Shafiq, 28.

Kohinoor, 22, Khadiza, 20, Nasreen, 20, Rozi, 20, bus driver Montu, 45, Sathi, 18, Dulal, 18, Wasim, 24, Fahima, 19, Habib, 30, Alal, 38, Mahbub, 30, Sagar, 22, Mazhar, 35, Hasan, 18, Kalpana, 25, Jharna, 25, Ibrahim, 25, and Sakhina, 22.

Later, five of them were shifted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH).

Meanwhile, in another accident a pedestrian was crushed under the wheels of a speeding truck in nearby Naojore area at about 8:00am.

Our Correspondent in Benapole adds: A university student was killed in a road accident at Benapole yesterday morning.

Witnesses said the motorcycle Riaz Mahmud Shuvo, a student of Asian University, Dhaka, was riding on fell into a roadside ditch as he lost control at Talsari while returning home. He died on his way to the hospital.

The victims were identified as Sirajul Islam, 52, Abdul Jalil Dhal, 40, and Shaheen Islam, 18. Sirajul and Jalil died on the spot while seriously injured Shaheen succumbed to his injuries at Shyamnagar Upazila

Health Complex.

Our Staff Correspondent in Bogra adds: Two people were killed in a road accident when a Dhaka-bound bus knocked them down in the heavy fog at PTI School crossing in Bogra city yesterday.

Shahidul Islam, 50, of Thonthonia Mollapara died on the spot while Saiful Alam, 45, of Hindupara, succumbed to his injuries at Ziaur Rahman Medical College Hospital.

Results of non-govt teachers' registration exams published

The results of Non-government Teachers' Registration Examination-2007 were published yesterday with a pass rate of 18.78 percent.

A total of 1620 out of 85286 candidates came out successful in the examination. Among them, 9770 candidates passed in high school level for 52 subjects and 6250 in college level for 57 subjects.

"The high school level pass rate is 17.17 per cent and college level is 18.78," said Non-government Teachers' Registration and Certificate Authority (NTRCA) Chairman Kazi Akhtar Uddin Ahmed.

The school level examinations were held on September 21 and 22 while the college level examinations were on September 28 and 29.

"Candidates can see their results on the website www.modedu.gov.bd and www.ntrca.gov.bd," he added.

Ten personalities receive Rapport awards


Ten personalities were honoured with the 7th Rapport Award for Excellence in Human Resource Development-2007 at a function in the city on Tuesday, says a press release.


