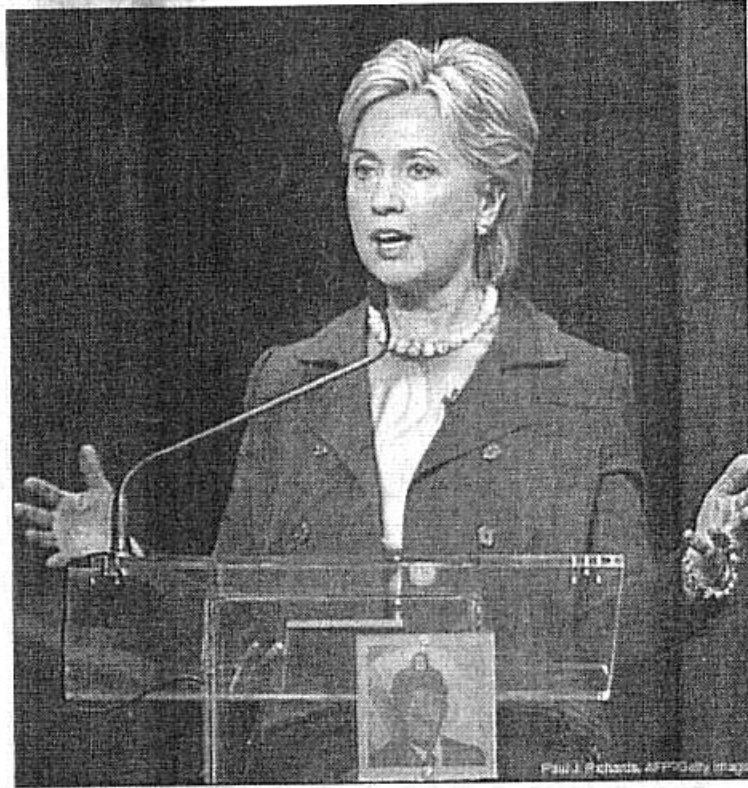

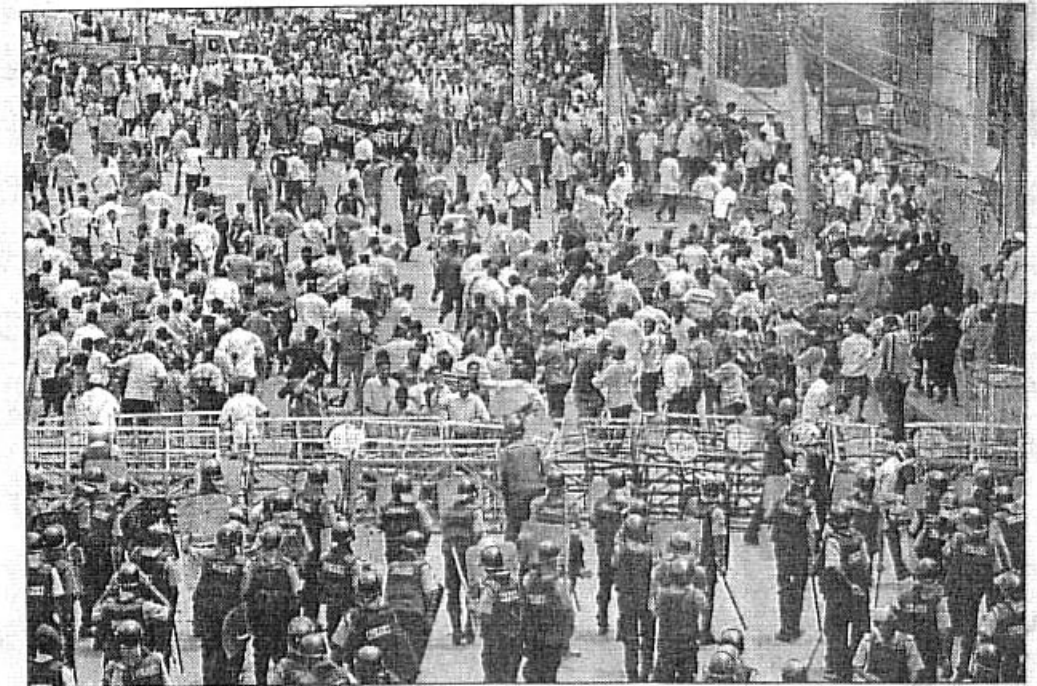

Registration of political parties

The present Election Commission has been making all out efforts to hold our stalled elections by December 2008 as per its declared roadmap.

But as the month of December 2008 is approaching, some people are becoming impatient and getting skeptical about the prospect of the scheduled election because of the following reasons:

1. Awami League leaders demand that their party President Sheikh Hasina has to be released from prison or they may not participate in the election.
2. BNP leaders demand

that their party Chairperson Begum Khaleda Zia has to be released from prison or they may not participate in the election.
