Kewell glad to be back

Harry Kewell is so glad just to be playing for Liverpool this season after four

years of injury agony the Australia midfielder insists he has yet to think about a new contract at Anfield when his current deal runs out at the end of the season.

Kewell has featured in 11 of Liverpool's last 14 matches, an indication of the faith manager Rafael Benitez, who frequently alters his line-up, has in the player and the former Leeds favourite will be keen for more first-team action when Wigan Athletic visit Anfield in

the Premier League on Wednesday. "The last four years have been hellish with one injury after another," Kewell, who has had repeated groin problems since moving to Merseyside, told

"But I can't even think about a new contract. That is what people have been talking about and saying about me, but I will tell the truth so the fans know the truth.

"And that is why I haven't honestly thought about it. I can't think about it at the moment ... I can look

Kewell added: "Given my Liverpool career, and the way it has gone, all I want to do is take

"I want to repay him for that, and the boys who have helped me through, for sticking with me and not giving up.

"You don't want to know what I have been through in four years, with injury after injury. The places I've been mentally during all those times, it has been pretty dark."

Frustration of a different kind has been a problem for Fabio Aurelio, still waiting for his first goal in a Liverpool shirt.

The 28-year-old Brazilian fullback has yet to score since arriving from Benitez's old club Valencia 18 months ago on a free transfer.

Aurelio was again out of luck in Javier Mascherano. front of goal during Sunday's goalless stalemate against Manchester City which cost Liverpool further ground in the race for the Premier League title.

And they could be 13 points off top spot come Wednesday's kickoff if Arsenal, who start 2008 as leaders, defeat West Ham on New Year's Day.

"I'm looking for my first goal and I hope it happens soon because I have been waiting for a long time," said Aurelio, who twice went close to breaking his scoring duck against City.

Liverpool have failed to find the net in three of their last five outings. But they have never been goal-shy against Wigan though, finding the net 11 times in their five previous Premier League meetings.

linked with a move away from Anfield during the January transfer window, memorably broke his duck for the club with two goals against Wigan two seasons ago.

Available again after serving a three-match suspension, the big England striker will surely come into contention as Benitez rotates his squad, with Dutch forward Dirk Kuyt one of the potential figures to be rested.

After utilising Alvaro Arbeloa at centre-back against City, Benitez will hope to have Sami Hyypia or Daniel Agger available, while Xabi Alonso is likely to start in place of

Wigan, who replaced manager Chris Hutchings with Steve Bruce in November, have it all to do if they are to avoid relegation. Last Saturday's 2-1 home defeat to Aston Villa left them anchored in the bottom three of the table, one point adrift of safety.

But Latics and England forward Emile Heskey is winning his race to be fit in time to face his former club.

Heskey, who scored 39 topflight goals at Liverpool between 2000-04, has missed the last three games with a sprained ankle, but manager Steve Bruce is confident he will be available for his side's first game of 2008.

"Emile was touch and go for the weekend," said Bruce. "It's vital we don't rush him too much, but I expect everyone to be fit for the Peter Crouch, who has been game."

Troubled Brazilian striker Adriano, who joined Sao Paulo on loan from Inter Milan earlier this month, was involved in a car crash in the early hours of Monday morning, Brazilian media reported.

The 25-year-old, already courting controversy after being photographed holding a beer can at a pop concert 10 days ago, escaped unscathed from the incident in Rio de Janeiro, where he is on holiday.

Adriano's car was in collision with three other vehicles but nobody was hurt or arrested, reports said. Police could not immediately be reached for comment.

Adriano, once one of Serie A's most feared strikers, moved to Sao Paulo after barely featuring for Inter in the last two seasons, which have seen him battling fitness and reported alcohol problems.

His international career has also taken a turn for the worse and he has played only once for Brazil since the 2006 World Cup.

On arriving at Sao Paulo, he promised to turn over a new leaf but only two days later was photographed at a pop concert in Rio with a beer can in his hand. He later complained that pho-

tographers were not respecting his privacy and promised he would be fit and ready for the new Brazilian season which starts in mid-January.

Allardyce defiant

Newcastle manager Sam Allardyce has insisted he will defy the pressure to stand down following a dismal run of results and growing calls for former striker Alan Shearer to take over. He was given on Monday a vote

of confidence by chairman Chris Mort, who scoffed at rumours that club owner Mike Ashley was considering sacking the 52-year-old.

"I do not have any worries or concerns as far as they (Mort and Ashley) are concerned," Allardyce "The pressure that has been put

on them as well as me, they understand it is outside influences trying to exert pressure on them. It is all part of the game." Asked if he felt Newcastle hero Shearer was casting a shadow over

him, he said: "It has always been there and it always will be. There is nothing more to say on the subject." Looking to the future, Allardyce revealed that he has already drawn

up a shopping list for the January transfer window. "I am putting players forward to the chairman and decisions will be

"The players that might be available and are available are being discussed on a regular basis, day to day.

I was never given an indication of a budget in the summer and it will be similar in this window."

Turning to possible departures from St James' Park, Allardyce added: "It would have to be a very lucrative offer for anyone to move away from the club."

One player consistently linked with a move away from Newcastle is England striker Michael Owen, who has now recovered from the thigh strain which sidelined him for six weeks.

- He could return from what is the latest in a catalogue of injury setbacks during Wednesday's Premier League home game with Manchester City, although Allardyce admits he is undecided.

"We have had games where we have created a large number of chances and you have to wonder, if Michael had been there, we might have converted a higher proportion of our chances," he said.

"His injury has been a massive disappointment. But he is now back and we can only hope that ager Alex Ferguson is believed to be with no internationals coming up, and his training and fitness work (being) in-house, we can get him fit and scoring goals again.'

Bayern Munich coach Ottmar Hitzfeld heightened speculation over his future on Monday when it was revealed he had met with Swiss Football Association (SFA) chiefs.

The 58-year-old, whose contract ends next June, has already been linked with taking over the Swiss national side after Euro 2008 - which Switzerland are co-hosting with Austria - and has voiced his displeasure at criticism levelled at him by Bayern president Karl-Heinz Rummenigge.

"We did meet, that is true, but we have known each other for 25 years," SFA official Ernst Lammli told German daily 'Bild'. "Ottmar wants to speak with the

Bayern directors first. We respect his decision, and I am sure he will keep us informed of what is going on," he added. Hitzfeld, who earlier this year


admitted the job would interest him, is in his second spell as Bayern coach having replaced Felix Magath in February after the latter was sacked following a series of bad However, while Hitzfeld - a two-

time Champions League winning coach with Borussia Dortmund and then Bayern Munich - has guided them to the top of the Bundesliga this term, it is only on goal difference over Werder Bremen as Munich have taken just 10 points from the last 21, scoring only four goals.

The coach - known as 'The Gentleman' - was incensed when Rummenigge came out with his comments following the poor run.

"When the club president publicly criticises his coach, the pleasure (of doing the job) is no longer the same. Especially when you've gone 24 matches unbeaten. At Bayern, things have got out of hand," remarked Hitzfeld earlier this month.
