Presiding over the ceremony CMCH Director Brig Gen Abedur Rahman said the unit would be upgraded into a 50-bed unit in the future and the construction of a separate block on the 5th floor of the hospital is underway to this end.

Chittagong Medical College Principal Prof Dr MA Wahab, Head of the CMCH surgery unit Dr Hasan Md Abdur Rauf and Project Director of 100-bed Burn Unit Project of Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) Dr Samanta Lal Sen were present as the guests of honour.

Talking to The Daily Star, Dr Sen said each medical college and hospital must have a burn unit as it is not possible for 100-bed burn unit at the DMCH to treat about 1.50 lakh patients a year.

Earlier, his body was taken to the Central Shaheed Minar at 11:00am to let people from all walks of life pay their last respects to Justice Sobhan.

Justice Sobhan, a frontline leader of the country's human rights movement, passed away due to a massive cardiac arrest on December 31 at the age of 82. His body was kept at the Birdem mortuary to enable his expatriate daughter to have the last glimpse of her father.


