And at the University Oval in Dunedin, another chapter in the short history of Bangladesh cricket is set to be played out when they take the field

to do battle for the 50th time today. From Day One, the Tigers have at times looked like fish out of water but have also managed to look the part in certain instances. Defeats have ranged from one wicket to thrashings by an innings and 310 runs but on this ocassion, the good and the gallant shall be remembered.

Left-arm seamer Mahmudul Hasan (previously known as Bikash Ranjan Das) who played the inaugural Test, which was his only appearance for Bangladesh, remembers Aminul Islam's spar-
