


Daughters of Asma Jehangir assaulted, threatened

Armed men of the Pakistan Muslim League Q (PML-Q) recently assaulted and kept confined two daughters of Asma Jehangir and their friends for several hours in Lahore.

Asma Jehangir is a well-known lawyer, human rights activist and the United Nations special rapporteur on the right to freedom of religion or belief.

According to a statement of the Asian Human Rights Commission, the two were beaten severely and threatened. The gunmen also made threats and used very filthy language towards Asma.



DU VIOLENCE CASE 4 witnesses say nothing against accused teachers, students

Four prosecution witnesses in one of the cases filed for breaching Emergency Power Rules (EPR) on the Dhaka University (DU) campus in August last year did not give any statement yesterday against the accused -- four teachers and 15 students of DU.

Two of the witnesses are Shah Alam and Jahangir Alam -- tea vendors in the TSC area of the university campus while the other two are Humayun Kabir Titu and Mohammad Asaduzzaman -- both cameramen of private TV channel Ekushey Television (ETV).

In their statements, the tea vendors told the court that they saw a large crowd of people and police in the TSC area. They however could not mention any date of the incident.

The two cameramen said they were on the DU campus on August 21 last year to cover processions and police action.

ACC probing allegations against 12 graft suspects

The Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) yesterday filed cases against former BNP lawmaker Barkat Ullah Bulu and Comilla municipality Chairman Monirul Haque Saku for amassing assets illegally and concealing wealth information from it.

ACC Assistant Director Manjur Alam filed the case against Bulu, also former adviser to commerce ministry, his wife Shamima Akhter and son Omar Sharif Mohammad Imran with the Ramna Police Help: 01713238381-5 Station. The Dally Star Aprendon cel Starage

He accused them of accumulat-

ing wealth worth Tk 4.89 crore beyond their known sources of income and keeping back from the ACC information about wealth worth Tk 3.37 crore. The charges were brought under

sections 26 (2) and 27 (1) of the ACC Act, sections 109 of the penal code and 15 (d) (5) of the emergency power rules. Shamima and Imran were accused of aiding and abetting the former BNP lawmaker.


