

FROM PAGE 16 The court of Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Golam Rabbani recorded Kabir's statement and set January 13 for the next hearing of the case.

During yesterday's hearing, the four accused teachers were permitted to sit down on a wooden bench in the dock of the courtroom.

The two DU students -- Dewan Safayet Ahmed and Ashraful Alam, witnesses of the case filed against four DU teachers and 15 students for violating the EPR in August last year, gave their judicial statements to him on September 5 last year when he was a magistrate, added

The four accused teachers, currently in jail custody, are Prof Sadrul Amin, president of Dhaka University Teachers' Association (Duta), Prof Anwar Hossain, general secretary of Duta, Prof Harunar-Rashid, dean of Science Faculty and Prof Neem Chandra Bhowmik, chairman of Applied Physics Department. One of the accused DU students, Moniruzzaman Sardar, was arrested earlier. He is currently in

jail custody as well. On August 22, a case was filed against some 5,000 unnamed students and teachers of DU and outsiders for violating the EPR, vandalising public and private properties, obstructing the police from discharging their duties, and assaulting law enforcers on the campus and its adjacent areas. However on September 9, the police pressed charges against four teachers and 15 students of DU for inciting violence on the campus and in the Shahbagh area on August 21 and 22.

Hearing of another case filed against the same accused is scheduled to be held today.


