RADITIONALLY, after the harvest season, the rural people of Bangladesh celebrate winter with mela (village fair), jatrapala, along with varieties of pitha (rice cakes). With an aim to go back to the roots, Bangladesh Poush Mela Udjapon Parishad arranged a Poush Mela yesterday at Ramna Botomul.

Early morning, the mist was still intense as the artistes of cultural organisation 'Udichi' opened the daylong event with a rendition of present. the song Poush elo, poush elo. Shankota dulchey, a solo rendition by Rupa Chowdhury followed. Rezina Wali Lina recited Jibanananda Das' poem Nadi.



# 10th Dhaka International Film Festival inaugurated

Tenth Dhaka International Film Festival began on January 10 at the Main Auditorium, National Museum. Over 100 full-length films, short films and documentaries from 40 countries are participating at the festival arranged by Rainbow Film Society in association with European Union, Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Royal Norwegian Embassy, SIGNIS, Religion Today Film Festival and GMG Airlines.

Entrepreneur Geeteara Safiya Chowdhury was the chief guest at the inaugural programme. Director of the Festival Committee, Ahmed Muztaba Zamal delivered the welcome speech. Ambassador of the European Commission, Dr 3 Stefan Frowein; Charge d'Affaires of Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Fritz Meijndert; Vice-chairman of the Festival Committee, Badal Rahman; Managing Director of Channel-i, Faridur Reza Shagor, General Manager (Sales and Marketing) of GMG Airlines, Quazi N Shahriar also spoke at the programme. President of Rain-

bow Film Society, Kishuar Kamal thanked everyone at the programme. The opening ceremony was presided over by the Chairman of the Festival Committee, Syed Margub Morshed.

The festival opened with the Dutch tragicomedy Duska (Russian for 'cherub') by renowned European director Jos Stelling. Stelling won the Dutch National Award in Art and has been nominated and awarded at most prestigious international film festivals: Cannes, Venice, Moscow and others. Duska will represent Netherlands at the Academy Awards in February this year in the Best Foreign Language Film category.

Duska features the story of a middle-aged film critic Bob (Gene Bervoets), who is in love with the pretty ticket seller at the local movie theatre (Sylvia Hoeks). She is involved in her own complicated relationships, but eventually their paths cross.

On the very day when the object of Bob's affection comes to his house the comedy takes a new turn upon the arrival of a Russian, named Duska (Sergei Makovetsky), whom Bob met at a film festival in the then USSR and gave his address in Netherlands to meet him. Duska's intentions to stay with Bob appears as annoying to the host.

Duska tries his very best to be nice, but Bob becomes increasingly irritated. The tension

between Bob and Duska eventually leads to a violent climax. But when Duska is gone, Bob deeply misses his true friend.

The titular character Duska only speaks Russian while the other major characters speak Dutch. Director Jos Stelling's handling of this exchange of languages is interesting. There are very few dialogues but a lot of action, which develop the storyline of Duska. Glances and music are more revealing than words.

However, it is not clear how exactly Duska made it to the Netherlands and where he disappears in the end.

The film is replete with symbolism and can be interpreted in several ways. The tea and coffee glasses in their plastic holders look melancholic. The surrounding streets are mostly dark.

Perhaps the film is a satire of the materialistic social structure where every individual is selfcentred and lonely and this condition prompts a kind of instinctual interdependence. It speaks of differences between two contrasting worlds (the Eastern and Western Europe), and an enigmatic conclusion suggests that neither is better than the other. Or may be the film is about friendship between the two worlds and a total rejection of established laws and institutions.



# Nazir Hossain's soft and soothing rural images

Self-effacing but confident and clever Nazir Hossain exhibits every week at the Friday Art College fair. That and his numerous exhibits in his home district gives him the courage to teach and work at a commercial outlet and have solo exhibits like the recent one at the Zoom Gallery, Alliance Française.

Using acrylic and watercolour, Hossain has worked on his sketches, which he makes on route to his office and home as well as to his hometown. He depends on his massive collection of sketches with pencil and pen which are remarkable on their own and were accessible at the gallery. In his 26 entries Hossain has done simple and pristine paintings based on the farmers and fishermen of the villages whom he has been studying since his childhood.

Hossain has based his line and colour composition on the Bangladeshi master painters like Zainul Abedin, SM Sultan, Quamrul Hassan, Qayyum Chowdhury, Safiuddin Ahmed and

Rafiqun Nabi. He also has western geniuses like Van Gogh and Cezanne in mind while going about his work of unbridled passion and enormous hope. The young artist bases his paintings, which he does by night, after his day job, in his

simple study at home. Despite his preoccupation in making a living by freelance paintings, his professional work has the finesse of a dogged and die-hard student of idyllic paintings of the rural areas. Hossain's choice of colours

brings in a good combination of bright hues like jade, ruby, topaz and beryl with contrasting black and white. The mingliffig and thixing of lines and colours are neat and subtle, and they speak of labour and endless hope. The subjects of the fishermen, farmers, their near and dear ones are combined with tigers and cobras that are taken from the traditional Pat Chitra style. Sometimes muted and

at others loud and buoyant, the lines and colours take one away to

the idyll of the riverine Bangladesh.

The fresh breeze, the birds and the bees, the cows, goats and endless "barret clouds" speak of repose and tranquillity. Hossain, in his early twenties, does not claim to have a very original style and gives credit to the masters he has studied for years.

It is not only the leading painters of Bangladesh and India, or even the superb artistes of the west, the art criticisms and reviews in the local dailies and weeklies are also "grist that come to the mill" for him.

The exhibition was extended and ended recently.
