A Dhaka court yesterday framed charges against Khondaker Akhter Hamid Paban, son of BNP leader Khondaker Delwar Hossain, and four others in connection with a carjacking case.

The accused pleaded not guilty after Additional Chief Metropolitan Magistrate Golam Rabbani read out the charges to

The court also fixed March 5 for trial of the case and summoned complainant and other witnesses to appear before the court for giving their statements.

Four other accused are Robin, Masum, Halim and Jahangir Alam. Of them, Jahangir has been absconding since the case was filed against him while three others are now on bail.

Paban and three others carjacked a Toyota Premio from its owner at gunpoint from the city's Motijheel area on October 13, 2005.

The Detective Branch of Police arrested Paban with the stolen vehicle from Bailey Road area on June 7, 2006.

Sub-Inspector of Detective Branch of Police Syed Selim Masud, also the investigation officer (IO) of the case, pressed charges against them on December 28 the same

Says newly appointed French envoy

UNB, Dhaka

President Iajuddin Ahmed has said Bangladesh strongly believes that her relations with France is too strong to be adversely affected by unpleasant developments.

"Exhibition of Bangladeshi archaeological items at the Guimet Museum in Paris could not be held as planned because of the incidence of theft and subsequent developments," he said when newly appointed French Ambassador to Bangladesh Charley Causeret presented his credentials at Bangabhaban yesterday.

Describing the theft of statue as incidental, the French envoy said the issue would not affect the present ties between the two countries.

The president also urged French investors to invest more in Bangladesh availing themselves of existing incentives.

"French investors can avail themselves of the benefits of generous tax and other incentives offered by the Bangladesh government, particularly in the Export Processing Zone," he said.

Referring to the recent upward trend in French investment in Bangladesh, Iajuddin expressed his satisfaction at the fast expanding trade relations between the two countries.


