Call for comprehensive policy for adolescents

Disadvantaged Adolescents Working NGOs (DAWN) Forum organised the two-day convention at the Shishu Academy auditorium yesterday with the slogan 'Safe adolescence enlightened future'.

The objectives of the convention are to create a scope for the adolescents to share their views and build a common platform to realise their demands for safe adolescence.

Speaking as the chief guest, Advocate Sultana Kamal, executive director of Ain O Shalish chance of them being spoiled Kendra (ASK), said the children

should be especially taken care of during this period.

Tk 2.6 cr foreign currencies seized, three air passengers held

Customs and intelligence officials seized foreign currencies worth Tk 2.6 crore from three outgoing passengers at Zia International Airport (ZIA) in the city on Monday

The three -- Md Selim, Yunus Ali and Md Rajan -- were also arrested as they were carrying 14,81,000 Saudi rials, 23,500 UAE dirhams and 500 Qatar rials. They were scheduled to fly to Singapore.

Customs officials filed three cases with the Airport Police Station and handed them over to the police.

Acting on a tip-off, a team of customs and intelligence officials and task force members kept a sharp eye on passengers of a Singapore-bound flight scheduled to take off at 10:00pm.

But even the scanning machine failed to detect the currencies kept in the luggage of three arrestees.

"As we had specific information, we searched their luggage and found foreign currencies kept in jars of chutney, talcum powder and tooth power," Humayun Kabir, additional commissioner of Customs, ZIA, told The Daily Star.

The three, however, claimed that they did not know about the existence of the currencies. Somebody might have kept them in their bags, they added. Customs officials said the three

JU BCL leader beaten up by JCD cadres

A leader of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) was beaten up by the cadres of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) on the campus of Jahangirnagar University (JU) on Monday night.

BCL Joint Secretary Zahid Parvez Khan Pulok was injured when a group of JCD cadres swooped on him at around 10:00pm near Meer Musharraf Hossain (MMH) Hall.

The JCD cadres led by Shuvo and Zakir, residents of MMH hall, attacked Pulok with iron rod and lethal weapons when he was returning from Dhaka in a univer-

Pulok is undergoing treatment at Enam Medical College and Hospital (EMCH) with his legs and left-wrist fractured.

Earlier, BCL President Sohel Parvez and General Secretary Mahmud Naser Jony were injured by JCD attacks and are undergoing treatment at EMCH.

Although a large number of police have been deployed, law and order situation continues to deteri orate since the clash between JCD and BCL cadres ensued on last Wednesday night over establishing supremacy on the campus.

The chief justice said he had already asked the authorities concerned to ensure security of the judges and magistrates.

Speaking as a special guest, Law adviser AF Hassan Ariff called on the judges to dispose of cases without delay.

He also said that he would try to address the problems facing the

judges and magistrates.

Supreme Court Registrar Iftedar Ahmed suggested increasing the salaries of judges and magistrates who have to face many difficulties while performing their duties. Otherwise, it would be difficult for them to remain honest, he added.


