Plant Chief Engineer Md Abdul Malek said after resuming operation at 2:20pm, the two units were jointly generating at least 220MW electricity, feeding to the national grid from 3:30pm.

The two units, however, could not resume operation with the plant's own reserve of coal.

When contacted, plant Chief Engineer Malek admitted that there is not any reserve coal at present to operate the two units and that outsourcing is time consuming.

The plant started power generation with 40,000 tonnes of coal stockpiled at the BCMCL coal- million of fuel cost for 30 years.


