Nine people were killed and 82 others injured in separate road accidents in Bogra, Bagerhat, Satkhira and Sirajganj yesterday

Bogra reports: Three people were killed and 30 others injured when a Dhaka-bound passenger bus and a fertiliser-laden truck collided head-on at Mokamtala in Shibganj in the early hours of yesterday.

Two of the deceased were identified as Zarina Begum, 50, and Yusuf Ali, 45, while the identity of ditch. another could not be known imme-

Ten of the injured were rushed to Shaheed Ziaur Rahman Medical College Hospital in a critical condi-

In another incident, Afsar Ali, 45, a rickshawpuller, was injured when a truck rammed into his rickshaw.






