

# 900 children die of malnutrition a day: Expert

BSS, Dhaka

Around 900 children die of malnutrition in Bangladesh everyday mainly due to a poor dietary intake in the earliest months of their life, said eminent child specialist Prof Dr M Qudrat-e-Khuda Talukder at a seminar in the city yesterday.

He also said that the consequences of insufficient nourishment continue into adulthood and are passed on to the next generations giving rise to a wide array of effects including Intrauterine Growth Restriction (IUGR)

Dr Talukder made the disclosure at the seminar on 'The Lancet's Series on Maternal and Child Undernutrition' organised by the International Centre for Diarrhoeal Diseases Research, Bangladesh (ICDDR'B) at its Sasakawa audito-
