

2 killed in Sylhet clashes over land

Two persons were killed and 20 others injured in separate clashes over land disputes in Fenchuganj upazila of Sylhet and in Jagannathpur upazila of Sunamganj district yesterday.

One of the injured persons--Mokoddos Miah--was admitted to Sylhet MAG Osmani Medical College Hospital.

Police arrested three persons after the clash in Jagonnathpur. Ripon Miah, 25, died on the spot in the clash centring construction of a structure on a disputed land at Ikorchhoi in Jagonnathpur municipal area. Fifteen others belonging to both

After getting bail, the accused in the case started fresh conspiracy to influence the trial process and threatening other teachers and main witnesses of the case, they speakers said, adding that the teachers, students and staff of the department should

remain alert as the alleged killers tried to return to the depart-
