Two Picasso paintings stolen in Switzerland

Two paintings by Pablo Picasso worth nearly five million Swiss francs (4.5 million dollars) have been stolen from a museum in eastern Switzerland, police sources said yesterday.

The two oil paintings, "Tete de Cheval" from 1962 and "Verre et pichet" from 1944, were stolen on Wednesday evening from a cultural centre in the eastern town of Pfäfers.

Police said the circumstances surrounding the theft were still unclear, but that the thieves managed to leave the building around 7:00 pm local time (1800 GMT).

The security alarm was set off as they left the museum, and guards noticed shortly afterwards that the paintings were missing.

Bangladesh will soon return to democracy

Hopes Indian envoy

Indian High Commissioner Pinak Ranjan Chakravarty yesterday hoped that the caretaker government would hand over power to an elected government after holding the national election by December according to the declared electoral roadmap.

"The Indian government strongly believes Bangladesh will soon return to the path of democracy and an elected government will take over," he said while exchanging views with reporters after inaugurating a two-week exhibition on contemporary fine arts at the Indian Assistant High Commission's Gallery at Khulshi in Chittagong.

Asked about the protection of human rights of detained political leaders during the trial process, the Indian envoy said the caretaker government should be respectful to human rights as per the constitution.

Addressing the inaugural function of the exhibition, Pinak said Bangladesh and India have long cultural and friendly relations, as the peoples of both the countries have a similar cultural heritage.

He said the two countries signed an agreement on cultural exchange and the Indian government has been awarding scholarships to Bangladeshi students in the fields of music, dance and fine arts.

Later, the Indian high commissioner handed some musical instruments to the local Music School and Music Bhaban.

Man slaughtered in Narsingdi

A man was slaughtered by miscreants at Char Alinagar village in Palash upazila on Thursday night.

Local people said the assailants stormed into the house of M Delwar Hossain, 38, at dead of night and slaughtered him with a sharp weapon.

Receiving information, the police rushed to the spot yesterday morning and sent the body to Sadar Hospital for autopsy.

The police suspect that Delwar was killed over previous enmity.

Madrasa student stabbed to death by brother-in-law

A madrasa student was stabbed to death by his brother-in-law at Douriumakuri village in Chitalmari yesterday.

Babul Paik alias Babu, 20, a student of a Qaumi madrasa in Jessore, was stabbed by his sister's husband Al Amin in the morning.

Police said Babu came under attack when he tried to prevent Al Amin from beating his sister Dulia over dowry.

Local people said Al Amin along with his wife Dulia came to Douriumakuri from Proipur to realise dowry money from his father-in-law. Failing to collect the money, Al Amin started beating his wife.

When Babu came to the rescue of his sister, Al Amin hit him with a dao (curved kitchen knife).

In a critical condition, Babu was rushed to the Upazila Health Complex where he died at around 11:00am.

G7 to consider climate change fund: Japan

Japan, Britain and the United States will propose a special fund to promote clean technologies as part of efforts to combat climate change, a Japanese official said on Thursday.

The proposal will be put forward at a meeting of top finance officials from the Group of Seven industrialised nations in Tokyo today.

"Japan, Britain and the United States are currently examining a plan to establish a multilateral clean technology fund in cooperation with the World Bank," a finance ministry official told reporters.

"The three countries will explain the content of their current discussions on the fund, and we'll see how the rest of the Group of Seven members react to it," the

official said on customary condition of anonymity.

It was unclear whether the plans would be included in the official statement by the G7, which also includes Canada, France, Germany and Italy.

If the idea gains traction, existing organisations such as the World Bank and the International Monetary Fund are expected to be involved.
