

Sir Alex Ferguson has blasted the decision to schedule Sunday's (AEDT) Manchester derby in the week of the 50th anniversary of the Munich air disaster.

The Red Devils have been honouring the eight players who died alongside 15 other passengers - including former Manchester City goalkeeper Frank Swift - all week, with the clash at Old Trafford today set to cap off the memorials.

There will be a minute's silence which City officials including manager Sven-Goran Eriksson have appealed for visiting fans to respect - and both teams will play in traditional, unsponsored jerseys to honour the occasion.

#### Africa bans five nations

Clubs from five countries -- the Central African Republic, Chad, Kenya, Rwanda and Sierra Leone -have been excluded from African continental club competition this year, the Confederation of African Football (CAF) said on Sunday.

The five countries were disqualified from competing in this year's African Champions League and the African Confederation Cup after "failing to fulfill their financial obligations to the Confederation," a CAF statement said.

The decision was made by CAF's executive committee, whose membership includes Chad and

The decision means clubs like Zamalek of Egypt and TP Mazembe Englebert from the Democratic Republic of Congo have walkovers to the second round of the Champions League.

First round, first leg matches in both the Champions League and Confederation Cup are scheduled for Feb. 15-17.
