"Her eye treatment is possible in Dhaka but ear treatment is only possible in the USA where she was treated earlier," Acting Party President Zillur Rahman told reporters after presiding over an | illegal breakaway. unscheduled meeting of the presidium at his Gulshan residence.

Kosovo inches closer to independence declaration

Kosovo inched closer to a widely expected declaration of independence on Sunday, amid rising political tension and Serbia's determination to resist what it considers an

Kosovo Prime Minister Hashim Thaci refused Friday to say exactly when independence would come, but both Belgrade and the international community visibly stepped up their preparations.

Boris Tadic vowed to do everything

to keep Kosovo within Serbia, as he was sworn in for a second term in office Friday.

In Kosovo's capital Pristina, freshly printed posters appeared on the streets appealing for calm during celebrations -- including street parties -- that will herald independence in the mostly ethnic Albanian province.

Dr Yunus takes microfinance model to US

Grameen Bank, founded by Bangladeshi Nobel Prize winner Dr Muhammad Yunus, is taking its pioneering microfinance model to the United States, the Financial Times reported Saturday.

The move, which will open doors for some of the 28 million people in the US who do not have bank accounts, comes with the banking sector there being battered by the crisis over subprime loans.

Grameen Bank made its name by lending money to poor women who are trying to start small businesses but cannot borrow from banks because they do not have a good enough credit rating or bank

HASINA CASE

Govt to apply today for permission to appeal against verdict

UNB, Dhaka

The government is likely to file application today seeking permission to appeal against the High Court judgment that declared illegal bringing the Tk 2.99 crore extortion case against detained former prime minister Sheikh Hasina under the Emergency Powers Rules (EPR) and also scrapped the case.

On February 12, the full bench of the Appellate Division held up a government petition that sought stay on operation of the High Court judgment and asked it to file regular leave to appeal by February 19.

A government attorney, requesting not to be named, told the news agency yesterday that case. they had already collected the certified copy of the High Court judgment.

Before the delivery of the High Court verdict, the trial court had recorded depositions made by the

complainant of the case, businessman Azam J Chowdhury. The formal trial began on January 30.

However, the Awami League president will not be released from jail since she has been shown arrested in a similar extortion case relating to Khulna barge-mounted power-plant deal.

On June 13 last year, Azam J Chowdhury, managing director of East Coast Trading Pvt Ltd., a private power company, filed the Tk 2.99 crore extortion case against Hasina. She was arrested on July 16 in connection with the case

Her younger sister Sheikh Rehana and cousin detained former minister Sheikh Fazlul Karim Selim are also made accused in the


