'Increase taxes on tobacco products'

Bangladesh Anti-Tobacco Alliance (BATA) yesterday urged the government to increase taxes on the tobacco products in the coming budget to check the massive use of tobacco in the country.

"Taxes on all tobacco products including dried tobacco leaves, 'gul' and 'zarda' have to be increased for effectively controlling the use of tobacco," said Consumer's

Association of Bangladesh (CAB) General Secretary Kazi Faruk at a press conference at Jatiya Press Club.

He said an increase in prices of tobacco products will have the greatest effect on the important target groups like poor and youths.

"Some 10 percent increase in price reduces consumption by four percent in developed countries and eight percentin a country like Bangladesh."

Referring to a survey by 'Work for a Better Bangladesh (WBB)' and 'Mental and Health Bridge', Kazi Faruq said. Most of the people in the country supported the increase of taxes and prices on tobacco and tobacco products.

"Some 73.2 percent respondents opined in favour of increasing taxes on tobacco while some 60.1 percent agreed to cut down on the use of tobacco with high price of tobacco products.

The survey was conducted on some 1,015 people, including government officials, farmers and university students.

The organisers quoting a paper of the Health and Family Welfare Ministry and the World Health Organisation (WHO) said some 36.8 percent people over 15 years in Bangladesh use tobacco in one form

BATA Coordinator Saifuddin Ahmed, MANABIK President Rafiqul Islam Milon and Dhaka Ahsania Mission Programme Officer Iqbal Masud also spoke.

2 female students injured in CU dormitory fire

Three killed in road crashes

At least three people were killed and 12 others injured in separate road accidents in Rajshahi and Sirajganj yesterday.

RU correspondent reports: A minor boy and a woman were killed in two separate road accidents in the district yesterday.

Sources said the boy identified as Ruhan, 7, son of Abdus Salam of Mirganj village, was knocked down by a speeding van loaded with Unilever goods on Bhaga-Rajshahi highway.

The accident occurred when Ruhan was crossing the road for going to his school at Mirganj Bhanuca area.

He died on the spot.

Ruhan was a class two student of Bhanuca primary school.

Bhaga police seized the van and its driver Reza.

The woman, identified as Rahima Khatun, wife of Hamidul Islam of Kandra village, was killed in a road accident on Puthia-Rajshahi highway.

Sources said the accident occurred when a goods-loaded van coming from Jalmolia hit her while she was crossing the road.

She died on the spot. Puthia Police rushed to the spot and seized the van.

They recovered the body and sent it to Rajshahi Medical College and Hospital for autopsy.

An unnatural death (UD) case was filed with Puthia Police Station in this connection.

Our correspondent from | Saidul Islam, 32, in the dock. They Sirajganj adds: An unidentified man aged about 32 was killed and 12 others were injured, two of them critically, in a road accident in the district yesterday.

The injured were admitted to Sirajganj Sadar hospital and other clinics in the town.

Police and witnesses said the accident took place at around 10:30am when a Bonpara-bound bus from Sirajganj town hit a standing pick-up van on Hatikumrul-Bonpara highway at Vengri from behind killing the man on the spot and injuring 12 others.

Identity of the deceased could not be known immediately.

Police rushed to the spot and rescued the injured.

They sent the body to Sirajganj sadar hospital morgue for autopsy. A case was lodged with Hatikumrul Highway Police

Station in this connection.
